**Century High School** opened its doors in the fall of 1975. Our country's bicentennial set the patriotic theme for CHS with school colors of red, white, and blue and the nickname of Patriots. In 1992-93 CHS was designated a Blue Ribbon School by the U.S. Department of Education. It is fully accredited by the North Central Association of Colleges and Schools. CHS is one of three comprehensive public high schools in Bismarck, the capital of North Dakota. The 2023-2024 total enrollment is 1,412 in grades 9-12 with a 338-member senior class. Of the 102 faculty members, 60% hold advanced degrees.
