
**SUPERINTENDENT CERTIFICATION**

**Summary Statement by Administration**

Monitoring of operational expectations policies is part of the ongoing process of district performance evaluation and superintendent evaluation. **Data Analysis by Administration**

This section provides readers a summary of the data they are about to review.

Summary analysis of this report indicates absence of noncompliance in relation to all Operational Expectations and Results. In addition, Bismarck Public Schools completed the 2019-2020 school year without violations that resulted in legal action. District stakeholder satisfaction survey showed BPS continues to exceed expectation. Surveys in 2019-2020 indicated 90% satisfaction, while 2020-2021 resulted in 83% satisfaction. This slight drop in stakeholder satisfaction may have resulted from substantial changes in service delivery due to the COVID-19 pandemic, however, the 83% surpasses expectation by 13%.

### OE-1 Global Operational Expectation

**The Superintendent shall not cause, allow, or fail to take reasonable measures to prevent any practice, activity, decision or organizational condition that is unlawful, unethical, unsafe, disrespectful, or imprudent, in violation of Board policy or endangers the district's public image or credibility.**

#### Superintendent Interpretation:

- This OE essentially holds the Superintendent accountable for following Board policy, state, and Federal law. This OE is broad in its scope and generally holds the Superintendent responsible for ensuring that the District operates in a legal, safe, and ethical manner.
  - o **Unlawful** shall mean in violation of federal, state, and local laws, and violation of the rules outlined in North Dakota Century Code.
  - o **Fail to take reasonable measures to prevent** means that the Superintendent will take preventative action to protect the organization from negative consequences that can reasonably be foreseen.
  - o **Organizational condition** to mean situations created by the actions or decisions of the Superintendent, or staff, whether they are actively or passively being created.
  - o **Unethical** shall mean behavior that is improper or does not conform to accepted professional standards of conduct.
  - o **Unsafe** shall mean in a manner that is likely to physically injure students, employees, or visitors to the District.
  - o **Disrespectful** shall mean in a manner that is mean-spirited, rude, or not reasonably considering the situation or feelings of the person to whom one is speaking.
  - o **Imprudent** shall mean reckless or irresponsible actions.
- This OE requires the Superintendent to take “**reasonable measures**,” which shall mean that the Superintendent shall take steps to follow Board policy or protect the District’s public image in a manner similar to what other superintendents or leaders of organizations might take under similar circumstances.
- This OE requires the Superintendent to protect the legal position of the District as well as the ethical standing of the District. The Superintendent is charged with protecting the “**district condition**,” which shall mean the legal standing of the District and the perception that stakeholders have of the District with regard to trust and respect.
- This OE requires the Superintendent to establish and maintain a respected and positive “**public image**,” which shall mean the positive perception held by the overwhelming majority of the residents in the District and the people in the Bismarck area.

<b>Indicator 1:</b> The Board, upon evaluation of the OE policies, finds no significant violation of or not in compliance with any of the policies.	<b>In Compliance</b>
<b>Evidence:</b> The superintendent certification category “Not In Compliance” was indicated zero times in the OE monitoring reports presented from August 2020 – June 2021. The school board did not find the district to be noncompliant in the monitoring reports presented from August 2020 – June 2021.	
<b>Indicator 2:</b> The District is not found to be in violation of any law when any legal action is taken against the District.	<b>In Compliance</b>
<b>Evidence:</b> In the 2020-2021 school year, the district was not found to be in violation of any law that resulted in legal court action taken against the district. During the 2020-2021 school year, the district engaged in zero incidents that necessitated attorney representation in court for legal defense.	
<b>Indicator 3:</b> In a random survey sample of District stakeholders, administered before June 1, 2021, at least 70% of the respondents express support for the direction of the District.	<b>In Compliance</b>
<b>Evidence:</b> The 2020/2021 survey indicated 83% of respondents strongly agreed, agreed, or somewhat agreed with the current direction of the district.
