**2024-2025 Course Registration** - Registration for the next school year is underway. Teachers have inputted course recommendations and, on February 7th, students received information about how to choose courses during advisory. Students must log into Powerschool and [choose courses by February 23rd](#). After that time, students will have individual meetings with their school counselor to discuss their choices. **EKG Screening** - In A Heartbeat Cardiac Screening Program is designed to help prevent death from sudden cardiac arrest by helping detect potential heart disease in children, teens, & young adults. **Cell Phone Policy Reminders** - Thank you for continued support of our schoolwide cell phone policy. The feedback from parents, students, and staff has been overwhelmingly positive. As a reminder, the policy requires students to keep cell phones silenced and stored out of sight during class time. While we understand that there may be instances in which families need to reach their student during the day, please note that your student may not be able to respond immediately. In the event that you need to contact your student immediately during the school day, please call the main office 203-263-2186 and the secretarial staff can reach your child in class.

**Attendance** - Attendance is an essential component of the educational environment. It is also used to determine eligibility for events such as prom, field trips, and other extracurricular activities. In order to be eligible for an event such as prom, students must arrive on time and attend all classes on that day. Students who are suspended from school on the day of the event will not be permitted to attend. Administration also reserves the right to deny entry to any student who has accumulated excessive unexcused absences to be considered truant by the date of the event. **SAT Preparation** - All juniors will take the SAT on **Wednesday, March 27th**. While your child's teachers embed SAT preparation into their instruction, we also encourage all juniors to also take time outside of the school day to familiarize themselves with SAT-style questions and content. **NWEA Midyear Testing** - The NWEA midyear administration is underway! The purpose of this test is to measure your child's knowledge in a specific subject area. The tests are adaptive and tailored to your child's current achievement level. The format of these tests are very similar to PSAT and SAT tests. Please support us by encouraging your child to try their best so that teachers can design specific lessons to improve their understanding of the material. **Additionally, please make sure that your child brings their district-issued, fully-charged chromebook on testing days:**

**Attention Senior Parents! Community Service Graduation Requirement** - 18 hours of community service are required for graduation. Students submit a log of their service hours via the Class of 2024 grade level Classroom. The log is found under the Classwork tab.
