The following action items were approved by the Davison Board of Education at its September 12 meeting:

- **Graduation Ceremonies:** Graduation ceremonies for Davison High School will be returning to the Dort Federal Credit Union Event Center. The Davison High School Class of 2023 graduation will be held at 7 p.m. Monday, June 12, 2023. Following a recent visit to the arena, Principal Jerry Piger said the venue has undergone extensive renovations that included the addition of laser screens. Davison Alternative Education will hold its graduation at 7 p.m. Wednesday, June 14, in the Davison High School Auditorium.
- Appointment to DCER Advisory Board: Skip Konkle was reappointed as
 the school district's representative to the Davison Community Enrichment
 and Recreation Advisory Board. In addition to the District, leaders from the
 City of Davison and Davison Township are asked to appoint a representative to the board each year.
- Merit Based Compensation: While Michigan Revised School Code requires school districts to establish a method of compensating teachers and administrators based on performance, the District has historically awarded merit pay to all eligible employees. The Board approved off-scale payments of \$1,000 for administrators, \$800 for supervisors, \$600 for teachers, \$500 for Central Office staff, \$400 for full-time, hourly employees and \$200 for part-time, hourly employees who worked a minimum of the second semester of the 2021-22 school year. The payments will be included in the September 30 pay period.
- Acceptance of Donations: The following donations were gratefully acknowledged:
 - Richard and Donna Holland of Holland Heating and Cooling donated \$3,200 to Siple Elementary to provide extra funds for teachers to purchase additional classroom supplies.
 - ◆ The **Davison Optimist Club** donated 80 backpacks filled with school supplies for students in grades K-12.
 - Wojo's Garden Splendors donated flower barrels to Thomson Elementary for beautification of the school.
 - ◆ Todd Wenzel Buick GMC of Davison donated backpacks and school supplies to Thomson Elementary.
 - Kent Jones, Gale Road Holdings, donated teacher record books, lesson plan books, CA60 forms, test record cards, message pads and hall pads to be used in all district buildings as needed.

"While I have only had the pleasure of working directly with Stacy since the beginning of this school year, I have long known that she exemplifies what it means to be a Kids First employee. In her hired position as a special education teacher, Stacy takes great care when working with students on her caseload. Whether it is pulling students one-on-one, designing lessons, meeting with students in small groups, or working on assessments, she is diligent in making sure the needs of her students are met. These needs include academic, behavioral, and so-

cial emotional. It is not uncommon to see Stacy walking with a student calmly talking about what is going on in their life or using this time to defuse a student who may be having a hard



time. Building genuine relationships with all students is something that comes naturally to Stacy and kids love being

around her.

DMS staff member credited for lifesaving efforts

Just two days after the beginning of the school year had started, Davison Middle School Success Program Coordinator **Terry Cline** was approached by a student in the lunchroom. He recognized the student as she was new to the district and he had just given her a tour of the building the week prior. This interaction, however, would result in Mr. Cline quite possibly saving the student's life.

The student indicated she wasn't able to breathe and Mr. Cline quickly deduced that she was choking. He immediately went into action, performing the Heimlich Maneuver, successfully dislodging the item to clear the student's airway.



Because of his actions, Mr. Cline was recognized by the Board of Education with a special "Kids First Hero" award. In addition to a certificate, Terry was awarded with a \$100 gift card from the Mark Owen MEEMIC Insurance Agency.
