Board approves parking lot repairs and bus purchases

The west parking lot of Davison High School, where students park during the day and community members park for performing arts and athletic events in the evening, will be repaired this summer.

District officials got a break when bids came in lower than expected.

"We were really worried about where the bids would come in on this project," said Superintendent Eric Lieske.

District officials ended up locking in on a price for a set amount of asphalt, enough to hopefully make repairs throughout the district in addition to the high school west parking lot.

Board members approved the low bid of \$116,723.50 from Ace-Saginaw Paving Company. Work on the project will include milling of all areas before a 2-inch cap of asphalt is applied.

"It's the next best thing to removing everything and possibly getting into soil issues," Lieske said.

Board members also approved the purchase of 11 used school buses at Monday night's meeting.

Five 2015 Thomas buses will be purchased for \$58,450 each and six 2013 Thomas buses will be purchased for \$34,500 each, or \$499,250 total.



All of the buses are 77-passenger Saf-T-Liner C2 buses.

The 2015 models are lease turn-in buses with less than 50,000 miles on each while the 2013 models are quaranteed to

have less than 75,000 miles on each of them.

"These units are an excellent fit and will provide a substantial upgrade to our existing fleet," said Director of Operations Phil Thom.

The buses are expected to be delivered in July.
