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SCHOOLWIDE COMPONENTS

A Comprehensive Needs Assessment of the entire school is conducted annually to identify and set schoolwide goals. This assessment is based on information that includes the performance of children in relation to the state academic content and achievement standards.

Schoolwide Reform Strategies provide opportunities for all children (including subgroups of students) to address school needs, use methods and instructional strategies that strengthen the academic program, increase amount and quality of learning time, and provide enriched and accelerated curriculum, addressing the needs of all children in the school, particularly the needs of those at risk of not meeting the challenging state academic standards.

Program Coordination of federal, state, and local services and programs, along with schools implementing improvement activities for comprehensive and targeted support is an required component of a schoolwide Title 1 program.

SCHOOLWIDE TITLE 1

Northridge Elementary is a Schoolwide Title 1 School.

What does this mean?

Schoolwide programs are designed to generate high levels of academic achievement for all students, especially those most in need of additional support. All staff, resources, and classes are part of the school-wide program, and it serves all the children in a school.

How does a school qualify?

Qualifications for school-wide programming is based on the overall percentage of free & reduced lunch. Families, who meet eligibility requirements, may apply online at bismarckschools.org.
