

GRIEVANCE PROCEDURE

FOR TITLE VI OF THE CIVIL RIGHTS ACT OF 1964 TITLE IX OF THE EDUCATION AMENDMENT ACT OF 1972 SECTION 504 OF THE REHABILITATION ACT OF 1973

TITLE II OF THE AMERICANS WITH DISABILITIES ACT OF 1990

Section 1

Any person believing that the Davison Community School District or any part of the school organization has inadequately applied the principles and/or regulations of (1) Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, (2) Title IX of the Education Amendment Act of 1972, (3) Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, or (4) Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 may bring forward a

Section II

The person who believes a valid basis for grievance exists shall discuss the grievance informally and on a verbal basis with the Civil Rights Coordinator, who shall in turn investigate the complaint and reply with an answer within five (5) business days. If the complainant feels the grievance is not satisfactorily resolved, they may initiate formal procedures according to the following steps.

Step 1

A written statement of the grievance signed by the complainant shall be submitted to the Civil Rights Coordinator within five (5) business days of receipt of answers to the informal complaint. The Coordinator shall further investigate the matters of grievance and reply in writing to the complainant within five (5) business days.

Step 2

A complainant wishing to appeal the written (or Step 1) decision of the local Civil Rights Coordinator may submit a signed statement of appeal to the Superintendent of Schools within five (5) business days after receipt of the Coordinator's response. The Superintendent shall meet with all parties involved, formulate a conclusion, and respond in writing to the complainant within ten (10) business days.

Step 3

If still unsatisfied, the complainant may appeal through a signed, written statement to the Board of Education within five (5) business days of receiving the Superintendent's response in Step 2. In an attempt to resolve the grievance, the Board of Education shall meet with the concerned parties and their representative within forty (40) days of the receipt of such an appeal. A copy of the Board's disposition of the appeal shall be sent to each concerned party within ten (10) days of this meeting. The decision of the Board of Education shall be final.



Retiring superintendent: "It has been a great ride!"

I want to express my most sincere appreciation to the Davison Community. I began my career with Davison in the fall of 1994 when I was hired to



teach biology at Davison High School. Bob Hahn was the Superintendent and Bud **Buell** was his Assistant Superintendent.

Rich Ramsey was the High School Principal. I will be eternally grateful to these three men for giving me the opportunity to work in this great District.

I spent the next eight years teaching science at Davison High School. I also coached football and bas-

ketball the entire time and even did a season of JV Girls' Softball. I will always cherish my time as a teacher and coach in Davison. I worked for some great people. I still believe Dave Young was one of the best Athletic Directors ever! Coach Delodge, Coach Putnam and Coach McLachlan all served as mentors and I have the utmost respect for all of them. Coaching enabled me to develop strong relationships with student athletes, many of whom I still consider friends and I truly believe my experiences coaching were the greatest preparation for my eventual transition to administration.

I'll never forget the call I received in the summer of 2002 from then Assistant Superintendent Clay Perkins. Clay wanted me to participate in the Genesee Intermediate School District Leadership Academy. I had no idea this program even existed and when Clay informed me it was a training program for aspiring administrators I had no interest in participating. I loved teaching and coaching and had no desire to become an administrator! Long story short, Clay convinced me to participate and it changed the trajectory of my career. I truly believe if it had not been for Clay Perkins seeing something in me I didn't see in myself I would not be writing this column today.

In 2002 I was hired by Kay Shepherd as an Assistant Principal at Davison High School. Kay prepared me for the next step in my career and in 2006 I became the Principal at Davison Hight School. That was a great job! I will forever treasure the relationships I developed with the students and staff in the 16 years I spent at DHS.

In 2010 new Superintendent Eric Lieske hired me as his Assistant Superintendent for Curriculum and Personnel. Eric was a superstar and much younger than I was so I never expected to become the District's Superintendent. In fact, I planned to retire as the Assistant Superintendent in 2020 but when Eric announced he was leaving to build a new school in Flint everything changed again and I found myself thrust into the role of the District's Superintendent.

I am extremely grateful for the support of all the

board members I have had the honor of working for over the last four and a half years but especially current Board President Karen Conover, former Board President Kathy Sudia, former Board Vice President Mark McGlashen and current Trustee Diane Rhines. DEF awards 8 mini grants for 2023-24 school year

The Davison Educational Foundation announced the winners of the 2023-24 classroom mini grant program during the District's End-of-the-Year Staff Recognition luncheon held June 21.

This year the DEF received 15 grant requests totaling \$21,375.11. The DEF Board selected eight of the proposals and is awarding \$8,698.53 in classroom mini grants.

Recipients include:

"DHS/DAE Garden Compost and Fenc-

ing Project" submitted by the Davison High School Art Department, Davison High School science teacher Pam Ruggiero and Davison Alternative Education teacher Amanda Mobley. This \$1,000 grant will be used to create a functional composting system using left-over food scraps from the school cafeteria.

"Physical Computing with Adafruit Circuit Playgrounds," submitted by Davison Middle School teacher John Marttila. This \$350 grant will allow for the implementation of a physical computing unit in the Davison Middle School Computer Science Discover-

ies classes. Students will use these circuit boards to discover how physical devices can interact with code to solve a wide variety of challenges.

- "MTSS Family Engagement," submitted by Thomson Elementary interventionist **Sara Howes**. This \$552 grant will be used to purchase family engagement packs to support phonemic awareness development at home.
- "Examining Ecosystems," submitted by Davison Middle School science teacher **Kerri Major**. This \$1,005.80 grant will be used to purchase six kits for carrying out experiments that focus on the role of decomposition in the cycling of energy and matter in nature.
- "Salmon in the Classroom" submitted by seventh grade science teachers Kerri Major, Crystal Weekley, Christine Kulak, Nathan Clark, Julie Naughton and Kelly Graves. This \$2,889.25 grant will help with funding the supplies associated with the year-long Michigan Department of Natural Resources project to raise chinook salmon from the egg stage to

the release in a local waterway.

• "Self-Regulation Sensory Supports," submitted by Davison Middle School teachers **Jenifer Green** and **Erica Zwolensky**. This \$903.07 grant will be used to purchase equipment and supplies to create a sensory room at Davison Middle School. A sensory room is a space that aims to provide students with the individualized sensory input they need to self-regulate so they can be better prepared for learning and interacting with others.

Peer to Peer is a school-wide program designed to increase academic, independence and social engagement opportunities for students with autism and other disabilities. This is achieved by inviting multiple peers without disabilities to learn about their schoolmates with developmental or intellectual disabilities. Peer education gives students knowledge and skills that demystify disabilities and increase understanding and acceptance. Students learn to advocate with, and for, students with disabilities.


