

LCFF funds include a base level of funding for all LEAs and extra funding - called "supplemental and concentration" grants - to LEAs based on the enrollment of high needs students (foster youth, English learners, and low-income students).




This chart shows the total general purpose revenue Excelsior Charter School expects to receive in the coming year from all sources.

The text description for the above chart is as follows: The total revenue projected for Excelsior Charter School is \$35,668,990.00, of which \$30,922,498.00 is Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF), \$2,812,174.00 is other state funds, \$781,300.00 is local funds, and \$1,153,018.00 is federal funds. Of the \$30,922,498.00 in LCFF Funds, \$4,044,120.00 is generated based on the enrollment of high needs students (foster youth, English learner, and low-income students).

This chart provides a quick summary of how much Excelsior Charter School plans to spend for 2023-24. It shows how much of the total is tied to planned actions and services in the LCAP.

The text description of the above chart is as follows: Excelsior Charter School plans to spend \$36,124,722.00 for the 2023-24 school year. Of that amount, \$7,335,336.00 is tied to actions/services in the LCAP and \$28,789,386.00 is not included in the LCAP. The budgeted expenditures that are not included in the LCAP will be used for the following:


