

Interactive Assessments: Multiple Answer Questions

Multiple answers now allow for clickable inline answers. When an answer is placed within a sentence, a dotted-line box will appear. Students would then select the answers they feel are correct. Answers can be image or text based.

An example of this would be asking students to choose the transitive verbs in the following sentences.

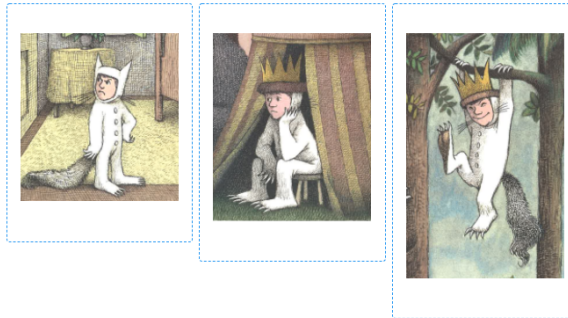
Teachers can also list answers horizontally after the question.

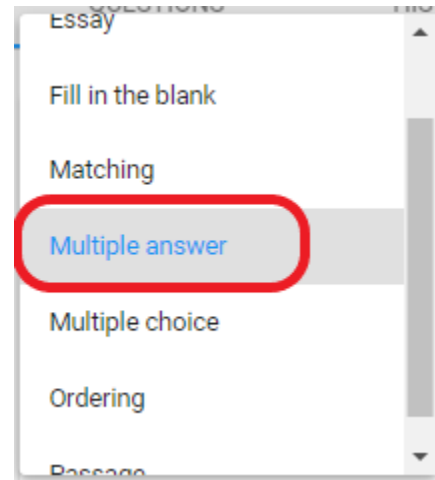

How to create a drag and drop


- A. **Choose assessment or practice questions** activity from the list of activities in your Buzz editor.
- B. In the **questions tab**, click the **+ symbol** to the left of the screen and from the drop down menu choose **Ordering**.
