Two DHS students named as National Merit Scholar finalists

Davison High School students **Montgomery Stheiner** and **Robert Walker** have been recognized as National Merit Scholar finalists. This is a tremendous achievement as becoming a finalist requires scoring in the top 1% on the PSAT.

The National Merit® Scholarship Program is an academic competition for recognition and scholarships that began in 1955. High school students enter the National Merit Program by taking the Preliminary SAT/ National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (PSAT/ NMSQT®)—which serves as an initial screen of approximately 1.6 million entrants each year—and by meeting published program entry and participation requirements.

All Finalists are considered for one of the 2,500 National Merit \$2,500 Scholarships. National Merit \$2,500 Scholarship winners are the Finalists in each state judged to have the strongest combination of accomplishments, skills, and potential for success in rigorous college studies.

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

Curriculum/Textbooks gets nod of approval

The proposed materials were recommended by the district's Advisory Curriculum Council (ACC) and reviewed by the Board's Curriculum Committee.

All of these courses have ACC approved curriculum. Davison Community Schools has also created its own Davison online courses utilizing ACC-approved curriculum aligned to state standards and taught by Davison High School teachers. The District also enrolls students in online courses and curriculum through the Genesee Intermediate School District's Gen-NET portal. All of the courses offered through Gen-NET have been reviewed to ensure they are aligned to Michigan state standards.
