

# Study Area



### Project Background

- Proposed Gorham Connector: Gorham Bypass to Exit 45
- Addressing decades of Safety and Mobility challenges
- MTA requested by 4 Municipalities, MaineDOT and Legislature to advance
- Evaluated a range of alternatives: Do Nothing, Widen Roads, New Roads
- New Road is Preferred Alternative, thoughtfully placed to avoid impacts
- Public Process is beginning soon

### Gorham East-West Corridor Feasibility Study: Recommendations


- "The Study recommends that MTA/MaineDOT further evaluate additional roadway capacity strategies with the intent of identifying a preferred alternative."
- "The Study recommends that communities begin to take specific actions towards achieving improved land use opportunities."
- "The Study recommends that transit providers further evaluate and implement top tier transit improvements."

Benefits maximized by all three happening together


#### Additional Details


- Ability to advance new roadway, while at the same time create transit, bicycle, pedestrian, and land use opportunities
- Consistent with local plans
- Improved accessibility promotes economic growth and housing opportunities
- Reduces "cut through" traffic on local roads
- Compatible with ongoing transit studies, including Bus Rapid Transit
- Consistency with Maine's Climate Action Plan EV's, Transit, Park and Rides
- Minimal Land Use Impacts


#### Applicant's Preferred Alternative

MTA has engaged with all directly impacted landowners

■ Process started in 2019

■ MTA owns or has rights for approximately 45% of alignment

2022
