Board members have approved the Advisory Curriculum Council's recommendations for textbooks and materials for the 2017-18 school year.



Board approves student trip to International DECA conference

Fifty-two of Davison's finest students competed last month against more than 3,000 of Michigan's top marketing students at the State DECA Career Conference at the Cobo Center in Detroit. After a successful showing, Davison DECA chapter qualified 12 students who will go on to compete at the organization's international conference in Anaheim, California April 25 to May 1, after board members approved the trip at Monday night's meeting. This is one of the largest groups of students to ever qualify for nationals from Davison.

"The students have made it to this level. This puts them in the top ½ percent of marketing students in the world. This is the best of the best. Our 12 students want to see how they match up against the best," said chapter advisor and CTE Teacher **Matt Ames**.

DECA is an international student association of high school and college students studying marketing, management and entrepreneurship in business, finance, hospitality and marketing sales and service. DECA chapters operate in over 4,500 high schools worldwide and are recognized and endorsed by the U.S. Department of Education. Ranging from local to international levels, DECA students are involved in competitions, social activities, community service and real-work experience with local businesses. Within DECA, students get the opportunity to learn about an area of marketing that is of interest to them and integrate teamwork, problem-solving, interpersonal and leadership skills.

"It was cool to be really serious like a business professional in a real world setting," said chapter member **David Pinter**.

DECA competitors study marketing and business topics in over 40 different competitive marketing events in the classroom setting. They then practice how to present a project and think on their feet during roleplaying situations. Students are able to experience first hand what they are learning in the classroom.
