The following action items were approved by the Davison Board of Education at its March 7 meeting:

• **Teacher and Staff Appreciation Week:** Board members approved a resolution acknowledging the week of May 2-6 as Teacher and Staff Appreciation Week in Davison.

"We are very fortunate to have very highly dedicated, competent teachers and staff here at Davison Community Schools who work diligently for the benefit of the children and community," said Superintendent **Kevin Brown**.

• Series II Bond Draw: Since the District has nearly exhausted monies in the first series of bond allocations, board members passed a resolution to access funds from series two one year earlier than anticipated.

"This is actually rather exciting," Supt. Brown said. "Since the bond was approved in March 2020, we have been going at warped speed ever since. We are way ahead of where we anticipated we would be and now are kind of at a point where we will be running lean on the money we will need to continue the pace."

Brown said district officials had anticipated to take the second series draw next summer.

The bond was approved nearly two years ago and many critical needs were immediately addressed including:

- Updating mechanical systems at Davison High School, Davison Alternative Education, Davison Middle School and Hahn Intermediate
- Roof replacements at Siple Elementary, Davison Alternative Education and the high school gym
- Construction of a new bus lot and renovations to the Lapeer Road property to house Transportation, Food Services and Davison Community Enrichment and Recreation offices.
- Installation of a new heating and air conditioning system (chiller) at Davison High School
- Security system upgrades throughout the district
- Addition of two classrooms at Thomson Elementary
- ◊ Removal of asbestos at Davison High School

Construction of a connector between the high school and alternative education building (which continues to be delayed due to supply shortages)

In addition, work on the new performing arts center continues to take place and is projected to be completed by spring of 2023.

- Approval of Site Plan Improvements: In another exciting and bond-related action item, the Board approved bids for an elevator for the new Performing Arts Center and site improvement work that will include new parent drop-off loops at Davison Middle School and Hahn Intermediate, a separate bus loop and expanded parent drop-off loop at Siple Elementary and expanded parking along the east side of Thomson Elementary. Schindler Elevator Corporation was awarded the low bid of \$114,267 to install the elevator. Board members approved the low bid of Diamond Excavating LLC in the amount of \$2,176,119 for the site improvements at Davison Middle School, Hahn Intermediate, Siple Elementary and Thomson Elementary. Work on these projects will take place this summer.
- Acceptance of Contributions: The following contributions have been offered to the district:
 - Heidi Capps donated 45 books to be placed on the district's traveling library bus.
 - Fraternal Order of Police Lodge 126 donated \$1,800 for the cost of doors for the security vehicle.
 - Karla Perrault donated \$200 to offset the cost of the Shandy Longcore Mental Health Assembly.
 - Chris Goetz donated \$3,100 to the Davison High School to offset the cost of the Shandy Longcore Mental Health Assembly.
