Motor Moms and Dads assist students at Thomson

Research supports a strong link between motor development and a child's ability to learn and that's why a group of volunteers, called Motor Moms and Dads, are making a significant impact on students at Thomson Elementary.



Each week the volunteers work with students at least four days participating in a variety of activities designed to help students practice motor and sensory development such as jumping on a mini trampoline and whispering the ABCs or practicing site words or math problems while walk-

ing on a balance beam. Students are out of the classroom for about five minutes.

Thomson Elementary Principal **Natalie Miller** said parent **Ty Woznek** is responsible for the return of the Motor Moms and Dads, which was introduced to the district more than 10 years ago.

"Mr. Woznek wanted to volunteer a set amount of time each week dedicated to a project," Miller said.
