


## **TAPR Overview**

## **Progress Toward Meeting HB 3 Goals**

TEC, §39.306(a)(8) the Annual Report to include the progress of the district and each campus in the district toward meeting the goals set in the district's:

- (A) early childhood literacy and mathematics proficiency plans adopted under Section 11.185; and
- (B) college, career, and military readiness plans adopted under Section 11.186.

House Bill 3 required school boards to adopt detailed plans developed by their management teams that achieve goals in two key areas:

- Early childhood literacy and mathematics proficiency (ECLM)
- College, career, and military readiness (CCMR)

# EARLY CHILDHOOD LITERACY BOARD OUTCOME GOAL




The percent of 3<sup>rd</sup> grade students that score meets grade level or above on STAAR Reading will increase from 36 to 60 percent in 2025.

The percent of 3<sup>rd</sup> grade students that score meets grade level or above on STAAR MATH will increase from 40 to 60 percent in 2025.

The percent of graduates that meet the criteria for CCMR will increase from 61% to 75 % in 2025.
