


UNIQUE COMPARISON GROUP

In some of the charts, MPS data points are compared against various groups (state, etc.) A unique comparison includes a category defined as the Elite Comparison Group (ECG), comprised of nine Michigan school districts that routinely exhibit elite academic outcomes. This group *does not* compare to MPS in terms of demographics or funding. In most cases, the districts within the group receive higher state revenues and have a lower percentage of students "at risk."




Per-Pupil Foundation Allowance Comparison





MPS students outperformed their peers across the state in ELA, with students in higher grades seeing a bigger impact.




MPS/ECG ELA/State Comparisons




MPS/State Comparisons: Math

MPS students outperformed their peers across the state in Math, with students in higher grades seeing a bigger impact.




MPS/ECG/State Math Comparisons




MPS/State Comparisons: Science

MPS students outperformed their peers across the state in Science




MPS/ECG/State Science Comparisons




MPS/State Comparisons: Social Studies


MPS students outperformed their peers across the state in Social Studies, with students in higher grades seeing a bigger impact



MPS/ECG/State Social Studies Comparisons




SAT AVERAGE COMPOSITE COMPARISON





% of MPS ELA students with average or high growth outpaces State and consistently remains competitive with the ECG




% of MPS MATH students with average or high growth outpaces State and typically outpaces the ECG









MPS students outperformed their peers across the state in Math, with students in higher grades seeing a bigger impact.
