Brenda has a calm but confident demeanor, a positive attitude, and a willingness to put kids first in everything she does. is purposeful at getting to know her students and communicating with families. Her ability to recognize a change in behavior and communicate that to this student's parents led to a life-changing diagnosis. Brenda's support of that student and family continued far beyond the hours of the school day or school year.

As a leader, Brenda has stepped up to mentor numerous staff members and student teachers. She is masterful at establishing procedures and routines with her students and is often asked to share her classroom management skills and knowledge with others. In fact, she has even been sought out by University staff to assist student teachers who were struggling with this to help propel some of our newest teachers onto a positive professional trajectory.

When Brenda sees a need, she fills the need without complaint or seeking recognition. She's been seen supervising students during dismissal time when we were short-staffed and helping out with buses when needed. Brenda also voluntarily opens up her classroom to some of our students when they have a guest teacher and need some extra support.

I am so grateful that Brenda is part of our Central team. She is not one to ever seek the spotlight, although is often worthy of it; so it is my great pleasure to nominate Brenda for the Davison Community Schools Kids First Award."
