JOB SUMMARY: Assist, as a member of a professional team, in providing each student with the individually-tailored help, counsel and learning experience he/she needs to make progress toward educational goals established with his/her limitations in mind.

#### PRIMARY DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

- 1. Prepare lesson plans, establish course goals and design appropriate learning activities, incorporating special considerations with regard to student ability, aptitude, temperament and safety needs.
- 2. Instruct and assess students in rules and methodology of games.
- Demonstrates skills and equipment use while meeting the needs of the mentally, physically and/or behaviorally challenged.
- 4. Develop planned course outlines and objectives.
- 5. Coordinate scheduling for provision of service at multiple locations.
- 6. Coordinate and monitor supplies and equipment used at various sites to maintain inventory.
- 7. Keep abreast of new developments in the field of physical education.
- 8. Collaborate with classroom teachers, parents, care givers and/or district staff to enrich and enhance experiences for each child.
- 9. Provide opportunities for students to enrich their lives and others' through physical fitness and activity.
- 10. Uses various methods of presentation with audio/visual aids and other supplemental materials.
- 11. Provide personal transportation assistance for students as dictated by the Individualized Education Program (IEP), authorized by the parent/guardian, and approved by the program supervisor.
- 12. Devise innovative teaching methods, strategies, techniques and learning materials in an ongoing attempt to extend the possible approaches to working effectively with students with disabilities.
- 13. Perform other duties as assigned by the Supervisor of Special Education.

- Bachelor's degree in physical education required
- Pennsylvania teacher physical education certification required
- Experience with special education students
- Ability to demonstrate and perform physical activities for class

- Must have valid driver's license
- Submission of pre-employment medical examination (Section 148 of the Pennsylvania School Code)
