All four De Pere High School National Merit Scholarship Semifinalists have moved on to Finalist status.



It is important to note that even though you create one account, <u>each school has its own login page</u>. If you need to <u>schedule conferences in multiple schools</u>, you will need to <u>log into each school</u> separately using the unique link provided in the letter linked above.

If you **do not sign** up before the window closes, please **reach out to the teacher** as late conferences are **NOT** being scheduled through the high school office.

# \*On the date of your conference during your scheduled time, we will have live links for your student's teacher to meet with them.

Tips for having successful parent teacher conferences:

- Prepare your questions in advance
- Designate a quiet place, free of distractions and background noise
- Have your conference schedule handy
- Wait 30 seconds after your conference start time to "ask to join" the Google Meet, or before calling the provided phone number
- Respectfully end the conference when the teacher indicates that your time has ended

If you have students at Foxview or DPMS, those schools will also be communicating with you.






Once logged in, click the person icon in the upper right corner and select Settings:



#### Click Contact Preferences:



Ensure that under cellphone, in the Text (SMS) column, under emergency that you have the check box marked. **Click Save.** 



If Text (SMS) option is enabled, message and data rates may apply. Charges are dependent on your service plan which may include fees from your carrier to send and receive these text (SMS) messages. To opt out, uncheck the text (SMS) box anytime.

You must click Save in order for preference changes to be updated.

- From your cell phone, text START to 91201.
- You will receive a text back. Reply YES to confirm.

- In IC Portal, on the left side menu click More
- Open Family Information
- Click Update and change any information, click Update at the bottom to process the change

### **Hope Squad Parent Newsletter**

Hope Squad is a school-based peer support team, made up of students who are nominated by their peers, that partners with local mental health agencies. Research shows that children and young adults who are contemplating suicide are more likely to reach out to their peers than the adults in their lives. In this way, Hope Squad members are the "eyes and ears" of the school building – monitoring for warning signs of suicide and helping to connect their peers with staff members who can offer the appropriate



resources in times of need. The Unified School District of De Pere has Hope Squad teams at Foxview, DPMS, and DPHS. We will be sharing a monthly parent newsletter produced by Hope Squad with some practical parenting tips. We hope you find a helpful nugget of wisdom in these brief newsletters.

Teens can obtain a permit in WI at age 15.

- Teens will not be allowed to apply for their probationary license until they are at least 16 years old, hold their permit for at least 6 months ticket free, practice hours of at least 50 hours and 10 of those at night, and have completed all of driver education (classroom and BTW lessons).
- Another change is that the **permit will be good for 18 months** instead of 12 months. The DMV has *not* announced when they will sunset the parental road test waiver; however the waiver program is ending and all 16-17 year olds **will have to take the road test**.
- The new law changes the number of practice hours required during the permit phase, it changed from 30 hours to 50 hours. The DMV does not collect the practice driving record when teens go for their road test however they may ask to see it or the Road Ready app which also tracks practice time.
- Your teen should work toward at least 100 hours of practice with 30 of those at night based on national recommendations put forth by AAA Foundation research in order to give novice drivers more experience before licensing (shows it reduces crashes after licensing). Our common goal for everyone is to have

fewer crashes, injuries, and fatalities involving teens and all other drivers. Use of the Road Ready app is a great tool for them to track their progress of practice hours.

Who is eligible to enroll? Any student who is 14 years/10 months to 18 years old. Sign up information is located on the De Pere High School webpage under the "Students" tab under the Driver's Education link. # **Important Scholarship and FAFSA Resource Information**

<u>Seniors-</u> The Counseling Department is checking in to make sure you are all looking into scholarships if you plan on attending a four or two year college/university. There are several opportunities for you to consider, please see below:

1) Xello: Scholarships can be found by logging into your Xello account and clicking on the College Planning tab. Scholarships get posted as they come in, so keep checking them once a week. Both local and national scholarships are listed.

THE DEPERE HIGH SCHOOL COMMUNITY SCHOLARSHIP CAN BE FOUND UNDER THERE- this is used for several local scholarships where a high school committee works with local organizations to select students for their scholarships. Again, this simple application is used for several scholarships. Please attach your resume to it if you have one for your list of activities/work, etc and for the essay, you can use your college essay or use the essay prompt included. Here is the link for the community scholarship (due date is March 1, but turn into counseling sooner if you can) that will need to be printed: De Pere Community Scholarship

- 2) Your college or university- those scholarships are typically on the school's homepage under financial aid. Please start checking for these now as some have early deadlines.
- 3) On Wednesday, February 28 from 8:30-11, the counseling office will be hosting representatives from NWTC and other community organizations to get you started on their scholarships and others. It is strongly recommended you come to counseling that morning for any help you need with scholarships and/or get started on them. Please come during release or Flex.
- 4) You also may find scholarships through civic and religious groups, fraternal organizations, or your and/or your parent(s) place of employment.

The appointment will include a full health screening by a physician or physician assistant, a vision exam, and evaluation for ACL injury risk. This physical will meet school and WIAA requirements for the 2024-25 and 2025-26 school years. A parent or guardian must accompany the student, or sign a parent consent form. Cost is \$25. All
