Board extends contract for Superintendent Lieske

Davison Board of Education members unanimously agree that Superintendent **Eric Lieske** has exceeded expectations in his sixth year on the job. Board members approved extending Lieske's five-year contract another year.

Lieske was evaluated by the seven-member board during a closed session meeting April 25.

Board members rated Lieske in the areas of curriculum and instruction, community relations, student growth, personnel relations, fiscal and facilities management, professional leadership, board relations and goal attainment.

"Eric keeps his eye on the budget and closely follows what is happening at the state level," said Board President **Kathleen Sudia**. "We continue to provide a high quality education for our students with a very conservative budget."

"Eric has lofty goals and a tireless work ethic," said **Mark McGlashen**, Personnel Committee Chairperson. "Those have led to continued success for his administration and our district as a whole."

Lieske began his career in Davison in 1997. During his 19 years with the District, he has held roles including teacher, assistant principal, principal and assistant superintendent. He began serving as superintendent July 1, 2010.

District to purchase used buses; replace filters on well systems

Board members approved the purchase of seven used school buses at last night's meeting.

The 2015 Thomas Saf-T-Liner C2 school buses are being purchased for \$462,000 from Hoekstra Transportation, Inc. and will replace six leased buses.

Board members also voted to replace filters on water filtration systems at Siple and Gates Elementary at a cost of \$72,750. These are the only two buildings in the district that operate on well water.
