The following action items were approved by the Davison Board of Education at its May 2 meeting:

- Genesee Intermediate School District Budget: Board members voted 6-0 to approve the GISD budget at its May Board of Education meeting. State law requires local school boards to review and either support or disapprove of the annual intermediate school district's proposed budget. Board Trustee Nicholas Goyette attended the annual GISD budget hearing on April 27, and Superintendent Kevin Brown has taken part in meetings where the proposed 2022/2023 GISD budgets have been reviewed by Genesee County superintendents.
- Policy Updates for First Reading: Board members approved several policies for a first reading. The policies include:
 - ⇒ 1616 Staff Dress and Grooming. While there are policies in place addressing grooming and dress for professional and support staff, there has not been one for administrative staff.
 - ⇒ 6110 Grant Funds
 - ⇒ 6114 Cost Principles Spending Federal Funds
 - ⇒ 6325 Procurement Federal Grants/Funds

The latter three policies deal with ensuring that federal funds are spent following the guidelines set forth by the grant stipulations.

Policy updates are provided by Neola, a company the Board has contracted with since February 2014 to provide a policy manual review and updates. The Board Policy and Planning Committee reviews the policies prior to coming to the Board for approval.

- Acceptance of Contributions: The following contributions have been offered to the district:
 - ♦ **Kipp Stewart**, Stewart & Associates Insurance, donated \$1,000 for the sponsorship of the Senior Honors Night Reception.
 - Kendra Landry donated two large boxes of classroom crafts and Easter goodies to Siple Elementary.
 - ♦ Journey Ministries donated children's clothing to Siple Elementary for students who may need a change during the day.
