Board adopts 2016-17 budget

Davison Board of Education members approved the 2016-17 budget at its June 27 meeting following the district's annual Truth in Taxation Hearing and Certification of Tax Rates for 2016/2017.

The Board adopted the following budgets for the 2016/2017 school year: (1) the General Operating Fund; (2) the School Service Special Revenue Fund; (3) the Debt Retirement Fund; and (4) the Capital Projects Fund.

"With the continued economic pressures faced by the District in the form of continuing increases in costs to the services provided to our students and funding increases that have not kept up with those costs of education, we are pleased that the final amended budgets for 2015-16 and the proposed 2016-17 budgets both will keep our fund balance in a stable range," said Treasurer Kim Lindsay, adding that the Finance Committee has been meeting regularly throughout the school year to review progress on the 2015-16 budget as well as assumptions and predictions for the upcoming school year's budget. "The 2016-17 budget is built on a conservative base of assumptions as we await student count information that will be finalized in the fall. The business office staff, administrative team and employee groups have worked hard and cooperatively at managing costs while providing a terrific academic program at Davison Community Schools."

In addition to approving the budgets, Board members also voted to borrow \$3.75 million for the 2016/2017 year. Due to the timing of school aid payments from the State of Michigan, many school districts are required to issue a State Aid Note each year.
