Early College Academy	<p>At Mr. Reeser's request, Loren Hatfield, Executive Director of Secondary Education, briefed the Board. Early College Academy (ECA) is a program intentionally designed to promote access and opportunity for more students to obtain a college degree. In partnership with Friends University, ECA will allow students to take more classes for college credit earlier in high school. The City of Wichita and Wichita Public Schools, USD 259, have entered into a Real Estate Purchase agreement in the amount of \$450,000 for five (5) acres at Northwest High School. The City of Wichita will use the purchased land to build a new West Wichita Police Sub-Station.
