Hannah said this annual event is near and dear to her heart.


"Community service is a passion for me," she said.

#### DEF mini grant winners show new tools

Several recipients of this year's Davison Educational Foundation mini grants were excited to share how they are incorporating grant projects into their classrooms at Monday's Board of Education meeting.

Hahn Intermediate teachers **Tiffany Hopper, Julie Pattee** and **Marcia Webb** won a grant for their project, "Listening Centers." Each teacher has a CD player in her classroom with six headphones along with a variety of CDs and books on tape.

"One of the things I have used the listening station for—and the kids have really benefitted from—is listening to different dialects," Mrs. Hopper said. "We are able to listen to different cultures and that has been extremely valuable to my students ... we wanted to reach as many kids as possible with as many avenues as possible. Oftentimes, pronunciation of words can really trip kids up and makes them not want to read."

Mrs. Pattee said she has used the listening center in her room to help students find interests in different genres (science fiction, for example) that a student might not have previously considered.

"We aren't just teaching kids to read," said Mrs. Webb, who has made the listening center in her classroom available to students with special needs as well Book Bowl members preparing for competition. "We are trying to develop lifelong learners."

The listening centers can be used by small groups or students or as an entire class.

Central Elementary Teacher **Mindy Parrott** brought two of her first grade students to demonstrate how she is using the two iPads she purchased with grant money in her classroom. **Jackson Smith** demonstrated how he and classmates use a math application while **Lillian Beath** showed board members how she uses the iPad for spelling.
