Principal:

\$150 for library lost books – Danielle made a motion and Alissa 2nd, motion approved. Mr. Jeske follow up on playground equipment. Bidding procedure changed, to under \$50,000, don't need a RFP. Can purchase what you want, however the law may show total cost prior to discount. We don't have to pay for all up front. There isn't time for our school this year, next option would be next Spring. Would like student council to help and write up some letters to local banks. Deb will send updates as they are received from facilities. There will be another portable, adjacent to the portable. Will lose 1 basketball hoop, then have 3rd section for 2nd grade. Potentially title teachers i.e. Wilkens and Reisenauer, however consider lost time for travel to services, may push services to the classroom. Teachers may need to give some space for teachers supplies. Working on class lists, some students are sorted out. 33 Kindergarten registrants had 25-26 families at open house. Teachers get kindergartner book camp, then give them their teacher, a little bit of time to prepare in the event a 3rd class is needed. Title review, next Wednesday at staff meeting at 3:10 will share how they did, in addition to electronic. If compared to the district, our highlight is k, 1, and 2, over 91% are on grade level for Math by district standards. Kudos to the teachers, aides, planning committee. 3rd, 4th and 5th – goal is 80%. Next year boy's engagement regarding reading and writing. Teachers will do a study over the summer boys in crisis. For reading, 1st grade at 69%, others were 75% or better. Mr. Jeske is very pleased. Another school wide goal is to get parents in more, smaller pockets, to get a little more involvement on how they can support us. Parents will give some things before head out for the year and summer reminders. Planning for next year, almost complete, due 6/1. Training 8/20, any hired staff i.e. cook, custodian, they will half a day seminar on trauma sensitive schools. Counts for 8 hours for mental health wellness, they will provide additional information to parents on what they learn. Mrs. Skoglund will be a full-time counselor at Grimsrud. Pioneer has hired Dave Fey, approved 100% contract. All staff same, except a new teacher. Add mentoring program with a full-time counselor. Free yearbook, Deb made, may need to organize in the future, teachers may assist in the future.
