GSRP complements full day kindergarten program

The move to a full day kindergarten program this school year has been a tremendous success.

"We are seeing some amazing things from our kids," **Natalie Miller**, Thomson Elementary Principal, told Board of Education members Monday night. "We know some parents were concerned about the full day ... but it's really, really exciting to see that the kids are achieving huge milestones."

Part of the success is due to the Great Start Readiness Preschool program, which prepares students for kindergarten. Davison currently offers six half-day sessions to 108 students, said Early Learning Coordinator **Susan Vamos**.

Based on winter reading scores, 92 percent of kindergarteners who were in GSRP are at benchmark levels.

"We see GSRP as a great foundation for these kids," Vamos said.

Miller said this year's kindergarten students have reached benchmarks that have never been seen before.

Board approves purchase of curriculum, texts

Board members approved the purchase of textbooks and materials for the 2013-14 school year as recommended by the district's Advisory Curriculum Council. The total cost. \$399,048, will purchase supplies for social studies grades 1-8, AP biology, AP economics and AP biology at the high school, and business, English, math and science materials at Davison Alternative Education.

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Leading the Pledge

Students from the Cardinal's Nest, along with Director Marilyn Strader, led the audience in the Pledge of Allegiance at Monday night's Board of Education meeting. April is the Month of the Young Child and the Cardinal's Nest is holding a variety of activities, including special guest readers and "lunch with a hero" throughout the month to celebrate.

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Last spring, 67 percent of students were at grade level on the Dynamic Indicators of Basic Early Literacy Skills (DIBELS) test and 80 percent on Developmental Reading Assessment (DRA).

This winter, students in the full day program scored 84 percent on the DIBELS and 91 percent on the DRA.

"We've never had that before," Miller said.

Miller said the full day program was developed not to add more to the day but to concentrate on what was already a strong kindergarten curriculum.

"The problem was with a half day schedule, there wasn't enough time to do the curriculum justice," she said.

Now, students get 90 minutes of literacy activities, 60 minutes of writing and 60 minutes of math instruction in addition to science, social studies, health, anti-bullying and Cardinal Code and "play with purpose" social development lessons. Students also have physical education, computers and music classes several times a week.
