The Kansas Seal of Biliteracy Certificate is awarded by the Kansas State Department of Education (KSDE) and the local school district to recognize all students who have attained proficiency in English and one or more other world languages by the time they graduate. <p>AVID (Advancement Via Individual Determination)</p>	<p>Executive Director of Curriculum Christy O’Toole and AVID Program Director Michelle Drumright provided an update on the AVID (Advancement Via Individual Determination) program. AVID is a Pre-K through postsecondary college readiness system designed to increase the number of students enrolling and succeed in higher education and beyond high school. AVID is in approximately 7,000 schools impacting more than 2 million students in grades PreK-12 nationwide. For almost 40 years, AVID has provided educators a proven solution for systematically increasing academic rigor and creating engaging learning environments, accelerating the performance of historically underserved students, and delivering results. Despite the societal and socioeconomic challenges many AVID students face, they have outperformed national averages in key college and career success measures, including graduation rates, meeting college entrance requirements and completing college.</p> <p>The AVID College Readiness System is distinguished from other educational programs by its continuous success rate. AVID graduates “stick with it,” applying the learning, study, and academic behavioral skills gained through AVID to succeed in rigorous college coursework, with 85% persisting in college. Additional outcomes of the AVID College Readiness System include: consistent school and district-wide expectations; increased and improved communication with families; articulated and collaborative alignment across grade levels and feeder patterns; common vision and goals concerning college and career readiness expectations; increased trust among students and staff, and increased access and opportunity for students.</p> <p>In 2001, Wichita North High School was our first school to implement AVID in Kansas. Twenty years later, Wichita Public Schools has established AVID as a pillar in its framework of success for all students. AVID is currently in 44 schools with 120 AVID Elective classes; is implemented in 22 secondary, two K-8, and 20 elementary schools; and helps students receive more than five million scholarship dollars annually. AVID has become a force in the Wichita community, with over 50 current teachers having been AVID students or tutors.</p> <p>The complete presentation is included in the archival copies of this BOE Agenda and Minutes. <p>Programs/Grants Consent: Newcomer Curriculum for Middle School and High School</p>	<p>At Board Member Ron Rosales’ request, Dr. Thompson and Shannon Benoit provided details on <i>World English</i>, 3rd Edition, ©2020, which is designed to give English Learners language development experiences to help develop student confidence in English communication skills through the content and ideas of National Geographic and TED Talks visual and listening. Selections are intentionally geared to the interests of secondary English Learners, and units incorporate sequential instruction and practice in all domains of language (listening, speaking, reading, and writing) as well as systematic grammar, vocabulary, and pronunciation lessons. <i>World English</i> will be used to supplement our existing Hampton-Brown <i>Inside, Edge, and Inside Phonics</i> curriculum materials, specifically to provide more experience and instruction with non-fiction text and updated content, additional opportunities for listening and speaking practice.
