ACCESS CONTROL

Access control is a multifaceted concept providing layers of security for a building. Currently, all MCSD buildings have some aspect of access control; however, the District would like to add additional layers at school buildings. The goal of the access control initiative is to begin the process of ensuring the following standards are met at all school buildings:

- 1- Electronic door access on non-classroom exterior doors which meets fire code standards without automatically disengaging based on physical proximity to the door
- 2- Ability to alert when an unmonitored non-classroom exterior door is open longer than expected for its intended use
- 3- Ability to alert when a secondary exterior door to a classroom is open longer than expected for its intended use
- 4 Mechanical locks which automatically engage on secondary exterior doors to a classroom
- 5 Mechanical locks on interior doors, excluding passage doors
- 6 Secure vestibules equipped with two secured doors prior to gaining access to the main building
- 7 Glass doors and windows in secure vestibules equipped with shatter resistant material
