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Bond Basics

Information about the March 10 election

On March 10 voters in the Davison Community Schools district are being asked to approve a \$71.39 million bond that will focus on safety and security, new instructional technology and renovations. If passed, residents of the District would see a

2.9 mill increase in their property taxes. For the average Davison homeowner with a home value of \$170,000.00 that equates to a tax increase of about 69 cents a day.

"We started the process by surveying our stakeholders to identify their priorities and the projects they would support," said Superintendent Kevin Brown. "We also worked very hard to identify our critical needs."

Last March, parents, students and community members were surveyed about what they believed were the biggest needs that should be addressed. The top three priorities were renovations to the west side of Davison High much needed upgrades to the entire west side entrance to new band and choir classrooms three priorities were renovations to

Davison High School, safety and security upgrades and instructional technology. The District formed communities to take a closer look at these areas and the District's critical needs. Three community forums were also held this past fall to explain the District's critical needs and seek input on proposed bond features.

Survey results among all stakeholder groups consistently indicated that safety and security, instructional technology and renovations - especially to the nearly 50-year-old high school - and a new auditorium were among their top choices in need of improvement.

If approved, projects to be completed over the next several years would include:

 Safety and Security - installation of secure entry vestibules at school buildings, energy efficient and improved site lighting, improved traffic circulation at Davison High School, Davison Middle School, Hahn In-

> termediate and Siple Elementary, a new fire alarm system at the high school and a new corridor connector between Davison High School and Davison Alternative Education.

- New Instructional Technology new devices, infrastructure, new telephones and public address systems that would enhance communication between staff and students, especially in the case of an emergency.
- Renovations roofs, boilers, a new auditorium at DHS, a new gymnasium at Gates, classrooms at Thomson Elementary, restrooms, track and turf at Cardinal Stadium.

GRIEVANCE PROCEDURE

FOR TITLE VI OF THE CIVIL RIGHTS ACT OF 1964 TITLE IX OF THE EDUCATION AMENDMENT ACT OF 1972 SECTION 504 OF THE REHABILITATION ACT OF 1973 TITLE II OF THE AMERICANS WITH DISABILITIES ACT OF

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Section 1

Any person believing that the Davison Community School District or any part of the school organization has inadequately applied the principles and/or regulations of (1) Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, (2) Title IX of the Education Amendment Act of 1972, (3) Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, or (4) Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 may bring forward a

Section II

The person who believes a valid basis for grievance exists shall discuss the grievance informally and on a verbal basis with the Civil Rights Coordinator, who shall in turn investigate the complaint and reply with an answer within five (5) business days. If the complainant feels the grievance is not satisfactorily resolved, they may initiate formal procedures according to the following steps.

Step 1

A written statement of the grievance signed by the complainant shall be submitted to the Civil Rights Coordinator within five (5) business days of receipt of answers to the informal complaint. The Coordinator shall further investigate the matters of grievance and reply in writing to the complainant within five (5) business days.

Step 2

A complainant wishing to appeal the written (or Step 1) decision of the local Civil Rights Coordinator may submit a signed statement of appeal to the Superintendent of Schools within five (5) business days after receipt of the Coordinator's response. The Superintendent shall meet with all parties involved, formulate a conclusion, and respond in writing to the complainant within ten (10) business days.

Step 3

If still unsatisfied, the complainant may appeal through a signed, written statement to the Board of Education within five (5) business days of receiving the Superintendent's response in Step 2. In an attempt to resolve the grievance, the Board of Education shall meet with the concerned parties and their representative within forty (40) days of the receipt of such an appeal. A copy of the Board's disposition of the appeal shall be sent to each concerned party within ten (10) days of this meeting. The decision of the Board of Education shall be final.

Questions and answers about the March 10 bond election

Q: Why is the District pursuing a facilities bond?

A: The District's facilities are aging and in need of repair. We have a lot of critical needs when it comes to big-ticket equipment upgrades such as heating systems and roofs, security enhancements and technology for instruction. For example, Davison High School is nearly 50 years old and is still using the original boilers and roof. We just had to unexpectedly replace the roof at Hahn Intermediate and that cost almost \$700,000. If another one of these systems fails, the district does not have the money to replace it. These items are well beyond their predicted life expectancy. We have similar situations at other buildings throughout the District.

Q: Doesn't the District have a sinking fund for maintenance and repair of its facilities?

A: Yes and no. The District has a sinking fund that generates about a million dollars a year. However, sinking fund dollars can only be used for repairs. When we encounter large expenses, such as replacing the roof at Hahn

(which we had to do this past summer at a cost of almost \$700,000) we do not have enough money in our sinking fund to make other needed and scheduled repairs. Over time, the District's critical needs compound and we are now one boiler failure away from a big problem. It's also important to note that sinking fund dollars cannot be used for capital projects (new construction) or maintenance and operational costs.

Q: How much is the District asking for and



what would it cost the taxpayers?

A: The bond is for \$71.39 million. Residents of the District would see a 2.9 mill increase in their property taxes. For the average Davison homeowner with a home value of \$170,000 that equates to a tax increase of about 69 cents a day.

Q: Why is the District considering upgrades at Cardinal stadium?

A: We have some critical needs at Cardinal Stadium. It's hard to believe but the stadium is actually 15 years old. The track is in need of repair and we sure could use some additional restrooms! Right now, the only teams using the stadium on a regular basis are the high school football teams. If we are going to repair the track and add additional

restrooms we should consider converting the football field to turf. Field turf at Cardinal Stadium would cost about \$700,000, less than 1 percent of the bond. The district currently spends more than \$40,000 annually in maintenance to the field (including watering). Having a turf field would allow so many other students (including middle school and youth football, lacrosse, soccer and marching band) to use the field as well.

Q: Will replacement of bleachers at the high school gym and Collins Field be included in the bond?

A: Replacement of the bleachers in the Davison High School gym will be included. We have made improvements at Collins Field by installing fencing, railings and riser boards. In addition, the bleachers at Davison Middle School were upgraded several years ago when the gym flooring was replaced.

Q: Didn't the district recently purchase some property? Is that anything that is included in this bond?

A: Yes, the District purchased the old Colonial Suites

property off Lapeer Road for \$425,000. This fiveacre parcel has a 14,600 square foot building, a large parking lot and abuts to an additional 23 acres owned by the District. To purchase five acres and build a building that size we estimate it would have cost the District over \$1 million so we believe purchasing the property was a good investment. While no firm plans have been made, the building is currently

the DCS website at www.davisonschools.org. Click on the "Bond 2020" quick link on the left side of the site to learn more information, view the entire bond application that was submitted to the Michigan Department of Treasury, watch video blogs by Superintendent Kevin Brown or read the informational flyers and our Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ) document.

The bond would cost the average Davison homeowner (a home valued at \$170,000) about \$247 a year. That is just over \$20 a month or 69 cents a day. You can calculate the exact cost of your increase by multiplying the taxable value of your home (found on your yearly tax assessment statement that is mailed out by your township or city) by .0029. For example, a person who owns a home valued at \$150,000 with a taxable value of \$75,000 would pay \$218 more annually (75,000 x .0029 = 217.50) which equates to \$18 a month or 60 cents a day.

Currently, the millage rate for Davison Community Schools is 3.624 mills. Out of the 21 school districts in Genesee County, Davison ranks #15 on the list of millage rates. Genesee Schools has the highest millage rate with a tax levy of 16.9675 mills. If the bond is approved, the total levy for DCS would be at 6.524 mills, meaning Davison would move up


that list but still fall behind several other districts including Genesee, Bendle, Montrose, Goodrich, Grand Blanc and Beecher in total millage rates.

However, that millage rate would be reduced by 1.28 mills in just two years after the 2003 bonds to build Cardinal Stadium and add classrooms is paid in full. The length of the proposed bond is 22 years.

While the district has tried to keep up with maintaining buildings, replacing just one of the three boilers at Davison High School alone would cost \$1 million.

"The District simply cannot afford to address all of our critical needs given our existing funding," Brown said. "We would not be asking the community to consider a facilities bond if we really didn't need it. Our students deserve top notch facilities and this bond is the only way we can provide that."

would love to build a new high school but we estimate it would cost upward of \$90 million to construct a new high school. With so many other critical needs in the district, we feel those costs, along with that of a new high school, would be too much of

if the bond passes. This would free up more parking space on the Davison High School/Alternative Education campus as well as create additional classroom spaces at Alt Ed and Central Elementary.

Q: Will the boys' and girls' locker rooms be updated at the high school?

A: Yes, this would be included in building renovations at Davison High School.

Q: Would Collins Field be updated? Would that include repairs to the field and the track?

A: Possibly, we know the locker rooms at Collins Field need to be replaced and there are other upgrades that we are considering.

Q: What can you tell me about the Performing Arts Center? Any idea of how many people it would hold? Would the district recover money by renting it?

A: Our existing auditorium is outdated and too small. Except for replacing the seats and carpeting at least 10 years ago, there have been no other renovations for almost 50 years. There are many performances where people have to stand in the aisles. There are a lot of factors to consider that will impact the cost, but we are looking at seating for approximately 1,000 (our current auditorium seats just over 800) and if you talk with the District's music teachers, they will tell you a new auditorium is a critical need of the District. The auditorium is a space that is used by every studenti n the District and by the community as well. We would also continue to allow community groups, such as the Davison Youth Theatre, Miss Davison and other groups to utilize and rent the auditorium.

a burden on our taxpayers.

Q: I really would love to see a detailed wish list for each building/area and a timeline for projects. Will this be available?

A: Yes! This information is included in the Bond Application on our website.

Q: Have you asked our students what they need? Sometimes our students see it better than us.

A: Yes, we surveyed our students along with parents and community members last March.

Q: What is meant by "interior renovations?" What changes might there be to classrooms?

A: Interior renovations could be as simple as replacing casework, ceiling tiles or flooring in class-rooms, it could also mean remodeling bathrooms or locker rooms or completely restructuring areas of a building. It really depends on the building's existing condition and what would need to be done to reach a desired state.

Q: What is the plan on the critical needs if the bond does not pass? They seem essential to the district's safety and wellbeing.

A: There really is no other option. The District would have to keep limping along fixing or replacing the next thing that breaks and managing as best as we can. We would not be asking the community to consider a facilities bond if we really didn't need it.

DHS Cardinal LINKS program moves from club to classroom

A peer-to-peer mentoring program that began as a club several years ago is now a class for Davison High Schools students who want to assist and support students with disabilities.

"Sometimes school is a little tougher for some of our kids (with disabilities)," said **Holly Halabicky**, Executive Director of Student Services. "The LINKS program allows these kids to be matched up with another student they can go to if they have questions and have the opportunity to have a peer role model right in the classroom with them."

Students must apply for the class. Once they are accepted and paired with a buddy, they attend an assigned class with their buddy.

Davison High School Teacher **Shaun Kovatch** said the LINKS program has proven to be mutually beneficial for both the mentors and their buddies. That sentiment was shared over and over as students shared their experiences so far in the program.

"We are not there just to be a mentor but we are there to be a friend," said Davison High School senior **Levi Stevens**.

Joshua Squires said he was overwhelmed when his buddy, **Andrew**, took the time to draw him a New England Patriots logo because he knew it was Joshua's favorite football team. Joshua said it also has been inspiring to watch his buddy as well as other classmates pick up on social cues while interacting with each other.

"It's nice to see the rest of the class be nice and open to him," he said of his buddy. "He's never made to feel like an outcast. He is supported and liked by the other students and staff in the school."

"Through all the hard work and high fives, we've become really good friends," LINKS student **Rebekah Hall** said of her buddy, Parker.

Meghan Symons, who also serves as a mentor to **Parker**, said she was thankful to be a part of the LINKS program.

"Parker is one of the sweetest kids I have ever met," she said. "What I want people to know about this program is that if someone has a disability, it does not define them.

SafeCards app another tool to report unsafe behavior

The district's new SafeCards app was developed for students as another way to report incidents of bullying, conflict or unsafe behavior.

"For many years, we have had a form on our website to report bullying," Technology Supervisor **Chris Lesko** said. "We felt with the times changing the way they are and the devices that are in the kids' hands, it was time to put an app right on their phones. It's just a new way for kids to report unsafe behavior."

It took more than a year to develop the app and follow the necessary guidelines in order for it to be included in the Google Play and Apple App stores. The app was developed by former Davison Schools' technology staff member Dave Marchbanks.

To use the app, students will need to log in with their Google or Facebook account. Once logged in, they can select

their school building and report an incident, very much like the Report Bullying link on the district's website. Once the submit button is selected, the report is sent to the administrators of the building selected.

It should be noted that the app is not monitored 24/7 and should not be used to report emergencies. As always, those who have an emergency or urgent



matter should call 911.

"This is something we are very proud of," Lesko said. "We are very lucky to have the resources in our technology and communication departments to be able to offer this."

Students and parents can also continue to use the online Report Bullying link found on the district's home page or the Attorney General's OK2SAY reporting program.

Location: Davison High School Athletic Meeting Room (South Door # 12), 1250 N Oak Rd, Davison **Dates/Times:** Monday, April 20– Friday, April 24. Appointments are available from 8:30-11 a.m. and 12:45 - 3:15 p.m.

Please call Thomson Elementary at (810) 591-0911 BETWEEN March 2 and APRIL 13 to schedule your child's registration appointment. Plan to allow approximately 30-45 minutes for your scheduled appointment.

Please bring the following with you to your registration appointment:

- 1. The child to be enrolled. The registration process will include a brief basic skills screening of your child. A child must be 5 years old on or before September 1, 2020, to register. If your child's 5th birthday falls between September 2 and December 1 and you are interested in enrollment, a waiver is required. Please inquire with the school secretary when scheduling your child's registration appointment.
 - 2. The child's official (with the raised seal) birth certificate.
- 3. Davison residency verification. Verification of Davison residency must include the following three valid proofs of residency:
 - Valid driver's license with the current Davison address.
 - Utility bill (i.e. electric, gas, water, cable, landline phone). The "service" address must be indicated on the bill provided. If you pay your bills online, PLEASE PRINT YOUR ONLINE BILL.**
 - An additional utility bill, bank or credit card statement, tax bill OR Mortgage/lease agreement.**
- **Proofs above must be in the same name/address as the parent/legal guardian listed on the valid driver's license submitted. All proofs must be dated within the past two months.

Parents/Legal Guardians: In order to complete registration for your child, you must bring the required proofs of residency listed above to your appointment. If you are unable to provide or have any questions regarding the required documents, please discuss this with the school secretary when scheduling your child's registration appointment. If the required proofs of residency are not provided at the time of registration, your child will not be enrolled in a school building or assigned a teacher until received.

We will print your child's most up-to-date immunization record. A physical is not required.

ALL IMMUNIZATIONS MUST BE UP TO DATE PRIOR TO THE START OF SCHOOL.

Kindergarten classes will be offered at Siple Elementary, Thomson Elementary and Hill Elementary. Currently, developmental kindergarten classes are only available at Thomson Elementary.
