# Second graders finish among top 10% on national math test

Students in Mr. **Ben Montgomery's** class were recognized at the June 12 Board of Education meeting for high achievement in the Noetic Math competition. The Central Elementary class is ranked 14th in the nation among second graders taking the test. In addition to the class ranking, eight students scored within the top 10 percentile and 16 earned honorable mentions. In all, 24 out of 34 students taking the test earned some sort of extra honor.

Mr. Montgomery said his class has participated in the competition since he learned about it four years ago. The test is marketed for private schools, he said.

"We've been chasing this win for awhile," he said, noting that past classes have come close.

The 20-question, 45 minute test has problems that are designed to trick students, Montgomery said.

"It's a different way to think about patterns and numbers," he explained.

Mr. Montgomery was especially pleased that his classroom earned the Team Award.

"I am very proud of these kids," he said. "The Team Award means so much to me—the ability to work together and to solve problems and some of the growth I've seen out of these students has been incredible."


