Auditor praises District for continuing to earn "clean audit"

For the 15th consecutive year, Davison Community Schools has received a "clean" financial audit, which means the final budget figures provided in June to the Board of Education by Director of Business Services **Leslie Young** and her staff did not change once the audit was completed.

Jacob Sopczynski and Mike Frawley, certified public accountants with Yeo & Yeo CPAs and Business Consultants, conducted the audit and shared their findings at the October 5 Board of Education meeting. Auditors annually assess the District's financial risk and test internal controls.

The auditors found that the District's financial statements were fairly presented and no accounting records needed adjustment. They focused on key controls including disbursements, payroll and receipts (PaySchools, Athletics, Food Services and DCER). The firm also audits the 2013 Capital Project Fund (Central Elementary bond) and the Sinking Fund annually.

The accountants also perform a single audit over federal programs and this year selected special education spending.

In addition to Young, the Business Office staff includes Purchasing/Payroll Support Secretary **Shawn Barrett**, Business Office Secretary **Robin Ricica**, Payroll Specialist **Sue Seymour** and Accountant **Joshua Evans** for their hard work in the district achieving the clean audit status. Frawley credited the district for maintaining its fiscal health even though it has meant making tough choices.

"We live in a very volatile world in public education right now," said Superintendent **Eric Lieske**. "For us to be financially strong in these times is huge. We need to be able to keep our Board Resources goal intact but, more importantly, we need to make sure that the main thing continues to be the main thing and that kids are coming first."
