<p>First Review: Updating of Board of Education Member Boundaries</p> <p>Appendix 1</p>	<p>Wendy Johnson, Director of Strategic Communications, and Fabián Armendáriz, Director of Operations, briefed the Board on decennial redistricting. The Board of Education is revising the Board member districts to reflect changes in population based on the 2020 U.S. Census. The Board revises its districts every ten years in accordance with Kansas statutory requirements.</p> <p>On May 2, 2022, the Board requested staff to provide boundary maps. These maps were generated by Sedgwick County Geographic Information Services (GIS). Considerations for these maps were to meet the population requirement and place at least one comprehensive high school in each BOE member district.</p> <p>Five options were provided by GIS for consideration. Two options—Plan 3 and Plan 5—were deemed optimal for best meeting the desired criteria. All five maps will be posted on the district’s Web site for public comment and review.</p> <p>The Board will have a second review of these maps and formally adopt a new map via resolution on July 25.</p> <p>The complete presentation is included in the archival copies of this BOE Agenda and Minutes. This presentation was provided for the Board’s information and discussion.</p>

<p>Bryant Opportunity Academy – Storm Shelter Addition</p> <p>Appendix 2</p>	<p>Approve an amount not to exceed \$1,508,000, which includes the above base bid, Alternate 1 and a contingency amount of \$138,892 with Icon Structure, Inc. for the Bryant Opportunity Academy Storm Shelter Addition.</p>
<p>Various Sites – ESSER Mechanical Engineering Services</p>	<p>Approve an amount not to exceed \$1,500,000 with Midwest Engineering, Inc., Basis Consulting Engineers, and Integrated Consulting Engineers for mechanical engineering services on ESSER-related projects occurring in fiscal year 2022-23. This amount represents the total authorization for all three listed engineering firms.</p>

<p>NATSB National Screening Bureau (Annual)</p>	<p>At Ms. Bond’s request, Sean Hudspeth, Chief Human Resources Officer, confirmed the correct amount to be paid to NATSB is \$126,000. This is due to increased service volume. The amount previously approved on June 13 is insufficient and additional funds are necessary.</p> <p>Ms. Bond (Ms. Krehbiel) moved that the Board approve the district’s use of NATSB for background screening checks, urine analysis, and I-9’s in an amount not to exceed \$126,000 for the 2022-23 fiscal year. Should additional quantities be required, the services shall be billed at the contracted price and shall not be returned to the Board.</p> <p>The motion passed 7-0.</p>
