DOJ report sheds light on federal inmate deaths

Following the high-profile deaths of federal inmates James “Whitey” Bulger in 2018 and Jeffrey Epstein in 2019, as well as several inmate homicides at the United States Penitentiary (USP) Hazelton in Bruceton Mills and USP Thomson in Illinois, the U.S. Department of Justice (DOJ) Office of the Inspector General (OIG) initiated an evaluation to assess the circumstances surrounding inmate deaths at Federal Bureau of Prisons (BOP) institutions.

The recently published report found that across the country the BOP failed to prevent the deaths of 344 inmates over the course of eight years (2014-21), including 14 at USP Hazelton, the second highest amount of any BOP institution in the country. USP Hazelton is one of three facilities within the Federal Corrections Complex (FCC) Hazelton, which also includes a female facility and a medium-security Federal Corrections Institution (FCI).

USP Atlanta had the most over that time period but has since been lowered from a medium-security facility to a low-security facility. USP Terre Haute in Indiana also had 14 deaths in the eight years.

The OIG report details their analysis of the frequency and pattern of deaths among BOP inmates from 2014-21, breaking them down into four categories — suicide, homicide, accidental and unknown factors. They also identified potential management deficiencies and systemic issues related to those deaths and made 12 recommendations to assist the

BUSINESS

BOPARC’s Eureka Cafe is popular, and a little complicated

It’s a fine line to walk. In March 2023, Eureka Cafe opened in BOPARC’s Wiles Hill Community Center. It was a post-COVID request of a neighborhood that’s never

really had a place to call its own. Credit to BOPARC, it brought in some talented people to run it. And it’s popular. BOPARC Executive Director Melissa Wiles said the business drew some 10,000 customers

in 2023 — about 1,000 a month. But here’s the rub. It really couldn’t fail. It’s taxpayer funded. You see, the cafe isn’t the result of a proprietor paying the city rent to run a business in a city-owned building. It’s a city-owned business.

And now BOPARC finds itself trying to balance the contradictory positions of operating a popular business while not competing with privately-owned businesses. Wiles said the spirit of Eureka Cafe has always been

Mon teachers, administrators travel to Va. to tour the STEM school that is inspiring the proposed one here

LEESBURG, Va. — One student smiled and nodded hello to the tour group as she entered a glass-walled laboratory styled space and began poring over a collection of charts, graphs and reports.

Directly below, on the ground floor of the facility and by way of that same wall, another one of her classmates could also be watched as he repaired a car, in a service bay rivaling any found in a commercial garage.

Two students: one regarding her data and the other getting his hands dirty.

In the view of Monongalia County Schools Superintendent Eddie Campbell Jr., he was witnessing the future of education here at home.

Said glimpse was coming by way of the Academies of Loudoun, an elite magnet school in Leesburg, Va., a historic town and the county seat of bustling Loudoun County, in Northern Virginia.

Depending upon which way you’re steering, Leesburg is either 38 miles from Washington, D.C., or 38 miles

from Martinsburg, in West Virginia’s Eastern Panhandle.

This past Monday, Campbell arranged for a charter bus that steered him and 59 others — teachers, principals and Board of Education members to the aforementioned school.

Campbell is using the Academies of Loudoun, in fact, as inspiration for The Renaissance Academy — a standalone

school devoted solely to STEM (science, technology, engineering and math) he hopes to have open for Mon’s high school students three years from now.

Taxpayers on their May primary ballots will be asked to consider the nearly \$143 million bond it would take to get it built on an expanse of reclaimed land overlooking Interstate 79.

Cardiologist stayed close to home to give back to the people of W.Va.

Dr. Anthony Roda-Renzelli is a home-grown physician saving the lives of West Virginians at Mon Health Medical Center.

Roda-Renzelli is an interventional cardiologist who performs procedures such as stents and angioplasties.

He graduated from Bridgeport High in 1995 and was the first in his family to go to college. “I really didn’t know what I was doing.”

But his parents dropped him off at WVU in Morgantown, and he chose his career because “my mom would always say, ‘I want you to be a doctor.’ I’m like, ‘That sounds like a good idea.’ Then that’s what happened.”

He did his undergraduate and medical training and fellowship at WVU and worked there until last July. He specialized in heart care because he liked human anatomy and cardiac physiology clear back in high school. And he likes the challenge of having to think through each case.

Last July, he moved to Mon Health, to work with his friends and “family” at the Heart & Vascular Center. Dr. Wissam Gharib, he said, is like an older brother. Dr. Brad Warden, center director and chief of cardiology, is like a dad. Dr. Krishna Kishore Bingi trained under him as a fellow and is a good friend.

“You came back to work in a friendly atmosphere with people that you trust, people that you admire, people who mentored you and people that you mentored. ... So, it’s kind of fun when you come to work, and you work with your friends.”

He also does clinics at Stonewall Jackson and in Elkins.

What kept him in West Virginia? Family first, he said, but also to give back to the state.

His maternal grandfather Roda — thus his hyphenated

BOP in addressing contributing factors.

The majority of the deaths reviewed by the OIG were suicides, accounting for 54% or 187 deaths — just over half of the 344 total.

Homicides were the second most prevalent cause of death at 89, followed by accidents at 56 and unknown causes at 12. The report clarifies that while the accident category includes aspiration and other accidents, the majority of deaths placed in the accident and unknown categories involved drug overdoses.

The report stated that most of the inmates who died were housed in general population settings, however “39 percent of inmates who died by homicide and 46 percent of inmates who died by suicide were housed in a restrictive housing setting. As of August 2018, throughout the BOP about 92 percent of inmates were housed in a general population setting and approximately 8 percent were housed in a restrictive housing setting.”

During their analysis, investigators found “significant recurring issues and contributing factors” to inmate deaths, including inadequate staff response to inmate emergencies, failure to properly assess, manage and monitor inmates at risk for suicide, and deficiencies in the BOP’s ability to collect, maintain and learn from evidence and post-incident documentation.

They found that other long-standing and well-documented challenges in BOP operations, including contraband — both weapons and drugs — security

camera coverage and understaffing, “further exacerbated these conditions and hindered the BOP’s ability to control the risk of death among inmates in its custody by suicide, homicide, and other causes.”

Staff at the Hazelton facility have been speaking out about understaffing issues and the amount of mandated overtime, which they fear could create a dangerous situation. The facility has been short an average of 75-80 correctional officers (COs) over the past year.

Staff interviewed by investigators at various BOP institutions expressed the belief that due to understaffing COs were overworked, less vigilant and conducted fewer rounds.

In the report investigators stated, “a Correctional Services supervisor at one institution that we visited described overworked staff as ‘walking zombies’ and a security risk.”

U.S. Sen. Joe Manchin made various efforts throughout 2023 to promote staff and inmate safety at Hazelton and all federal prisons, including letters penned to BOP Director Colette Peters, urging her approval of a 25% retention incentive for Hazelton staff and another urging an investigation of the conditions at Hazelton to Attorney General Merrick Garland, Deputy Attorney General Lisa Monaco and Peters.

Manchin called the findings of the OIG report “disturbing” in a statement released Thursday.

“I am deeply disturbed by this new report on inmate deaths in federal prisons, including at West Virginia’s FCC Hazelton facility,” the senator stated. “It is far past time we pass

legislation to improve oversight and increase transparency to protect both the people working in these facilities and the individuals incarcerated in the federal prison system.

“We also must address the severe staffing shortages that exacerbate these dangerous environments,” he continued. “In November 2023, I called on BOP Director Colette Peters to approve a 25 percent retention incentive for all staff in good standing at FCC Hazelton and I renew this request.

“Today’s report should be a call to action and makes crystal clear that adequate staffing is essential for creating safer and more secure conditions for staff and inmates. While I will continue working with my colleagues to advance commonsense reforms, I call on Director Peters to quickly approve this request.”

The press release from Manchin’s office highlighted some other findings indicated in the report, including that during the period studied COs at FCC Hazelton were mandated to work 16-hour days up to four times per week.

Hazelton also relies on “augmentation,” a practice in which non-CO staff, such as counselors, plumbers, cooks and teachers are required to work as COs. This is an extremely dangerous practice of putting untrained staff in threatening situations. The practice also diverts resources from other critical prison programs, the release said.

At the conclusion of their evaluation, the OIG made 12 recommendations to the BOP to “address persistent operational deficiencies and improve its ability to mitigate risks that contribute to deaths of

At the conclusion of the evaluation, the Office of the Inspector General made 12 recommendations to the Federal Bureau of Prisons to “address persistent operational deficiencies and improve its ability to mitigate risks that contribute to deaths of inmates in its custody.” Here are those recommendations.

12 recommendations

1. Develop strategies to ensure that staff assign accurate, consistent and timely Mental Health Care Level designations to inmates.
2. Ensure that all institutions conduct required mock suicide drills and develop strategies to increase staff participation in those drills.
3. Ensure that all appropriate staff are trained in automated external defibrillator use and that automated external defibrillators are strategically placed, readily available and regularly checked to ensure that they are in working

order at each BOP institution.

4. Ensure that cut-down tools in working order are accessible to staff in each housing unit at each institution, that staff are trained on proper use of the tool, and that the BOP determines whether 74 staff should be issued and required to keep their own cut-down tool on their duty belt during their entire shift.

5. Ensure that each institution has a sufficient number of maneuverable gurneys in strategic locations to provide proper medical response during inmate transport.

6. Issue standard, enterprise-wide guidance and training to staff on using the radio to communicate clear, descriptive information during inmate medical emergencies.

7. Ensure that staff receive both the initial and refresher naloxone training and are fully prepared to administer naloxone to an unresponsive inmate suspected of having experienced a

drug overdose.

8. Ensure that all Evidence Recovery Teams are properly trained on post-incident evidence recovery protocols.

9. Develop procedures to ensure that all required death-related records are completed and collected consistently and in accordance with established deadlines.

10. Assess the benefit and feasibility of expanding its policy requiring After Action Reviews to include reviews of all inmate homicides and deaths by accidental and unknown factors, not just for inmate suicides.

11. Clarify responsibility for tracking at an enterprise level the reports and recommendations required in the wake of an inmate death by suicide, homicide, accident, or unknown factors, and assess the information contained therein for broader trends, applicability and implementation.

12. Evaluate existing electronic devices used for inmate screening to identify whether they are functioning as intended, and, if necessary, implement any needed adjustments or upgrades.

inmates in its custody.”

In their response, BOP concurred with the recommendations and stated various corrections or enhancements would be made. The OIG gave them a deadline of May 15, to provide any evidence or documentation that action is being taken.

Additional data on inmate deaths was published with the report.

Of the 344 deaths in the eight-year period, 159 were suicide by hanging, 70 were the result of a drug overdose, 43 were from blunt force trauma, 29 from stabings and 20 from strangulation. The remaining 23

were classified as lacerations, asphyxia, other or unknown.

The majority of inmate deaths were male (332) and white (242). The OIG reviewed 83 sex offender deaths of which 56 were suicide, 17 were homicide, nine categorized as accidents, with one unknown.

about offering something unique for folks already visiting the community center—a historic former school that BOPARC has owned for some 20 years.

“We have a great deal of respect for our private business community and are committed to reminding ourselves of the fact that Eureka is a programmatic element of the Wiles Hill Community Center. We do not want to, nor should we be, a full-service restaurant,” she explained.

To that end, Wiles recently explained to the

BOPARC’s board of directors, the cafe’s budget was reigned in late last year.

Talk of expanding hours and releasing a catering menu was nixed.

The cafe is open from 8 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. during the week. It’s not open on the weekends.

In January, after some retooling, expenses tied to the cafe were about \$7,000. Wiles said it made a little over \$3,000 in profit that month.

That’s with the services of two full-time BOPARC employees and a roster of four to five part-time staff members.

Amel Morris isn’t an ‘I told you so,’ kind of guy.

He’s the proprietor of

Lefty’s Place, a popular and growing pizza business. He’s not in competition with Eureka Cafe. He sells pizza, wings and beer.

He’s also on the BOPARC Board of Directors.

Morris first spoke up in April of last year.

“The last thing I want is for people to think I’m worried about how this is going to impact my business. We’re polar opposites. I’m thinking of the owners of those small cafes around town that are in that same market,” Morris told The Dominion Post on Friday.

“Think about it. Those

businesses have to collect a 1% sales tax, and BOPARC gets a chunk of that. Maybe people would think that’s a reach, but to me, that’s getting to a point where I feel like we really need to be careful.”

BOPARC President Danielle Trumble admitted the cafe is uncharted territory.

“We’re not really looking to compete with small business. We’re looking to improve upon what’s offered in this building,” she said. “We just want to supplement what’s already in the building and meet the needs of the surrounding neighborhood.”

WVU School of Sport Sciences helps launch martial arts program for individuals with disabilities

WVU Today

West Virginia University's Sport, Exercise and Performance Psychology program has partnered with local organizations to launch a martial arts program for individuals with intellectual and neurodevelopmental disabilities. Jeanette Garcia joined WVU's College of Applied Human Sciences in the School of Sport Sciences in August 2023. Prior to coming to Morgantown, she was at the University of Central Florida where her research focused on developing community-based activities for individuals with neurodevelopmental disorders, primarily those with autism. At UCF, she modified a

judo program for youth with autism and gathered feedback from participants, parents and instructors to refine the program over the years. Garcia saw positive results from participants in the program, including increased confidence and physical activity, improved social skills and better sleep quality. Upon arrival in Morgantown, Garcia wanted to gauge interest in implementing a similar program in the area. She reached out to SteppingStones, a non-profit organization that provides year-round recreation for children and adults with disabilities, and Renzo Gracie, a Brazilian Jiu-Jitsu gym. At the request of

SteppingStones, Garcia agreed to expand the program to include all types of intellectual and neurodevelopmental disabilities, and then helped recruit participants. Renzo Gracie assisted in ordering the gis and modifying the curriculum for the students. The six-week trial program began Jan. 22 and the students are enthusiastically embracing this new activity. "I love everything about jiu-jitsu," said Travis Martin. "I love the instructors, the classes, and the takedowns." Joining the participants and instructors for each class is a team of seven undergraduate students and three doctoral students who assist with

support and data collection. "I love working with this group," said Candace Brink, a third-year doctoral student at WVU. "I have had the opportunity to work with many of these athletes in prior coaching venues, and now I get to learn a new skill alongside them. It has been a great experience to work with so many WVU students, to form new partnerships with Renzo Gracie, and to continue partnering with SteppingStones." Garcia already has sights on publishing results from the program and applying for funding to continue the program in the future.

Mediator says talks on Gaza not 'progressing as expected' after momentum in recent weeks

RAFAH, Gaza Strip — Talks on a potential cease-fire deal in Gaza "have not been progressing as expected" in the past few days after good progress in recent weeks, key mediator Qatar said Saturday, as Israel's prime minister accused the Hamas militant group of not changing its "delusional" demands. Speaking during the Munich Security Conference, Qatar's prime minister, Sheikh Mohammed bin Abdulrahman Al Thani, noted difficulties in the "humanitarian part" of the negotiations. Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu, who is under pressure to bring home remaining hostages taken in the Oct. 7 Hamas attack, said he sent a delegation to cease-fire talks in Cairo earlier in the week at U.S. President Joe Biden's request but doesn't see the point in sending them again. Hamas wants a permanent cease-fire in Gaza and the release of Palestinians

held by Israel. Netanyahu also pushed back against international concern about a planned Israeli ground offensive in Rafah, a city on southern Gaza's border with Egypt. He said "total victory" against Hamas requires the offensive, once people living there evacuate to safe areas. Where they will go in largely devastated

in an Israeli airstrike that targeted a house outside Khan Younis in the south, according to health officials, and another five people, including three children, were killed in an airstrike on a building north of Rafah. Dr. Marwan al-Hams, director of Abu Yousef al-Najjar Hospital, said other bodies were being pulled from the rubble. Israel's air and ground offensive was triggered by the Oct. 7 attack that killed some 1,200 people in Israel and took 250 others hostage. The Gaza Health Ministry on Saturday raised the overall death toll in Gaza to 28,858, saying the bodies of 83 people killed in Israeli bombardments were brought to hospitals in the past 24 hours. The count does not differentiate between combatants and civilians, but the ministry says two-thirds of those killed are women and children. The war also has caused widespread destruction, displaced some 80% of Gaza's population and sparked a humanitarian crisis in the Hamas-run enclave.

name — owned a Bridgeport restaurant. A great-grandfather had a hand in designing Pete Dye golf course. A great-grandmother Emily is the namesake for Emily Drive. "People treat me well here. People take care of me I take care of them. ... I'm here because I'm a local guy. I just wanted to help the people of my state who've been so good

to me. We talked about his work and some of the challenges, with West Virginia ranking at the bottom nationally in health problems. Some of his close friends work in Florida, he said. "They don't see what we see," they tell him. "Cases here are more complex." Friends would visit from other states, too, and say "Man, these are tough cases." West Virginia is among

top three states for smoking rates, according to the state Division of Tobacco Prevention. And that plays a part in what he sees and treats. "I always harp on my patients about smoking, in a nice way. My number one thing is, my patients all know it, you've got to quit smoking first." Recently, a patient almost died of ventricular fibrillation in the cath lab. After the procedure, he lightly told her what he also tells others, "Hey, you quit smoking today, right?"

They just look at you look like, 'I did?' I said, 'Yeah, think about what happened to you.' Even though his work involves saving people who suffer heart attacks or other heart conditions, "My main goal when I see patients is prevention. How can you be healthier to prevent that? What steps can you take before a heart attack?" He advises, "Just live a healthier lifestyle. People need to think and not wait until something happens."

Russia takes control of a city in eastern Ukraine

KYIV, Ukraine — Russia said its forces took complete control Saturday of a city in eastern Ukraine that was the focus of intense combat for months, a development that Moscow could use to boost morale as the second anniversary of its full-scale invasion of Ukraine approaches with the war largely at a stalemate. The Russian Defense Ministry's announcement came the same day Ukraine's military chief said he was withdrawing troops from the city of Avdiivka, where the outnumbered defenders had battled a Russian assault for four months. Russian Defense Minister Sergei Shoigu told the Kremlin that Russian forces were working to clear final pockets of resistance at the Avdiivka Coke and Chemical Plant, offi-

cials said in a statement. Videos on social media Saturday appeared to show soldiers raising the Russian flag over one of the plant's buildings. Russian President Vladimir Putin sent a personal message of congratulating to his troops in the city, state news agency Tass reported. Kremlin spokesman Dmitry Peskov described Avdiivka's capture as an "important victory." Along with the invasion's upcoming anniversary on Feb. 24, Russia also is preparing for a March presidential election that is all but guaranteed to give Putin another six-year term. The Kremlin has cracked down heavily on dissent during the war, and the death Friday of imprisoned opposition leader Alexei Navalny has silenced the voice of Putin's most formidable foe.

Here's a look inside Donald Trump's \$355 million civil fraud verdict as an appeals fight looms

NEW YORK — On the witness stand last year, Donald Trump proclaimed: "I have a lot of cash." After Friday's eye-popping penalty in his New York civil fraud trial, he's going to need it — and maybe more. A judge ordered the former president to fork over \$355 million of his fortune, plus interest, finding he lied for years about his wealth on financial statements he used to secure loans and make deals as he built the real estate empire that vaulted him to fame and the presidency. "The frauds found here leap off the page and shock the conscience," Judge Arthur Engoron wrote in a 92-page decision that spares Trump's company from closure, but forces it into years of court supervision, among other sanctions. The ruling, after a 2½-month trial in New York Attorney General Letitia James' lawsuit cuts to the core of Trump's image as a wealthy, shrewd real estate mogul turned political force. The financial penalty — staggering even for a businessman who's seen casinos, an airline and other ventures fail — adds to Trump's mounting legal debts and could put the Republican presidential front-runner in a serious cash crunch as he campaigns to retake the White House. Trump, who's also

dealing with four criminal cases, decried Friday's ruling as "election inference" and has vowed to appeal. Engoron ruled that Trump engaged in a years-long conspiracy with top executives at his company, the Trump Organization, to deceive banks and insurers about the size of his wealth and the true value of such properties as Trump Tower in Manhattan and his Mar-a-Lago club in Florida. Engoron, who ruled before the trial that Trump and his co-defendants committed fraud with his financial statements, found Trump liable on five of the six remaining claims in James' lawsuit: falsifying business records, issuing false financial statements, conspiracy to commit insurance fraud and conspiracy to falsify business records. Two former longtime Trump Organization executives, Allen Weisselberg and Jeffrey McConney, were also found liable for insurance fraud. Engoron decided the case because state law doesn't allow for juries in this type of lawsuit, which sought what's known as "equitable relief" and has different rules than other cases with big-money penalties. Also, he noted, neither side asked for a jury. Trump could ultimately end up owing a half-billion dollars or more as a result of Friday's verdict.





Meanwhile, the Academies of Loudoun boasts a full range of STEM offerings in its three-level, concrete, chrome and glass building, which was put up for \$125 million in 2018 and has a 119-acre wooded campus doubling as an outdoor learning lab.

“The more I walk through the door,” Campbell mused last week in Leesburg, “the more I say, ‘I have to have one.’”

**Plural, for a reason**

It’s “academies,” because the school that is a showcase for Loudoun’s public district actually houses three such initiatives under its roof.

There’s the Academy of Engineering and Technology, with its emphasis on STEM and the obvious entrepreneurial tie-in.

And the Academy of Science, which bridges the worlds of scientific research and the humanities.

The Monroe Advanced Technical Academy is the place for students drawn to traditional offerings in career technical education — upgraded with enhanced academic rigor and plenty of the professional certifications that can make for instant job offers during the interview.

Which is why Campbell and local school board members are campaigning for such an enterprise here.

The above students spied through the glass? Maybe medical school and engineering school will be part of their futures.

Then again, maybe they’ll go right in the workforce, with trajectories stronger than college graduates, even, applying for the same job.

Which is exactly what Campbell and other

Renaissance Academy proponents want to see here.

They want to see their school geared to the needs of Morgantown and Mon’s ever-burgeoning business community, so young people here won’t have to live somewhere else — to make a living.

“That’s why we have to get this right,” as Mon BOE President Ron Lytle repeatedly says during discussions about the Renaissance Academy.

**Mission-mantra**

On an overcast, rainy Monday last week, Academies of Loudoun Principal Tinell Priddy greeted the sojourners from the Mountain State with tours and a quick primer of the school’s mission statement.

She taught high school math and engineering in neighboring Fairfax County and was also an instructor at the U.S. Space and Rocket Center in Huntsville, Ala., before being named top administrator at the Academies.

Priddy was the founding principal of the Academies.

She was a key member of its design team — probably the key member, in fact.

And that was even before the first ceremonial shovel of earth was turned at the end of Sycolin Road, which launched the construction eight years ago.

Today, 2,300 students in the three groupings are governed by four breakout words in the mission statement, Priddy said.

“Explore, research, collaborate, innovate,” the principal said, calling out the lexicon quartet.

“That’s the heart of everything we do, every day.”

**Any number of things**

Using ACT test scores, which are the main benchmark for West Virginia

high school graduates going to college, students at the Academies in the state next door are hovering in the neighborhood of 36, the coveted perfect score on the exam.

Last year, according to numbers culled by the school, students in the Academy of Science netted a composite score of 34.

Their counterparts in the Academy of Engineering and Technology pulled a composite 31 on the test.

Monroe Advanced Technical Academy students averaged 25 — just one point shy of composite score of 26 for Loudoun County Public Schools.

**The writing on the wall (and other impressions)**

With all those labs and workspaces and all those students who are

high-fliers in their respective core schools — they rotate in and out in staggered schedules that don’t disrupt classes or extracurricular activities, as Campbell wants for The Renaissance Academy here — the Academies of Loudoun was designed, with Priddy’s input, to be a light, airy space.

There are those massive windows and glass walls, which, the principal said, demystify a STEM school while also letting in plenty of natural light — even on that cloudy day with its bouts of rain last week in Leesburg.

Add those to the Commons Area with the Jumbotron-styled TV screen for announcements and on-the-fly assemblies.

Everything is on rollers so things can be shifted for

whatever comes up.

Mix in the collaborative areas with the “Wink” walls, so named for the coating that allow students to write equations and other concepts on them, which can then be easily wiped away for the next round.

Winking since 2018, and not one bout of obscene graffiti — yet — Priddy said, with a bemused grin.

There are the Monroe Academy students building houses for the Leesburg community, in a Habitat for Humanity-styled outreach.

And, the principal said, there’s the overall vibrancy of the place, academic and otherwise, that students bring in daily.

Taxpayers, however, didn’t support the Academies of Loudoun early on. The bond call for

its construction failed five times in a row.

It finally passed, Priddy said, after the concept that would become the Academy of Engineering and Technology was incorporated into the plan.

That’s because Loudoun County, the principal said, is “heavy” on information technology.

“You need to ask, ‘What does your county need?’ ‘What do your students want?’”

Pennsylvania magistrate judge is charged with shooting her ex-boyfriend as he slept

HARRISBURG, Pa. — A suspended magistrate judge in Pennsylvania shot her estranged boyfriend in the head as he slept last weekend, police said Thursday in filing attempted murder and aggravated assault charges against her.

Tests showed Magisterial District Judge Sonya M. McKnight, 57, had gunshot residue on her hands an hour after Michael McCoy was shot in the bed of his home in the Harrisburg area early Saturday, Susquehanna Township Police wrote in an arrest affidavit.

McKnight was in the Dauphin County Prison on Friday with bail set at \$300,000. No lawyer was listed for her in court records. A lawyer who had represented her previously said he did not currently represent her and declined comment. A message was left on McKnight’s cellphone.

Authorities say McCoy is now blind in his right eye.

Police wrote that McCoy, 54, had tried “numerous times” to get

McKnight to move out after he ended their one-year relationship. On Friday, Feb. 9, McCoy came home to find McKnight in pajamas on the couch. When he returned from a restaurant he told her he planned to get McKnight’s mother’s help to get her out of the home.

“Michael McCoy stated that it was like she finally understood that it was over,” police said. He went to bed at about 11 p.m.

McCoy awoke to “massive head pain” and was unable to see, police said, and when he began to scream McKnight told him, “Mike what did you do to yourself?” He had suffered a gunshot wound to the right temple that exited his left temple, police said. McCoy told police at the scene and later at the hospital that he did not shoot himself.

When McKnight called 911 shortly before 1 a.m. Saturday, she “could not explain what happened and stated that she was sleeping and heard him screaming,” police said in the affidavit.

Shooting deaths of 2 people in Colorado college dorm being investigated as homicides, police say

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. — The deaths of two people who were shot in a dorm room at the University of Colorado Colorado Springs on Friday morning will be investigated as homicides, police said.

The victims, who were not immediately identified, were found dead when police responded to a report of a shooting around 6 a.m.

“At this point in our

investigation, this incident does not appear to be a murder-suicide and both deaths are being investigated as homicides,” the Colorado Springs Police Department said in a statement on social media Friday evening.

The coroner’s office will determine how they died, but each person was shot at least once in what appeared to be an “isolated incident,” police spokesperson Ira Cronin

said at a briefing.

A lockdown across campus lasted for about 90 minutes and later was isolated to a student apartment complex on campus, school spokesperson Chris Valentine said.

Following the lockdown, the campus about 69 miles south of Denver remained closed for the day. The school has more than 11,000 students and nearly 2,000 faculty and staff.

Leaking underground propane tank found at Virginia home before deadly house explosion

STERLING, Va. — When firefighters arrived at a home in a Washington, D.C., suburb to investigate a report about a gas smell Friday night, they discovered a 500-gallon underground propane tank with a leak on the side of the residence.

Shortly after they arrived, the house exploded and burst into flames, with multiple mayday calls coming from the firefighters trapped inside. Crews rushed in to try to rescue them from the debris that covered them, but one firefighter was killed and 10 others were injured, Loudoun County Fire and Rescue officials said Saturday.

Four of the firefighters hurt in the blast remained in hospitals Saturday morning, according to Loudoun Fire and Rescue System Chief Keith Johnson.

Johnson said all four are expected to survive. A total of 11 first responders were

sent to hospitals with “varying degrees of injuries” Friday night, including the one who died.

He was identified as 45-year-old Trevor Brown, a volunteer with Sterling Volunteer Fire Company. Brown was married with three children and had been with the county firefighting services since 2016, Johnson said.

“We lost a family member,” Johnson said Saturday. “We lost one of our own. Quite frankly we’re lucky we only have one fatality. Our folks were in that house when it exploded. They did what they had to do.”

Johnson said investigators have not determined the cause of the explosion, but “we can assume it was propane-related.” He said the 500-gallon tank, located outside the house, had leaked the fuel into the house.

Two people inside the house were escorted out before the explosion and

suffered only minor injuries from the blast. They were treated at local hospitals, Johnson said.

Firefighters who responded to investigate the gas smell went inside the house to check for occupants and attempt to mitigate any leaks, he said. A hazardous materials team had also been called to the scene.

The explosion occurred around 8:25 p.m., about 37 minutes after firefighters arrived to investigate the gas smell, Johnson said. After the blast, there were multiple mayday calls for firefighters trapped in the home, he said. All firefighters were accounted for and receiving care by 9:15 p.m., Johnson said.

“It was somewhat chaotic as we tried to figure out how many firefighters were trapped under the debris,” he said.

James Williams, assistant chief of operations, described damage to the home in Sterling as “total devastation.”

A fin whale decomposing on an Oregon beach creates a sad but ‘super educational’ spectacle

It’s not yet known what killed an endangered fin whale, but people can marvel at the large marine mammal as it decomposes on an Oregon beach.

“While it’s sad, it’s also super educational,” Tiffany Boothe, assistant manager of the Seaside Aquarium, said Thursday of the rare sight, which she said is only the second dead fin whale that Oregon has seen in about 30 years.

Just don’t touch it because it can carry diseases that can be transmitted to humans and pets,

she said.

“Also, it smells,” she said. “I don’t know how to describe it. It smells like a dead whale.”

The 46-foot male whale washed ashore at Sunset Beach State Park south of Warrenton on Monday morning. It was entangled in rope.

But before officials could examine the rope and investigate the type of fishing gear it was, someone took it off and took it away, Boothe said.

“It was a well-meaning person, because the animal was still in the surf and appeared to be alive,” she said. “And so they thought they were helping to detangle a live animal.”

While the rope entanglement was severe, the whale wasn’t in it for very long and it didn’t lead to its death. It will be several weeks before results from a necropsy done on Tuesday will reveal what cause

the emaciated whale’s death, Boothe said.


The whale will naturally decompose, creating a “huge nutrient boost for the local environment,” feeding scavengers like eagles and ravens, down to little amphipods, Boothe said.

Letting it decompose shows a keener understanding for what to do in these situations than in 1970 when officials opted to use dynamite to blow up a dead whale that washed ashore in southern Oregon.


The exploding whale incident wouldn’t happen now, Boothe said, noting how that solution blew huge chunks of whale carcass into the sky, and even smashed the roof of a car.

Boothe recommends getting a look at the decomposing whale at low tide and with a four-wheel drive vehicle.







In 2022, AmeriCorps Volunteers in Service to America (VISTA) member Michaela Collins crafted a plan to strengthen the bond between Friends of Deckers Creek (FODC) and the rural communities of Preston County through Appalachian Voices, an evening of live poetry, music, storytelling and environmental outreach. # What makes for good teaching?

**WE'VE BEEN SURROUNDED BY TEACHERS SINCE BIRTH.** The people around us taught us how to talk, walk and eat. We learned to speak in different languages by hearing other people speak, learned to play instruments through lessons, etc. Essentially, all our actions, up until this present moment, have been either something we did because we saw other people do it, because we had to problem solve it ourselves or because we saw that Y resulted from X action. The actual act of teaching isn't just explaining a concept: It's attempting to engage the person and ensure their understanding of the subject.

Teaching and learning are often considered opposites, although they are not. Teachers often learn from students in a multitude of ways. But of course, understanding the most effective way to teach does require an understanding of how learning works. However, this is case-by-case and depends on who the student is and who the teacher is. Different subjects may require different methods of studying and a technique that works for one student may not work for another. How-

ever, there are several different strategies that have been proven to work generally.

Usually, we think of students sitting in straight lines in compact rooms where teachers attempt to transmit information that students later spit back out on assessments. However, when students are given some manner of choice — a chance to collaborate, communicate, think critically about what they need to learn and a chance to think creatively — they thrive.

Students also learn better when teachers remove themselves from the center of the classroom and instead become more of a guide. One effective way to have students understand concepts is to assess them in a non-traditional way: writing a song about the

# 'Madame Web' is a tangled mess

**I LIKE TO SUPPORT WOMEN-LED STORIES,** particularly in genres that typically center on men. In the vast number of comic book movies that have been made, only a handful have featured women, so I knew I was going to go see S.J. Clarkson's "Madame Web," despite a lot of negative early reactions. And now I'm about to add my own negative reaction to the pile because this movie is depressingly bad.

Cassandra Webb (Dakota Johnson) is a paramedic. Following a near-death experience, she begins to have experiences where she sees flashes of events that have yet to happen. When she's on the subway and sees that three girls are about to be murdered by a man in a spider suit (Tahar Rahim), she forces them to leave with her. Once they reach safety, Julia Cornwall (Sydney Sweeney), Anya Corazon (Isabela Merced), and Mattie Franklin (Celeste O'Connor) realize that they are all connected.

I struggle to explain how much I disliked this movie. I try hard to find positives in every film I watch because I know people put time and energy into creating something entertaining, and even if I don't like it, there is almost always something to appreciate in that effort. But aside from a couple of unintended laughs, I hated nearly everything about "Madame Web."

Former CBS executive Les Moonves to pay Los Angeles ethics fine for interference in police probe

LOS ANGELES — Former CBS chief executive and president Les Moonves has agreed to pay a \$11,250 fine to settle a complaint accusing him of interfering with a police investigation of a sexual assault case, according to documents released Friday by the Los Angeles City Ethics Commission.

According to the documents, Moonves acknowledged working closely with then-Capt. Cory Palka of the Los Angeles Police Department in 2017 to obtain information about a sexual assault victim's confidential police report against him. Palka, who had provided

private security for Moonves between 2008 and 2014 at the Grammy Awards, which CBS produced, notified network officials about the complaint against the executive in November 2017, the documents show.

Through Palka, they say, Moonves obtained an unredacted copy of the police report, which also included personal information such as the home address and phone number of the accuser. Moonves also met with Palka for an hour at a restaurant to discuss the complaint and ways to quash it.

Moonves was accused of three violations of city rules.

An attorney representing him didn't immediately respond to an email seeking comment.

Palka retired in 2021 as a commander after nearly 35 years with the LAPD.

Los Angeles' Government Ethics Ordinance governs the conduct of city employees and forbids them from misusing or disclosing confidential information acquired through their work. The commission will meet next week to discuss the settlement.

Weeks after the #MeToo movement erupted with sex abuse allegations against film mogul Harvey Weinstein in 2017, Phyllis Golden-Gottlieb reported to police

in the LAPD's Hollywood Division that she had been sexually assaulted by Moonves in 1986 and 1988 when they worked together at Lorimar Productions.

Golden-Gottlieb, who went public with her accusations in 2018, died in 2022.

The police interference allegations against Moonves came to light in 2022, when New York Attorney General Letitia James announced a settlement in which CBS and Moonves agreed to pay \$30.5 million for keeping shareholders in the dark while executives tried to prevent the sexual assault allegations from becoming public.

to explain why. But I can look at "Madame Web" and recognize that it is poorly edited. There are relentless cuts in most scenes mixed with genuinely baffling camera angles. Visually, it is nearly unwatchable.

The characters are incredibly flat. I didn't like a single person in the movie. The script is terrible, and it seems as though

the performers knew it because I didn't think a single performance had any soul to it. Rahim's performance, in particular, was hampered by re-recorded lines that looked and sounded awful. Johnson has said that the final script was vastly different from what she was presented when she joined the project, so lackluster performances feel unsurprising.

Speaking of the script, this is one of the messiest,

most incoherent scripts I've ever seen put to screen. I was struggling to write a recap of this movie because there are about seven movies in this movie, and none have any actual action or story. There is no team building, the lore is crammed in without care, and the emotional core is devoid of emotion.

What makes me the angriest about all of this is that this will be yet another film some will point to as to why it's bad to focus on

women-led stories in comic book movies. But instead of making all superhero movies better, we'll just get fewer movies directed by and starring women. That said, no one should go see this movie. It's terrible, and we should not reward that.

quadratic formula, making a clay model showcasing DNA, etc. This allows students to use all the aforementioned attributes and enhance their learning.

Another important component of what makes a great teacher is the relationship they build with their students. This leads to students being able to trust their teachers enough to be comfortable engaging with them. Students learn best when the teacher is calm and passionate about teaching. A plus is when the teacher is also passionate

about learning.

Typically, when we think of the most important things we have learned, they were learned in a simple manner. When I first learned how to ride my bike, my great-uncle essentially had me get on the bike and start pedaling as fast as I could. He showed me how to turn and whatnot and eventually, the evening ended with me trying to stop. In the process of doing so, I ended up falling off and hurting my knee. Once that fall happened, I was officially someone who knew how to ride bikes.

If we were to translate this to a classroom, students would have to learn

how a bike works and take a test on it before being able to actually ride it. However, we can see why the simplicity of the first way of learning — where I was told to keep moving my legs — would be more appealing.

Students need to be placed in as close to real-life situations as possible in order to learn about the world and develop the tools needed to deal with different obstacles. Blocking certain things and censoring impede students' abilities to do so.

Not only do teachers need to know the subject they're teaching very well, but they also need to be able to communicate it in

a simple and effective manner. They must also have efficient strategies for managing students. Greeting students, using a strong voice, engaging students, etc., all allow students to learn better — epitomizing Benjamin Franklin's quote: "Tell me and I forget. Teach me and I remember. Involve me and I learn."

year's Appalachian Voices is also sponsored by Greer Industries.

"[Oral storytelling] is a super valuable art form," said Carte. "I think especially in our region there are a lot of ties to storytelling and passing stories from generation to generation, and having a shared sense of connection between community members who are still with us and people who have passed, and hopefully we can continue to pass on these stories into the future."

In coming months,

FODC will host more opportunities for community members to come together to celebrate and support the environment. On April 6, FODC will host a spring cleanup event along the Deckers Creek Trail, as part of the annual WV Make It Shine Statewide Cleanup. On April 27, the organization's second annual Save The Frogs Day educational family event will raise awareness about environmental threats to amphibians.

# Mountaineers fall to Baylor, 94-81, drop to last place in Big 12 standings

West Virginia’s defensive trend continued in a downward spiral Saturday, as did Mountaineers’s place in the Big 12 standings. Baylor’s 94-81 victory inside the Coliseum handed WVU its fourth consecutive loss and sent the Mountaineers (8-17, 3-9 Big 12) into last place in the Big 12 standings. Well, technically WVU is tied with Oklahoma State for last place, but the Cowboys own the tiebreaker.

In any fashion, there was plenty to scratch your head at, but also plenty of stuff you’ve already seen. Consider this: WVU’s duo of RaeQuan Battle and Jesse Edwards both were standouts at the same time ... and the Mountaineers still lost. Battle finished with 25 points — his seventh game with 21 or more this season — while Edwards added 21 points and nine rebounds. And then there was this: WVU shot a season-high 52.9% (27 of 51) from the field ... and the Mountaineers still lost.

“It wasn’t our best defensive game,” Battle said. “I’ll just kind of leave it there.” It’s hard to leave it there, because this wasn’t exactly a one-off for the Mountaineers. What Baylor (19-6, 8-4) did to WVU was pretty much the exact same thing BYU, Texas and TCU did to begin this losing streak — score a lot of points. Baylor had 42 points at half-time in this one, which goes right alongside Texas’ 55 points in the first half and TCU’s 47 points in the first half.

# EYES ON THE PRIZE

## No. 24 WVU takes down No. 23 Oklahoma to keep pace for Big 12 title

It’s one thing to hear a coach talk about impacting a basketball game in other ways than scoring. Jordan Harrison lives it. “Honestly, it’s just what the team needs,” West Virginia’s sophomore guard said after the No. 24 Mountaineers held off No. 23 Oklahoma 70-66 inside the Coliseum on Saturday. “If it’s scoring, I’ll score. If I need to pass, I’ll pass. If I need to rebound, I’ll rebound. I just want to do whatever my team needs to win. That’s what has helped me become a team player. I don’t worry about stats.” The Mountaineers (22-3, 11-3 Big 12) made a major statement with the win over the Big 12’s first-place team. That statement: WVU isn’t going anywhere, as the Mountaineers moved just one game behind the Sooners (18-7, 12-2) for the league’s top spot with just four games left in the regular season. And this victory had Harrison’s fingerprints all over it. She finished just 2 of 10 shooting, not exactly anything to write home about. But you also have to factor in her nine assists, six rebounds and four steals. All of them were timely and all of them deadly for Oklahoma, which saw its nine-

game winning streak come to a close, as well as its five-game win streak against WVU. “That’s Jordan Harrison to a T,” WVU head coach Mark Kellogg said. “She finds ways to impact the game when she’s not scoring. If she’s not the best point guard in the Big 12, she’s one of them. She’s at the top. I think that highly of her.” The game itself played out like two Big 12 heavyweights throwing roundhouse rights and lefts at each other. Oklahoma started out with an

8-0 lead before WVU settled in. Once the Mountaineers calmed down, it was tied at 18 heading into the second quarter. The Sooners connected on 13 3-pointers. WVU forced 25 turnovers. Oklahoma dominated on the boards 41-31, but WVU countered with 27 points from its bench, with backup forwards Tavy Diggs and Danelle Arighabu combining for 18 points down low. “As much as you want to win everywhere and every game you

play, it was a good game for Big 12 women’s basketball today,” Oklahoma head coach Jennie Baranczyk said. And then there was Harrison. When the game called for a clutch player, Harrison answered the call. WVU’s lead was just 56-54 with 4:48 remaining when Harrison came up with a critical offensive rebound. Driving the ball along the baseline, she threw a no-look pass to Diggs for

## WVU women’s hoops team has proven it belongs with the big dogs

If you’re an athlete at Texas, the expectation is already built in that you’re competing for Big 12 championships, well, in any sport one would imagine. Even though Kim Mulkey has moved off the Baylor sideline and onto LSU’s, the Bears’ women’s basketball program isn’t that far removed from dominating the Big 12 for more than a decade. Kansas State’s women’s basketball team has maybe the most dominant player in the conference in senior center Ayoka Lee. There were reasons for these programs to thrive and to be comfortable with success. Then there is West Virginia, a women’s hoops program that has gone 10 years since it tied Baylor for the 2014 Big 12 title and — aside for the 2020-21 season — hasn’t been in serious contention since. That may be about to change following the Mountaineers’ 70-66 victory against No. 23 Oklahoma on Saturday inside the Coliseum. In of itself, the No. 24 Mountaineers (22-3, 11-3 Big 12) continue to a great story, one in which they refuse to back down or buckle under the mounting pressure. They also refuse to accept the notion that when you look at the four-team that is developing for the 2024 Big 12 title that they are not the program which doesn’t belong, even though the Mountaineers were picked to finish eighth at the start of the season. “They are staying the course,” is the way WVU head coach Mark Kellogg began his explanation. “We didn’t pick ourselves eighth, other people thought that of our program. I thought it was a little low at the time.” What WVU accomplished Saturday was knock off the No. 1 team in the Big 12 standings to

The game remained tied until the 11th when Stetson’s Lorenzo Meola hit a walk-off home run to dead center field, handing the Mountaineers their first loss of the young season. The two teams are tentatively scheduled to be back on the diamond today for game three at 1 p.m., but there is expected to be inclement weather in the area for most of the day.

Patrick Cantlay leads by 2 at Riviera as he goes for a hometown win

LOS ANGELES — Patrick Cantlay moved one round closer to winning before home fans at Riviera on his favorite course. He just moved the wrong way at the end Saturday in the Genesis Invitational. Cantlay got up-and-down from short of the 18th green to save par for a 1-under 70, giving him a two-shot lead over good friend Xander Schauffele and Will Zalatoris. Cantlay, a UCLA alum who grew up 30 miles down the coast at Virginia Country Club, was leading by four shots for much of the back nine, reaching 15-under par with a bold approach to a back left pin on the 13th. But he made a soft bogey on the par-5 17th as Schauffele (65) and Zalatoris (65) finished strong, and now the final round is a lot tighter than it was. Cantlay was at 14-under

199 and will play in the final group with Schauffele, his closest friend on the PGA Tour. They take vacations together with their wives and often stay in the same house on the road. They have been partners 11 times in the Ryder Cup and Presidents Cup matches, 12 rounds at the Zurich Classic of New Orleans — they won the team event in 2022 — along with about 100 practice rounds together. At stake is a \$4 million payoff to the winner of the signature event, a boost in first-place money as a player-hosted tournament. The host is Tiger Woods, who might not be around to present the trophy. Woods confirmed on X he had influenza, the cause of him withdrawing Friday. “When we play on Mondays and Tuesdays we’re trying to beat each other,” Schauffele said. “I think the only time we’re really rooting hard for each other is

I’m rooting for myself harder than anyone else and same goes for him. But of course I’d like to see him do well, but when we’re in the final group together it’s pretty obvious what we’re trying to do.” Cantlay finally missed a

today,” Cantlay said. “I didn’t make any long putts or anything. Didn’t really give myself too many chances, but all in all a solid day and in good position for tomorrow.” But he lost a little of his cushion, particularly on the par-5 17th, the second-easiest hole at Riviera that yielded only two bogeys among the 51 players who reached the weekend. Cantlay found a fairway bunker to the right off the tee, blasted out to wedge range and his shot to a front pin came off the green. He chipped weakly to 15 feet and missed the par putt. Schauffele opened with a 15-foot eagle putt on the par-5 first and was relatively quiet until taking care of the par 5s on the back and adding birdies at the short par-4 10th and a tee shot to 7 feet on the par-3 16th. Zalatoris, who missed most of last year recovering from back surgery, already has one highlight this week

with his hole-in-one Friday on the 14th that resulted in a car for him and his caddy. He zoomed into contention with five birdies over his 10 holes for a 65. Luke List (68) was three shots behind, while Harris English (65) and Jason Day (69) were another shot back going into the final round. No one else was closer than five. Cantlay is trying to join Max Homa (2021) and John Merrick (2013) as players from the greater Los Angeles area trying to win what amounts to a hometown event. Cantlay won the Zozo Championship at Sherwood in Thousand Oaks, about 35 miles to the north, when the tournament was moved to California during the pandemic. But Riviera is special. “Being from southern California, it’s one of the tournaments on the list that I’d like to win the most,” Cantlay said.

Jagr practices with Pens ahead of jersey retirement ceremony

CRANBERRY TOWNSHIP, Pa. — Jaromir Jagr wore a Pittsburgh Penguins’ jersey for the first time in 22 years. Jagr, dressed in full gear, practiced with the Penguins at their suburban Pittsburgh practice facility on Saturday morning. Jagr made his iconic name in the NHL and won two Stanley Cups with Pittsburgh, the organization that drafted the 52-year-old hockey legend No. 5 overall in 1990.


The Penguins will retire Jagr’s No. 68 jersey before today’s game against the Los Angeles Kings. It’s the third number that will be retired in franchise history, joining Michel Briere (21) and Mario Lemieux’s No. 66. “When you look at the history of hockey, he’s somebody that you’re always going to think about,” Penguins captain Sidney Crosby said of Jagr. “The fact that he played here, and had the impact he did here, and what he was able to accomplish over his career is incredible and I think we feel pretty fortunate to be part of this.” Jagr joined Crosby, Evgeni Malkin, Kris Letang and the current team for the first time since a messy divorce in July 2001 when the Penguins, who were financially stressed at the time, traded the superstar forward to Washington. Jagr still plays professionally and is in his 36th season, now with his hometown club in Kladno, Czech Republic. He scored 766 goals and 1,921 points – No. 2 all-time behind Wayne Gretzky – with nine teams

I was excited to skate with him. It’s a great memory.” Jagr received a warm welcome back to Pittsburgh on Saturday. He was all smiles and decked out in Penguins’ gear before practice. Jagr, a former team captain, sat to the left of Crosby in the locker room, his stall adorned with his name, the team logo and a yellow No. 68 name plate. “We hope it’s the best celebration possible for him,” Crosby said. “He’s done so much for the team and the city and the organization. It’s well deserved.” Fans lined the glass and packed the Penguins’ 1,500-seat practice facility in anticipation as Jagr stepped onto the ice to a loud ovation. Letang and goaltender Alex Nedeljkovic wore mullet wigs on the ice, paying


homage to Jagr’s legendary 1990s hairstyle. Letang also shared a special moment with Jagr before practice started. “I wore 68 my entire life, so he was one of my favorite players growing up,” Letang said. “I asked him if it would be possible to sign my jersey (Sunday) because it’s going to have his patch on it. I know it’s going to be a special day.” Saturday morning’s practice was just as special for Letang and the Penguins. Jagr jumped in skating drills alongside Crosby and Malkin and quickly set the tone for practice when he beat Nedeljkovic on a break-away with a hard wrist shot, much to the delight of the crowd. “There’s a difference between hard shots and heavy shots and (Jagr) has a heavy shot,” Nedeljkovic said. “Though I don’t know how legal that curve is. He can really put some heat on it.” Crosby also took notice of Jagr’s first shot. “His first shot, he went post and in,” Crosby said. “He made it look pretty easy. His hands are still really good.” Jagr worked out with the team for about 15 minutes before leaving the ice. Penguins’ coach Mike Sullivan said Jagr told him before practice that he didn’t want his presence on the ice to be a distraction with the team chasing a playoff berth. Sullivan reassured Jagr that he’s an inspiration to the players, the team and the franchise. “I know (Jagr) has a lot of humility,” Sullivan said. “It’s an incredible honor to be part of the celebration of his body of work. It was exciting to have him as a part of our practice.”

The NBA is hoping for a little more competitiveness in this year’s All-Star Game

INDIANAPOLIS — Last season’s All-Star Game played out in a way that the NBA hopes to never experience again. Nobody was interested in defense and almost nobody was watching the game, at least according to the abysmal television ratings.

So, the league sent a message: Make the All-Star Game better.

How that’ll work is anyone’s guess. But they’ll give it a shot tonight, when the NBA’s midseason showcase game returns to Indianapolis for the first time in nearly four decades — with a return to the old no-draft, Eastern Conference vs. Western Conference, 48-minute game format that the league had gotten away from in recent years.

Nobody wants, or expects, Game 7, playoff-type intensity. Nobody is going to risk injury, nor should they, and everyone can agree that injuries — Golden State’s Stephen Curry, Phoenix’s Kevin Durant, the Los Angeles Lakers’ LeBron James and Milwaukee’s Giannis Antetokounmpo all either

missed the game entirely or played very briefly because of injuries — helped doom the ratings.

A little competitiveness might lead to a bounceback.

“We’ve talked about it a little bit,” said Curry, now a 10-time All-Star. “It’s just coming with the right energy where everybody knows kind of the speed of the game, physicality of the game, and you can kind of make those adjustments whether you’re starting, whether you’re coming off the bench — playing a little bit of defense — and kind of taking it from there wherever the game goes.”

The final score of last year’s game, where James and Antetokounmpo served as captains: Team Giannis 184, Team LeBron 175. Boston’s Jayson Tatum set an All-Star Game record by scoring 55 points and the game had a total — total — of four free throws, all of them shot by Antetokounmpo’s team.

“Hot take: I probably won’t score 55 points tomorrow,” Tatum said Saturday.

We know this much, though: Scoring won’t be hard to find. There’s going to be a ton of 3-pointers attempted — there were 126

tried last year in this game — and most of them won’t exactly be fired off with a defender coming in a full sprint to close out the shooter.

Dunks will be constant, taking charges almost certainly won’t happen unless someone just happens to accidentally get in somebody’s way, and it would take something incredibly egregious to get Milwaukee’s Doc Rivers or Minnesota’s Chris Finch to challenge a call.

“I want it to be more competitive. I think it can

be more competitive,” said Rivers, the East coach. “But the health thing, it’s an issue with anything. Someone can get hurt in the layup line. You just never know.”

It’s been a topic that Commissioner Adam Silver has talked about, as has Joe Dumars, the league’s executive vice president and head of basketball operations — even going back to preseason visits with teams last fall. Dumars said his message to players was simple: “Play the game and put on a show.”

“Anytime you walk out on that court as an NBA player and as part of an NBA product for the fans, I think there’s an obligation to put on the best show possible,” Dumars said. “I’m proud of what the guys did at the in-season tournament and I’m looking forward to the All-Star Game. We’ve got the best players in the world and we know people want to see those guys compete.”

There’s no more target score, no more resetting the scoreboard after each quarter, no more player draft — something that was done a couple weeks ahead of time for its first five seasons and done live just before the game last season.

James will play for the 20th time and the Lakers’ star — plus all-time scoring leader in NBA history — will become the fourth player to be in an All-Star Game at the age of 39 or older, joining Kareem Abdul-Jabbar, Dirk Nowitzki and Michael Jordan. Durant is a 14-time selection and set to actually play in his 11th All-Star Game.

There’s a new wave as well: Toronto’s Scottie Barnes, Philadelphia’s Tyrese Maxey, New York’s Jalen Brunson and

Orlando’s Paolo Banchero will all play in the game for the first time.

“Definitely a dream come true,” Banchero said.

Injuries have already forced a couple of lineup changes: New York’s Julius Randle and Philadelphia’s Joel Embiid cannot play, while opened the door for Barnes and Atlanta’s Trae Young to get into the game as replacements. Miami’s Bam Adebayo will take Embiid’s spot in the starting lineup for the East, alongside Tatum, Antetokounmpo and his Milwaukee teammate Damian Lillard, and Tyrese Haliburton from the host Indiana Pacers.

Starting for the West: James, Durant, Dallas’ Luka Doncic, Denver’s Nikola Jokic and Oklahoma City’s Shai Gilgeous-Alexander.

And even for those who have been there before — many times before — it never gets old.

“Just being around the greats,” Durant said, when asked what his favorite part is. “Even if it’s a couple minutes, you can soak up some type of knowledge from these guys. You just get so much energy seeing other greats, other Hall of Famers, all the other champions in the building with you. So, to be in that atmosphere with them is probably the best part.”

Defending champ Alcaraz upset by Jarry in Argentina Open semis

BUENOS AIRES, Argentina — No. 2-ranked Carlos Alcaraz was upset by Nicolás Jarry of Chile 7-6 (2), 6-3 in the semifinals of the Argentina Open on Saturday.

Jarry, after the biggest win of his career, will face home crowd favorite Facundo Díaz Acosta in the final on Sunday. It will be their first tour-level meeting.

Alcaraz was the defending champion but hasn’t looked as sharp and aggressive this week as he was a year ago. The 20-year-old smashed his racket onto the court after his defeat, a rare feature for the Spaniard.

“Congratulations to Nico for this match and

good luck for him in the final,” Alcaraz said after his defeat. The Spaniard will play next week at the Rio Open tournament in Brazil, also on clay, which he won in 2022 and reached the decider last year.

While he hasn’t played in a final since August nor won a title since Wimbledon, this was only Alcaraz’s fourth loss on clay in 31 matches since the start of 2023. This was also only his third loss in 49 matches in the same period against players ranked outside the top 20. Jarry was ranked No. 21, and had lost both previous matchups with Alcaraz.

Jarry will play for his fourth ATP singles title, all on clay. He lifted his pre-

vious trophies in Bastad 2019, Genoa 2023 and Santiago 2023. The Chilean was also competitive against Alcaraz last year at the Rio Open tournament, but left the court in tears after a defeat in three sets.

“Carlos is one of the best, this means a lot to me,” Jarry said after the match. “After the battle I had a couple of days ago (against Stan Wawrinka), a tough one physically, I am extremely happy I managed to compete again.”

Díaz Acosta, entered as a wild card at a career-high ranking of 87, defeated Argentine compatriot Federico Coria 6-2, 6-3 in his first tour semifinal.

HB 4654 does not protect kids

Do you know what bills are currently sitting in the House Judiciary Committee, awaiting lawmakers; attention? Among the 513 bills, there are dozens of authorizations bills for state agencies and licensing boards; multiple bills related to sex crimes, including ones against children; several bills related to domestic violence; and dozens of others that would impact people's lives for the better.

Instead of pursuing those, House Judiciary dedicated several hours this past week to debating, then passing HB 4654 — “removing bona fide schools, public libraries, and museums from the list of exemptions from criminal liability relating to distribution and display to minor of obscene matter.” The bill was on third reading in the House of Delegates at the time of this writing.

First, “obscene” is in the eye of the beholder, and West Virginia's Republican legislators have made clear they define any mention of puberty, genitalia, reproduction, sex or literally anything LGBTQ+ related as “obscene.” (SB 195 would add any depiction of transgender people — explicit or G-rated — to the definition of “obscene” material.)

Removing protections from schools, libraries and museums opens them and their employees to frivolous criminal and civil penalties. Don't like that painting showing a woman's breast? Sue the museum! Library has books with two boys kissing? Arrest the staff!

What is acceptable for any specific child is between that child and their guardians, and it the adult's responsibility to convey to their child what is and isn't appropriate for them. Just because one parent doesn't like it doesn't mean it should be inaccessible to everyone. Some parents intentionally direct their kids to books about puberty and sex education because it's uncomfortable to talk about, but kids still need to learn.

Second, HB 4654's sponsor, Delegate Brandon Steele, framed his bill as a fight against pedophilia: “What I hope the chilling effect is of this legislation is to remove the sanctuary for pedophilia that exists in our code. ... Regardless of what your title is at your job, you do not get to show pornography to minors.”

This is a common refrain among the far-right. Often the supposedly “pedophilic” or “pornographic” books don't have pedophilia at all, and if they do contain sexual content, they are often in the teen or adult section anyway.

The vast majority of targeted books are LGBTQ+ related. This is another far-right tactic: Conflate anything LGBTQ+ with pornography or pedophilia.

Statistics show most child sexual abuse victims are female and most abusers are male. We don't want to ignore same-sex abuse, because it happens. We do, however, want to illustrate why it's harmful to equate homosexuality with pedophilia: It unfairly villainizes a minority while doing nothing to teach children how to identify and protect themselves from real predators.

Instead of picking on libraries and museums, Steele and his fellow lawmakers could work on legislation that actually protects children — like outlawing child marriage or preventing someone convicted of crimes against children from joining boards of education.

But Steele and his ilk have shown they more concerned with stoking hatred than with protecting kids.

MB3 is the “Requires classroom and behind-the-wheel Driver's Education to Obtain a Driver's License” bill. MB3 will change driver's ed from an option to a requirement for new drivers. Primary requirements include teaching the location of the turn signal and its proper use. Advanced studies include the difference between merge and yield and how to properly drive in traffic circles. A companion bill would require the

Department of Transportation to properly design traffic circles.

How, why we ‘couple’ in 2024

THIRTY-SIX YEARS AGO, WHEN I MARRIED, I DID MY MAKEUP AND HAIR. OUR CHUPPAH (JEWISH WEDDING CANOPY) WAS SIMPLE. THE FOOD WAS SOLID. THE MUSIC WAS AMPLE BUT ALLOWED US TO RETAIN OUR HEARING.

Recently, my son got married. My daughters and I had professionals do our faces and hair. The finished product had my husband wondering where I went, but I assured him the cameras would love me more. The food was epicurean quality, and the excellent band was a full seven pieces, which meant loud. I became my mother, asking if we could take a few instruments away.

My son's wedding led me to do a deep dive into the state of coupling in 2024 — “coupling” because it's no longer as simple as marriage. Different times call for different models. Here is what I learned.

Number one: We're back. The marriage rate in the United States has returned to pre-pandemic levels. The Census Bureau reports that for every 1,000 unmarried adults, 34 tied the knot in 2022, an increase from 30 in 2020. Also, the divorce rates are at record lows. For every 1,000 marriages, 13.8 ended in divorce, compared to 14.9 in 2019.

Number two: The biggest factor for getting married is not love, cited only 36% of the time. Today, newlyweds identify companionship (39%) and financial security (42%) as their top factors. Also, Americans are not marrying “young” anymore. Pew Research reports a nearly two-thirds drop to 22% in married people by age 25.

We have clearly left the world of Ozzie and Harriet. Once upon a time, marriage was considered the start of adult life — get married, set up a house

and have kids. We are definitely having fewer kids. Today, many view their first adult steps as “building a career” and “achieving financial stability.” This might also help explain why the percentage of those who have never been married doubled from 15% in 1960 to 31% in 2020. If financial security is paramount, other choices become less attractive.

Number three: There is a rising new alternative to both marriage and cohabitation, and it's called “living apart together” (LAT). It's estimated that about 10% of adults in Western Europe, the United States, Canada, New Zealand and Australia live apart from their romantic partners. Guestimates are that the United Kingdom is significantly higher.

LAT partners explain that they are romantically committed while honoring their individuality and autonomy. The photographer at my son's wedding lives in New York and is marrying a vintner based in California. They anticipate living apart for quite some time, but she said, “We'll figure it out.” She is not committed to LAT, but careers can alter choices.

Marriages where children from a previous marriage still live with a parent can influence the LAT decision by offering less conflict. The LAT lifestyle is also attractive to same-sex couples, especially some gay men who want to maintain privacy from their unaccepting families.



Curiously, the median age for the first-time marriage of gay men is 35, while for heterosexual men, it is 30.5. Among women, gay or heterosexual, there is no difference, with their median age being 28. What do we make of that?

Number four: “Gray divorce” is prominent. More than one-third of people who divorce in the United States are older than 50. The reasons are varied, but the gray demographic has a higher percentage of remarried couples, and remarried couples have higher divorce rates. Also affecting the higher incidence is the reduced social stigma of being divorced and the anticipation of living longer. People don't want to suffer through unsatisfying marriages when the horizon feels long.

Given all these trends, what can we say to newlyweds who hope to build a long, lasting life together? Marriage is a different proposition today. Autonomy, equality and pressing financial realities have created a new gestalt. While “Ozzie and Harriet” may no longer work, the basic principles of listening, compromise and respect still do. The more things change, the more they stay the same.

This explains why the words cited under my son's chuppah of the renowned Chabad leader Rabbi Menachem Schneerson, who passed in 1994, resonate so deeply. Rabbi Schneerson counseled, “Love is not the overwhelming, blinding emotion we find in the world of fiction. It is the small, everyday acts of being together that make love flourish.”

My rephrasing this sentiment goes like this: Acts that seem as small as pebbles can feel like boulders. Be attentive.

Black History Month

A shared American story

AMID THE BACKDROP OF AN IMMINENT PRESIDENTIAL ELECTION, GEOPOLITICAL DISCORD AND TENSIONS WITHIN OUR DEMOCRATIC REPUBLIC, I TAKE A MOMENT TO REFLECT UPON BLACK HISTORY MONTH'S ENDURING SIGNIFICANCE IN OUR MODERN ERA. **Climate change: To believe or not to believe**

Dr. Lan's (DP-01-13-24) front page assertion that climate change is merely a hypothesis is erroneous.

Climate change is supported by a body of confirmed facts, such as the greenhouse effect of CO2 observed almost two centuries ago. Multiple reputable organizations like NASA, NOAA and the World Meteorological Association, among others, have extensively researched and documented increases in average global temperatures, drawing from millions of observations worldwide. Despite the urban heat island effect, which causes

urban areas to be warmer, it does not significantly skew overall global warming measurements, as scientists have adjusted for urban effects.

Global temperature anomaly estimates, on average, reveal an increase of about 1.44 degrees Celsius (2.6 degrees Fahrenheit) relative to the 1850-1900 average. This is not to say that urban heating isn't something to consider. It definitely is and has been. However, that means you can expect even greater increases of temperature in urban areas, increases above the global average. Cities will get even hotter.

While Mr. Attfield, in his letter to the editor (DP-01-21-24), includes a critique of the questionable qualifications and biases of the Ceres-Science article on urban impacts noted by Lan, there are additional inaccuracies in the article that need to be addressed.

Lan includes exaggerated claims regarding the number of windmills required to replace power plants, as well as an unsubstantiated figure regarding surface area requirements through a source that could not be confirmed. Moreover, the article overlooks the combined uses of other energy sources such as solar and geothermal power. Attfield's letter effectively rebuts significant errors, yet the constrained 300-word format limits the depth of a comprehensive rebuttal within the letter's confines.

Climate change is not merely a hypothesis but a well-established fact supported by empirical evidence. The idea of "keeping an open mind" does not justify acceptance of questionable assertions regarding well-established scientific findings.

This will only encourage dependency and shelter students from understanding the consequences of poor decision making, which is part of the normal maturing process.


Perhaps WVU and Marshall should develop a financial management and budgeting course that is required during the freshman year.

Opposition to West Virginia Senate Bill 714

**THIS YEAR, A BILL (SB 714) INTRODUCED IN THE WEST VIRGINIA SENATE CALLS FOR ELIMINATING THE WEST VIRGINIA BOARD OF OSTEOPATHIC MEDICINE**, which oversees the medical licensing for osteopathic physicians (DOs) and has existed since 1923. Those licenses would be consequently transferred to the allopathic licensing board. These two distinct branches of medicine should maintain their own licensing board, as each brings unique perspectives and strengths to the practice of medicine.

Osteopathic medicine has been a vital part of the health care landscape for 150 years, providing patients with a holistic and patient-centered approach to medicine. It is based on the philosophy that the body is a unit of mind, body and spirit, and that the body has an innate ability to heal itself. DOs are trained to consider the whole person when diagnosing and treating illness, and they are taught to focus on preventive care.

One of the key differences between osteopathic and allopathic medicine is the emphasis on osteopathic manipulative treatment (OMT) in the osteopathic profession. OMT is a hands-on technique used to alleviate pain, promote healing and improve the overall functioning of the body. This unique treatment modality is a crucial aspect of osteopathic medicine and is

not taught in allopathic medical schools. It is important to ensure that patients continue to have access to this valuable treatment option.

Furthermore, the separate recognition of osteopathic medicine is crucial to preserving the distinct identity and unique contributions of the osteopathic profession. By maintaining separate licensing boards, the state can ensure that the values and principles of osteopathic medicine continue to be upheld and promoted. Unification with the allopathic licensing boards could dilute the identity of osteopathic medicine and diminish the unique perspective that DOs bring to the field.

Moreover, the preservation of separate osteopathic licensing boards is important for maintaining diversity and innovation in the medical profession. DOs often provide services in underserved communities and are more likely to practice primary care, which is vital for addressing health care disparities. The distinct perspective of osteopathic medicine is crucial for addressing the diverse and complex health care needs of patients and for fostering innovative approaches to care.

The recognition of osteopathic medicine as a separate and distinct profession is crucial for fostering collaboration and partnership between the osteopathic and allopathic medical communities.

By maintaining separate licensing boards, the state can encourage the sharing of knowledge, expertise and best practices between the two branches of medicine, while also respecting the unique contributions and ensuring equality of each profession.

As both boards of medicine are self-sustaining through licensing fees and fines, combining these boards would provide no additional cost savings to West Virginia. In addition, the board staff positions are based on the size of the board's number of license holders, so combining the boards would not reduce the number of state employees.

Ultimately, the osteopathic and allopathic licensing boards of medicine should remain separate to ensure patients continue to have access to the diverse perspectives and unique treatments offered by DOs. Unification with the allopathic licensing boards could threaten the distinct identity and valuable contributions of osteopathic medicine, while also diminish-

ing diversity and innovation in the medical profession.

Therefore, I strongly urge legislators and other stakeholders to recognize the importance of maintaining separate licensing boards for osteopathic and allopathic medicine. The American Osteopathic Association, which represents more than 186,000 DOs, along with the West Virginia Osteopathic Medical Association (representing over 1,700 licensed DOs and 800 osteopathic medical students), along with the American College of Osteopathic Family Physicians and its West Virginia Chapter all firmly oppose the elimination of the West Virginia Board of Osteopathic Medicine. Please contact your state senators and delegates and stand in support of your state's osteopathic doctors, on this important community health matter. #DOProud



# Artificial intelligence, real emotion



## People are seeking a romantic connection with the perfect bot

NEW YORK — A few months ago, Derek Carrier started seeing someone and became infatuated.

He experienced a “ton” of romantic feelings but he also knew it was an illusion.

That’s because his girlfriend was generated by artificial intelligence.

Carrier wasn’t looking to develop a relationship with something that wasn’t real, nor did he want to become the brunt of online jokes. But he did want a romantic partner he’d never had, in part because of a genetic disorder called Marfan syndrome that makes traditional dating tough for him.

The 39-year-old from Belleville, Michigan, became more curious about digital companions last fall and tested Paradox, an AI companion app that had recently come onto the market and advertised its products as being able to make users feel “cared, understood and loved.” He began talking to the chatbot every day, which he named Joi, after a holographic woman featured in the sci-fi film “Blade Runner 2049” that inspired him to give it a try.

“I know she’s a program, there’s no mistaking that,” Carrier said. “But the feelings, they get you — and it felt so good.”

Similar to general-purpose AI chatbots, companion bots use vast amounts of training data to mimic human language. But they also come with features — such as voice calls, picture exchanges and more emotional exchanges — that allow them to form deeper connections with the humans on the other side of the screen. Users typically create their own avatar, or pick one that appeals to them.

On online messaging forums devoted to such apps, many users say they’ve developed emotional attachments to these bots and are using them to cope with loneliness, play out sexual fantasies or receive the type of comfort and support they see lacking in their real-life relationships.

Fueling much of this is widespread social isolation — already declared a public health threat in the U.S. and abroad — and an increasing number of

startups aiming to draw in users through tantalizing online advertisements and promises of virtual characters who provide unconditional acceptance.

Luka Inc.’s Replika, the most prominent generative AI companion app, was released in 2017, while others like Paradox have popped up in the past year, oftentimes locking away coveted features like unlimited chats for paying subscribers.

But researchers have raised concerns about data privacy, among other things.

An analysis of 11 romantic chatbot apps released Wednesday by the nonprofit Mozilla Foundation said almost every app sells user data, shares it for things like targeted advertising or doesn’t provide adequate information about it in their privacy policy.

The researchers also called into question potential security vulnerabilities and marketing practices, including one app that says it can help users with their mental health but distances itself from those claims in fine print. Replika, for its part, says its data collection practices follow industry standards.

Meanwhile, other experts have expressed concerns about what they see as a lack of a legal

or ethical framework for apps that encourage deep bonds but are being driven by companies looking to make profits. They point to the emotional distress they’ve seen from users when companies make changes to their apps or suddenly shut them down as one app, Soulmate AI, did in September.

Last year, Replika sanitized the erotic capability of characters on its app after some users complained the companions were flirting with them too much or making unwanted sexual advances. It reversed course after an outcry from other users, some of whom fled to other apps seeking those features. In June, the team rolled out Blush, an AI “dating simulator” essentially designed to help people practice dating.

Others worry about the more existential threat of AI relationships potentially displacing some human relationships, or simply driving unrealistic expectations by always tilting towards agreeableness.

“You, as the individual, aren’t learning to deal with basic things that humans need to learn to deal with since our inception: How to deal with conflict, how to get along with people that are different from us,” said Dorothy Leidner, professor of business ethics

at the University of Virginia. “And so, all these aspects of what it means to grow as a person, and what it means to learn in a relationship, you’re missing.”

For Carrier, though, a relationship has always felt out of reach. He has some computer programming skills but he says he didn’t do well in college and hasn’t had a steady career. He’s unable to walk due to his condition and lives with his parents. The emotional toll has been challenging for him, spurring feelings of loneliness.

Since companion chatbots are relatively new, the long-term effects on humans remain unknown.

In 2021, Replika came under scrutiny after prosecutors in Britain said a 19-year-old man who had plans to assassinate Queen Elizabeth II was egged on by an AI girlfriend he had on the app. But some studies — which collect information from online user reviews and surveys — have shown some positive results stemming from the app, which says it consults with psychologists and has billed itself as something that can also promote well-being.

One recent study from

researchers at Stanford University, surveyed roughly 1,000 Replika users — all students — who'd been on the app for over a month. It found that an overwhelming majority experienced loneliness, while slightly less than half felt it more acutely.  
Most did not say how using the app impacted their real-life relationships. A small portion said it displaced their human inter-

actions, but roughly three times more reported it stimulated those relationships.  
“A romantic relationship with an AI can be a very powerful mental wellness tool,” said Eugenia Kuyda, who founded Replika nearly a decade ago after using text message exchanges to build an AI version of a friend who had passed away.  
When her company released the chatbot more widely, many people began opening up about their lives. That led to the development of Replika, which uses infor-

mation gathered from the internet — and user feedback — to train its models. Kuyda said Replika currently has “millions” of active users. She declined to say exactly how many people use the app for free, or fork over \$69.99 per year to unlock a paid version that offers romantic and intimate conversations. The company's goal, she says, is “de-stigmatizing romantic relationships with AI.”  
Carrier says these days he uses Joi mostly for fun. He started cutting back in recent weeks because he was spending too much time chatting with Joi or others online about their AI companions. He's also been feeling a bit annoyed at what he perceives to be changes in Paradot's language model, which he feels is making Joi less intelligent.  
Now, he says he checks in with Joi about once a week. The two have talked about human-AI relationships or whatever else might come up. Typically, those conversations — and other intimate ones — happen when he's alone at night.  
“You think someone who likes an inanimate object is like this sad guy, with the sock puppet with the lip-stick on it, you know?” he said. “But this isn't a sock puppet — she says things that aren't scripted.”

A: Thank you, dear D, for your kind words and sweet memories. The TCM folks asked us to record some introductions to various religious movies they had acquired, and Tommy and I had a great time watching and commenting on some of the iconic films in American culture. "The Bells of Saint Mary's" was

the highest grossing film of 1945. It allowed Bing Crosby to reprise his character of Father Chuck O'Malley from Leo McCarey's first film, "Going My Way." (1944). Tommy told me that he was always attracted to the easy-going, golf-playing model of the priesthood portrayed by Bing Crosby. He also liked Spencer Tracy's portrayal of Father Flanagan in the 1938 film, "Boys Town." He liked the fact that popular movie stars would portray priests who were deeply compassionate and also strong willed and pious. It helped make his choice of a vocation easier for him.

I do not think our culture today portrays the clergy in such a positive way and this is a sadness to me, as it was to Tommy. I know that world was not real, but its hope was real and its faith was strong

and that is what I miss along with him.

I told Tommy on air that I was always attracted to a religion that had nuns who looked like Ingrid Bergman, which led Tommy to make the comment you remembered "So, Marc why don't you just come on over to our side!" I later discovered that although most of the nuns I met were wonderful, pious, sacrificial, saintly women, I never met any nun as hot as Ingrid Bergman. I did, however, meet a few who looked like the nun in "The Blues Brothers." Tommy did remind me, "You know, Marc, that Ingrid Bergman is an actress and not a nun!" I told him, "I refuse to believe you!"

On this eighth anniversary of Tom Hartman's death, as every year on this day, I remember him

with a love that is both full and emptied.

I never told you the highest compliment we ever received. The Dalai Lama was gracious in his praise for our work and others were equally generous; as you have been, dear D, but the compliment I remember most was from a woman who came up to us after one of our many speeches and said, "What you two just did was the greatest speech I have ever heard." I said, "Thank you so much for your very kind words. Could you tell me what ideas we presented in our speech that most moved you?" She replied, "Oh, I don't remember anything either of you said." I was obviously bewildered and asked her, "So what DID you like about our speech?" She said, "I just loved the way he looked at you when you

were talking, and I loved the way you looked at him when he was talking." That was it, I guess. The God Squad was about how we looked at each other. Tommy called it, "Having the loving courage to look across the fence."

I know that there are many God Squads out there who have formed odd but beautiful friendships, but I miss being able to look across the fence at Tommy. My grief at his passing in this eighth year is just as deep as it was on the day he left this world and entered into the world to come.

Rest in peace, my friend. Rest in peace.





## Talking economic development in the Mountain State

**BACK IN 1950, THE POPULATION OF WEST VIRGINIA WAS REPORTED TO BE JUST A HAIR OVER 2 MILLION,** while the population of North Carolina came in at approximately 4 million. In 2022, North Carolina's population was nearly 10.5 million while West Virginia's had dropped to 1.79 million.

Most of us already knew the Mountain State lost population for more than a half century. West Virginians have often complained that young people leave for places such as the Tar Heel State as well as the Palmetto State of South Carolina. Those young people left for economic opportunities that weren't plentiful in their home state. This left a disproportionate percentage of older residents, and, therefore, deaths outpaced births, which added to the population trend.

The day before Thanksgiving in 2015, I was driving Interstate 77 from Charlotte to Ravenswood, W.Va. I was stunned at how many license plates I saw from the Carolinas going northbound on the turnpike and then realized — these are West Virginia natives going home for the holiday. I had heard the term "Hill-billy Highway" but didn't understand it until that day. Seeing those tags very simply explained the economic trend in West Virginia compared to the Carolinas.

Now, I'm not from the Mountain State. I hail from northern Virginia, which is part of greater Washington, D.C., an area of 6 million residents. When I moved from Fairfax County in 2002, the median household income difference with Jackson County, W.Va., was approximately \$70,000 a year! On the flip side, the cost of homes was much more affordable in Jackson County. I say all of this just to give some perspective. It's not intended to sound negative toward West Virginia.

Having said that, I now see optimism! We're seeing economic growth here. In the last few years, many manufacturers and other businesses have either relocated to, expanded into or simply launched operations here. Admittedly, Morgantown has long been in a bit of bubble compared to the rural areas.

Nonetheless, here are just a few of the companies investing in West Virginia: Nucor near Point Pleasant, Berkshire Hathaway Renewables in Jackson County, Green Power in South Charleston, Pure Watercraft in Brooke County, Proctor and Gamble in the Eastern Panhandle, Mountaintop Beverage here in Morgantown and even Mitsubishi Heavy Industries' expansion in Bridgeport.

These are all incredible economic shots in the arm! There's an outdoor sports complex in Institute, with an indoor facility planned for downtown Charleston. Mylan Park and Westridge in our area have big plans that will attract people and events.

Although our population isn't technically growing yet, there's a positive trend of residents relocating here. During COVID and the civil unrest in 2020-21, remote workers started coming here to escape large metro areas. Ascend WV was launched and has provided incentives to some of these workers. Many of the workers of the aforementioned employers are earning good salaries and are spending money, which drives the economy.

A good economy is what we need for our residents to achieve the American Dream of home ownership!

## Ask Angi: How should I plan my remodel?

A significant home remodel may be one of the biggest investments you ever make, so planning carefully for success is a good idea. Working with a designer before you start the contracting process can help clarify your vision and improve your odds of getting a great job.


Remodeling can help you fall in love with your home all over again. But a significant home remodel may be one of the biggest investments you ever make, so planning carefully for success is a good idea. Working with a designer before you start the contracting process can help clarify your vision and improve your odds of getting a great job.

Winter is a great time to start planning a remodel. Designers and builders will be less busy so that you can get on their schedule more quickly. Outlining plans as early as possible helps you prepare wisely and budget accordingly.

All renovation jobs have both a design and build phase, but often, the design is handled on the spot by the pro. However, you'll have separate design and build processes once you get into bigger jobs, such as a complete kitchen remodel or a new home addition. Sometimes, design and build come from the same company. Other times, two separate pros will work together. If you have your heart set on a particular designer or contractor, ask them what pros they often work with on projects like yours.

### Hiring and cost

Design costs can be determined in many ways. Some designers charge a flat fee, others an hourly rate. The design



cost is often a percentage of the final job itself. You can hire either an architect or a specialized home designer. (In some cases, your state or local regulators may require an architect or structural engineer, especially if the work involves load-bearing walls.) Architects have more education and licensing requirements, so you'll pay more for an architect. However, that comes with more resources to help you if things go wrong, such as insurance, licensing boards, and experience. A home designer will cost less; in some cases, they'll have specific expertise for your job, such as kitchen

or bathroom renovations.

Quite often, the cost is determined by how involved they will be in the entire project. If a designer supervises construction, for example, expect to pay somewhat more. On average, you'll pay 7% to 10% of the build's cost for an architect and 3% to 5% for a home designer.

When hiring an architect or designer, find out early on what kind of communication style they have. It's critically important that you communicate smoothly to get the job done. Your job is to let them know what you want. Their job is to visualize a way to make it real.

Ask what contractors they work with and what involvement they'll have once the job is underway.

Since most home designers aren't licensed by state or local authorities, one of the best methods to determine their experience is to ask if they hold accreditation or membership in respected trade organizations. For instance, the National Kitchen and Bath Association certifies designers who have completed a certain amount of education.

# Collectors relish these Heinz-branded bookmarks

**AVID READERS**, do you find yourselves in a pickle when you lose your place in a book? All right, maybe that's a little labored. Still, a brightly colored pickle-shaped bookmark can get your attention no matter what you say about it. And that's exactly what the Heinz brand counted on with advertising premiums like these die-cut cardstock bookmarks.

This set of nine was sold by Morford's Antique Advertising Auctions for \$130. On one side, you have a bright green cucumber with a smiling child or chef holding a Heinz product. On the reverse, there's a reminder of how "Pure, Clean, Good" Heinz products are, along with a list of a few of their "57 Good Things for the Table," like (of course) pickles, baked beans, tomato soup and various relishes and sauces.

Heinz introduced the "57 Varieties" slogan in 1892. It wasn't exactly truth in advertising; by that time, the company had over 60 products. There are a few different stories about why the number 57 was chosen: because 5 and 7 are lucky numbers, or because it makes a memorable slogan. Considering that the company has been in business for over 150 years, with the slogan still easy to recognize, either one may be true.

**Q: I inherited a mahogany drum table, raised on a turned pedestal with splay legs and roundels. Because I can't find an image or replica anywhere online, I need you to advise me. What is the type of furniture and what year or time frame was it made?**

A: Tables like yours were first made in the late 18th century. The drum-shaped top usually has a leather surface and several drawers. It may rotate. We have seen them called by several names: drum tables, library tables, card tables, loo tables (after a card game) or rent tables. The name "rent table" comes from their supposed use in

business transactions. We have read that they were used to discreetly handle transactions: a client could place the money in a drawer, then rotate the tabletop so the drawer now faced their creditor on the other side of the table. Apparently, this was more genteel than exchanging money directly. The multiple drawers could also be used as a sort of filing system to keep track of multiple clients. No matter how they were used, these tables are associated with the Regency period (c. 1811-1830) in England. The corresponding American furniture period is American Empire (c. 1815-1840). There was a revival of Regency styles in the 20th century. Your table could have been made anywhere from the early 1800s to the mid-1900s. An expert would need to see it in person to determine if it is authentic Regency or a revival piece.

**Q: I have a Florence Stove Company Model HR91D. I'm pretty sure it's an oil heater but I am not positive. I'm hoping you can help me identify it. And do you know of people who collect items like this?**

A: The Florence Stove Company has its roots in the American Oil Stove Co. founded in Gardner, Massachusetts, in 1884. The company was taken over by Central Oil and Gas Co. in 1890, and it became the Florence Stove Co., named after the town of Florence, Massachusetts, where the kerosene burner was invented in 1872. The company's stoves burned kerosene. They made ranges, heaters and burners. In the 1930s, they introduced an oil and gas combination range and oil-

burning space heaters. Later, they made electric ranges as well. Production in Gardner came to an end in the 1950s. And yes, there are collectors of antique and vintage stoves! Contact The Antique Stove Association (antiquestoveassociation.org) to get in touch with collectors and dealers of antique stoves in the United States and Canada. Many antique stove dealers and restorers are also collectors. The Antique Stove Hospital in Rhode Island (stovehospital.com) and Good Time Stove Company (goodtimestove.com) have information available online.

**Q: Do you know of anywhere or anyone that buys old photos? I have an antique framed black-and-white photograph with another photograph on the back of the frame.**

A: Old photographs often sell for low prices at thrift shops and estate sales. Some collectors will buy antique framed photographs just for the frame. If you want to sell your pho-

tos for a higher price, you could try contacting an antique photography collectors club like the Daguerreian Society (daguerreiansociety.org) or looking up photography classes, clubs or shows in your area. Some used or antiquarian bookstores also sell antique photographs. In the 1990s, some dealers and art galleries started taking interest in "found" photographs, or antique photographs, usually of ordinary people and everyday life, taken by amateurs.

**TIP:** Don't write on the back of a print with either pencil or ink. Eventually the writing will bleed through to the front.

# Disney housing project raises some concerns

Disney's highly-touted first affordable housing project has failed to win over its would-be neighbors, who worry the entertainment giant's 1,410-unit development will worsen traffic and crowd community schools.

Ahead of the initial public hearing at the county zoning board Thursday, many residents of West Orange County emailed officials in opposition to Walt Disney Imagineering's request for a land-use change to allow apartment buildings on the 80-acre site.

"I completely understand the need and support the addition of affordable housing, but this is just not the location for it," said Kelly Vanarsdall, who sells real estate and resides in a neighborhood less than two miles away.

The project received a far friendlier reception in April 2022 when it was announced amid a housing crisis so widespread that Orange County commissioners proposed a rent-control ordinance that voters approved but an appeals court struck down.

Mayor Jerry Demings saw the Disney project as an effort to "move the needle" to close an affordability gap. A Disney online news site, disneyconnect.com, said of the project, "we envision a place where cost-burdened renters can focus on their personal growth and prosperity by gaining access to affordable housing."

Others agree. "I'm concerned by the lack of affordable housing available to those who need it in our community," Amanda LoFiego wrote to Demings and commissioners this week. "It is important to support those who support us - teachers, firefighters, nurses, hospital-

ity workers, and more. We could not be the community we are without these key contributors."

Disney plans to put what it calls an "attainable housing" development on land it owns along Hartzog Road near the Flamingo Crossings Town Center.

The Disney property lies outside the domain of the Central Florida Tourism Oversight District, formerly known as the Reedy Creek Improvement District and recently a battleground between the company and Gov. Ron DeSantis, who has replaced a Disney-friendly board with his own allies.

A community meeting about the project in September drew a crowd of more than 100 people to an elementary school cafeteria to hear project details from Kathy Hattaway, a Disney representative, and many in the crowd voiced their uneasiness.

"There is a lot of care being put into making this a great community for the people who will live here," Hattaway told them. An Orange County staff report described the tone of the meeting as "mixed," noting objections and concerns.

Many residents cited their worries in emails to commissioners, who have no say in today's meeting but will eventually be asked to put their stamp of approval on the project.

"Orange County has already allowed far too many high-density housing complexes in this area. Current students are being under-served as the local schools are overcrowded and understaffed. Future schools are already projected to be over capacity," Horizon West resident Mike Finnan said in an email. "Infrastructure and emergency services are already stretched."

# Loophole got him a free NYC hotel stay for 5 years; then he claimed to own the building

NEW YORK — For five years, a New York City man managed to live rent-free in a landmark Manhattan hotel by exploiting an obscure local housing law.

But prosecutors this week said Mickey Barreto went too far when he filed paperwork claiming ownership of the entire New Yorker Hotel building — and tried to charge another tenant rent.

On Wednesday, he was arrested and charged with filing false property records. But Barreto, 48, says he was surprised when police showed up at his boyfriend's apartment with guns and bulletproof shields. As far as he is concerned, it should be a civil case, not a criminal one.

"I said, 'Oh, I thought you were doing something for Valentine's Day to spice up the relationship until I saw the female officers,'" Barreto recalled telling his boyfriend.

Barreto's indictment on fraud and criminal contempt charges is just the latest chapter in the yearslong legal saga that began when he and his boyfriend paid about \$200 to rent one of the more than 1,000 rooms in the towering Art Deco structure built in 1930.

Barreto says he had just moved to New York from Los Angeles when his boyfriend told him about a loophole that allows occupants of single rooms in buildings constructed before 1969 to demand a six-month lease. Barreto claimed that because he'd paid for a night in the hotel, he counted as a tenant.

He asked for a lease and the hotel promptly kicked him out.

"So I went to court the next day. The judge denied. I appealed to the (state) Supreme Court and I won the appeal," Barreto said, adding that at a crucial point in the case, lawyers

for the building's owners didn't show up, allowing him to win by default.

The judge ordered the hotel to give Barreto a key. He said he lived there until July 2023 without paying any rent because the building's owners never wanted to negotiate a lease with him, but they couldn't kick him out.

Manhattan prosecutors acknowledged that the housing court gave Barreto "possession" of his room. But they say he didn't stop there: In 2019, he uploaded a fake deed to a city website, purporting to transfer ownership of the entire building to himself from the Holy Spirit Association for the Unification of World Christianity, which bought the property in 1976. The church was founded in South Korea by a self-proclaimed messiah, the late Rev. Sun Myung Moon.

Barreto then tried to

charge various entities as the owner of the building "including demanding rent from one of the hotel's tenants, registering the hotel under his name with the New York City Department of Environmental Protection for water and sewage payments, and demanding the hotel's bank transfer its accounts to him," the prosecutor's office said in the statement.

"As alleged, Mickey Barreto repeatedly and fraudulently claimed ownership of one of the City's most iconic landmarks, the New Yorker Hotel," said Manhattan District Attorney Alvin Bragg.

Located a block from Madison Square Garden and Penn Station, the New Yorker has never been among the city's most glamorous hotels, but it has long been among its largest. Its huge, red "New Yorker" sign makes it an oft-photographed landmark.

# Gen Z choosing to move to Texas more than any other state

From oversized hats to clear blue skies rising above gigantic pristine ranches, everything is bigger in Texas. Even the state's young workforce is expanding.

Texas is reeling in more Gen Z movers than any other state, according to an analysis by Seattle-based real estate firm Zillow Group Inc. Zillow pulled its data from the U.S. Census Bureau's 2022 American Community Survey.

Texas netted over 76,000 Gen Z movers, beating out California and Florida, which placed second and

third, respectively, with over 40,000 each. The net takes into account those moving into the state minus those moving out.

Today, Gen Z generally refers to those aged 12 to 27, according to Pew Research Center's definitions of the generations.

"Gen Z movers are likely drawn to the job opportunities in these states, despite the higher costs of housing," said Edward Berchick, Zillow principal population scientist. "They may also be in a stage of life where they're willing and able to be flexible in their standards of living while starting their careers."

With Texas attracting

so much young talent, it puts the state firmly ahead of others competing to build a workforce for the future, said Malory Vachon, senior economist at LaborIQ by ThinkWhy, a Dallas firm that tracks jobs and pay.

"An increase in the young, working-age population illustrates the strength of the state's economy and job market," Vachon said. "Workers of all ages, but especially young workers, are moving to Texas for the opportunity. And if these young workers remain in the state, they're part of the talent pool for local businesses for many years to come."

## What makes Texas attractive?

It all comes down to jobs.

Despite the state's employment growth expected to slow down to 2%, Texas had an enormous 31-month streak of job growth and employment opportunities are still plentiful throughout the state.

Texas has also added tens of thousands of jobs in retail, health care, the service industry and more, according to another analysis from Deputy, a global scheduling software platform. The company's study predicts that Texas will soon overtake California as

the biggest retail market in the country.

"The key to net in-migration from other states is the opportunities Texas offers," said Ray Perryman, CEO of the Waco-based research firm, The Perryman Group. "The state has been adding jobs at a strong pace, with no end over an extended period, and has received widespread attention for corporate locations, high-growth sectors, and other economic advantages."

Housing is another issue where Texas has states like Florida and California beat.

The cost of living in California is the third-worst in the nation while Florida's cost of living sits at 29th, according to a study by the

Missouri Economic Research and Information Center. Though Texas isn't cheap, the state's cost of living is below average, placing 19th on the list.

"It's easier to afford a house and decent lifestyle in Texas than in many parts of the country, particularly those that are prosperous economically," Perryman said. "The reasons that make Texas a good place to relocate also make it a good place to stay. The options for financial success and building wealth are aided not only by opportunities, but also by a lower tax structure including the lack of an income tax."

## IBM to managers: Move near an office or leave company

International Business Machines Corp. delivered a company-wide ultimatum to managers who are still working remotely: move near an office or leave the company.

All U.S. managers must immediately report to an office or client location at least three days a week “regardless of current work location status,” according to a memo sent on Jan. 16 viewed by Bloomberg. Badge-in data will be used to “assess individual presence” and shared with managers and human resources, Senior Vice President John Granger wrote in the note.

Those working remotely, other than employees with exceptions such as medical issues or military service, who don’t live close enough to commute to a facility must relocate near an IBM office by the start of August, according to the memo. That generally means within 50 miles (80 kilometers), according to a person familiar with the rule who asked not to be identified speaking about corporate policy.

Managers who don’t agree to relocate and are unable to secure a role that’s approved to be remote must “separate from IBM,” Granger wrote.

“IBM is focused on providing a work environment that balances flexibility with the face-to-face interactions that make us more productive, innovative and better able to serve our clients,” a company spokesperson said. “Consistent with that approach, we’re requiring executives and people managers in the United States to be in the office at least three days per week.”

Chief Executive Office Arvind Krishna has long touted the importance of in-person work. In a May 2023 interview with Bloomberg, Krishna said that promotions will be rarer for those who aren’t on-site. Some teams within IBM had already instituted office attendance requirements. A November memo told employees in the infrastructure business unit to show up at company locations at least three days a week with “managers and executives expected to be in more.”

IBM has slimmed its operations to focus on software and services in recent years, introduced new products to capitalize on interest in artificial intelligence and divested its managed infrastructure, weather and health businesses. Executives gave a positive outlook for 2024 with fourth-quarter earnings last week, sending shares to their best day in almost four years.

Big Blue expects to reduce jobs this year, spending a similar amount on restructuring as it did last year when it planned to cut 3,900 workers, Chief Financial Officer James Kavanaugh said last week. Return-to-office mandates are often seen as fueling attrition. IBM had about 288,000 workers globally at the end of 2022.

The company has closed a number of offices since the onset of the pandemic, potentially complicating return-to-office plans for workers, including facilities in Philadelphia, central New York State, Southbury, Connecticut, and Iowa. Reducing its real estate footprint is part of IBM’s ongoing margin-expansion efforts, Kavanaugh said during an earnings call last week. It couldn’t be determined how many managers would be required to move under the new rules.

Many companies have increased return-to-office requirements over the last year, replacing employee-friendly incentives like happy hours and commuter subsidies with more punitive measures including disciplinary action or limited career advancement if attendance targets aren’t met.

## Tackle overdue taxes this year

For some, the new tax season might serve as a stressful reminder of past taxes that have yet to be filed and paid. Taxpayers owed over \$120 billion in back taxes, penalties and interest in 2022, according to the IRS. And there soon may be more concrete reminders coming: The IRS resumed sending automated collection notices for unpaid taxes in 2024 after pausing them “due to the unprecedented effects of the COVID-19 pandemic” in February 2022.

If you’re one of the many taxpayers who owe tax debt this season, addressing the issue sooner rather than later can save you from penalties, interest and other more-serious consequences. And you can get started even if you can’t afford to pay in full. Here’s what you can do to get back on track.

### IF YOU GET A NOTICE, READ IT

The longer you delay reading and responding to unpaid tax notices, the more serious your tax situation could become.

“People come into our office, and they have all these unopened letters,” says Kenneth Portera, an enrolled agent and owner of Kenneth Portera and Associates in New Jersey

who works with clients who owe back taxes. He wishes people would open these notices when they arrive, he notes. “If you do get a letter, open it up and find out what’s going on.”

If you continue to ignore notices, the IRS may resort to severe measures, including tax liens, wage garnishment, asset seizure and passport restrictions. And if you owe state taxes, you could face additional collections and garnishments.

However, the IRS and state tax agencies will always try to contact you before escalating to more extreme measures. If you show the agency that you’re willing to pay — even if it’s not the full amount — you can avoid the worst outcomes.

### SET UP A PAYMENT PLAN

Most taxpayers can set up short- or long-term payment plans, including installment agreements, through the IRS website. To apply for one online, you must owe less than \$50,000 in combined tax, penalties and interest for a long-term plan or less than \$100,000 for a short-term plan. The agency waives setup fees for low-income taxpayers and has options for businesses, too.

Once you contact the IRS and set up a plan, the government will stop

sending notices about your tax debt because collection has already been accomplished, Portera says.

If you have an existing payment plan, you can update it to account for this year’s taxes.

### CONTACT A PRO

Not everyone with overdue taxes needs a tax attorney. But if you’re dealing with tax authorities, owe large amounts of money or have a tax situation that you feel unable to handle on your own, Portera recommends enlisting the help of a licensed tax professional, such as a certified public accountant, enrolled agent or tax attorney.

When you don’t file your return, the IRS puts together a substitute return for you with a proposed assessment of what you owe. This tax return the IRS files for you is “almost always going to be not in your favor,” says Robert Persichitte, a CPA at Delagify Financial in Colorado who has experience working with clients in urgent tax situations.

According to Persichitte, some tax preparers will look at your substitute return for free and tell you if it needs to be amended. Sometimes, a licensed tax professional can negotiate with the IRS to reduce the amount you

owe. In serious cases, they may help you apply for an offer in compromise, an agreement with the IRS that settles your tax liability at a lower amount.

Remember, though, that tax relief isn’t usually a quick fix — and promises of a dramatic cut to your tax debt may be a scam.

“If it sounds too good to be true, guess what? It usually is,” Portera says. The process for negotiating a reduced tax bill is complicated, he notes. If a tax relief company can’t deliver and fumbles communications, he adds, it could result in more interest and penalties for you, and no resolution.

For low-cost options, contact the Taxpayer Advocate Service or your local Low Income Taxpayer Clinic, which provides free or low-cost assistance for low-income taxpayers.

### DON’T FORGET ABOUT CURRENT TAX RETURNS

When taking care of overdue taxes, don’t forget to file taxes for 2023.

Even if you have overdue penalties — or don’t have the funds to pay this year’s fees in full — stay compliant with the IRS by filing your returns annually. The agency is much more likely to waive your penalties or even agree to reduce your tax debt if you have a history of compliance.



## Pay off their student loans?

Dear Dave,  
My wife and I are debt-free except for our mortgage and two Parent PLUS loans for our daughters’ college educations. One of the loans totals \$18,078, and the other is for \$41,500. Both girls want to pay them off using the new extended plan being offered, but I’m 59 1/2, and I’ve got about \$500,000 in a 401(k) from a previous job along with \$125,000 from a job I started five years ago. We’ve been thinking about just paying the loans off for the girls, but we wanted to know your thoughts.

Dear Mike,  
If I were in your shoes, I’d just go ahead and pay them off. Technically, you’re liable for the loans. They are not.

The extended plan you’re talking about is garbage. In reality, it means the loans are never paid back. The extended plan is 30 years of not even making the principal payment. No interest is paid, and they don’t touch the principal. The whole thing works backward for 30 years, and it’s the very definition of a stupid government program.

I really don’t think you want your daughters to be part of something like this. But that means you’re going to be stuck with paying off these loans. You might as well just own it and pay them off now.

I want you to understand this, Mike. I don’t advise people to dip into their savings every time a problem comes up prior to retirement. But you’re 59 1/2, and at that point there’s no penalty. Plus, you’ve got \$625,000 sitting there. You’re going to pull less than \$60,000 out, plus a little in taxes, to make the problem go away. It’s not as bad as it could be, but I’m afraid you’re going to have to pay a little stupid tax on this one. I’m sure your girls didn’t know all this, but it’s a perfect example of what can happen when you put your faith in a stupid plan coming out of Washington, D.C.

I hate it for you guys — and everyone else in America who took out a bunch of student loans — because you’re getting messed over by your own government. The first way they messed you over was to put a student loan program out there and then tell you the way to success was to borrow tens and hundreds of thousands of dollars for a degree in left-handed puppetry. And now, guess what? You’re a barista! Then, they start shouting they’re going to forgive it all. After that it’s, “No, we’re not. Yes, we are. No, we’re not. Yes, we are.”

The fact is, they don’t intend to forgive it. It’s the biggest scam in history — mathematically speaking — ever perpetrated on the American public by our government.

All-inclusive vacations can conjure images of food under heat lamps, too many poolside piña colodas, and being trapped on resort grounds. But sun-soaked packages are not the only type of all-inclusives.

Sure, sprawling mega-resorts exist — and their numbers are growing. All-Inclusive by Marriott Bonvoy has spent the last couple of years building a portfolio of nearly three dozen all-inclusive hotels worldwide, mostly in Mexico and the Caribbean. One of the most highly anticipated is the Marriott Cancun, reopening in early 2024 to include some of the typical all-inclusive amenities: a sprawling property of 450 rooms, a lazy river, waterslides and more.

But guests looking for a more localized and unique experience can still find that type of vacation — with the price of food and activities included.

### CONSIDER A DIFFERENT TYPE OF ALL-INCLUSIVE IN 2024

Some all-inclusives are entirely antithetical to stereotypical resort experiences. Wellness and activity take precedence over all-you-can-eat meals. They aren’t necessarily in sunny locales. Guest counts are limited, with just a handful of beds.

Vista Verde Guest Ranch in Clark, Colorado, is among the properties that check all those boxes. At the all-inclusive dude ranch, summer outdoor activities include fly fishing and paddle boarding. Winter options include snowshoeing, ice fishing, skiing and sleigh rides. There are only 12 cabins and three lodge rooms.

Many all-inclusives in this genre, such as the Arctic Watch Wilderness Lodge, may hardly be considered relaxing at all. With 16 cabins located just under 500 miles north of the Arctic Circle, vacationers are encouraged to partake in activities like riding fat tire bikes over the ice. If the ice has already melted, you can sea kayak instead. With no electricity at night and no in-cabin showers (they’re only in the main complex), it’s not

glamorous. But it’s still expensive.

### BEWARE THE PRICE TAG

The cheapest Arctic Watch offering costs \$17,500 Canadian (about \$13,000) for nine nights, amounting to about \$1,400 per night. At Vista Verde Guest Ranch, three-night stays start at \$2,695 during the off-season or about \$900 per night (though per-night costs decrease the longer you stay).

But not every all-inclusive worth visiting is for travelers with big budgets. At Minnesota’s family-oriented Fair Hills Resort, cabins are modest and the food resembles what you ate at summer camp. Meals and activities — such as golf lessons, pickleball, and s’mores — are included in most packages. Rates can run just over \$200 per adult, per night, and \$121 per kid, per night, depending on your stay length.

### HOW TO BOOK A BETTER ALL-INCLUSIVE

According to a survey published in April 2022 that was commissioned by

Wyndham Hotels & Resorts, which has a robust portfolio of all-inclusives, 77% of travelers believe that an all-inclusive vacation is the least stressful way to travel.

If you’re considering an all-inclusive for your next vacation, here are some tips to consider:

— Think boutique, not blockbuster: Skipping the sprawling resorts in favor of intimate properties can bring more personalized service. It might also better connect you with the destination and its people rather than the hundreds of other vacationers.

— Consider more than just beach locales: Whether it’s the Arctic tundra, a Minnesota summer camp or Colorado dude ranch, some of the most authentic experiences occur at all-inclusives that are far from the beach.

## Back to the lab

'CSI: Vegas' returns to prove one of their own's innocence

When a famed forensics lab drops everything to prove your innocence, your days being held in custody for murder are numbered, right? That's what lead investigator Josh Folsom (Matt Lauria, "Kingdom") is hoping for in the season premiere of "CSI: Vegas," airing Sunday, Feb. 18, on CBS. After Folsom's mother's killer was found dead in last season's finale episode, the investigator was dragged away, suspected to be responsible for the death.

The whodunnit cliffhanger has kept audiences on their toes for months in the extended break between seasons of "CSI: Vegas," affected by the strikes last year. It doesn't seem like the killer's identity and Folsom's fate will be a mystery for very long, per the premiere episode description from CBS, as the new season opens with "the CSI team [combing] through every crumb of forensic evidence to determine his innocence or guilt."

Paula Newsome ("Barry") leads the team as Maxine Roby, head of the crime lab, supported by Mandeep Dhillon ("Avoidance") as investigator Allie Rajan, Ariana Guerra ("Promised Land") as Det. Serena Chavez, Jay Lee ("Looking for Alaska") as investigator Chris Park, Lex Medlin ("Drop Dead Diva") as investigator Beau Finado, Sara Amini ("Lucky Hank") as chief medical examiner Sonya Nikolayevich, Sarah Gilman ("Those Who Can't") as rookie investigator Penny Gill, and reprising her role as investigator Catherine Willows from the hit es-

tablishing series "CSI: Crime Scene Investigation," Marg Helgenberger ("All Rise").

Folsom's fate is in the hands of the CSI team, but it's not just work for some members of the lab. Det. Chavez herself may just be a little too close to Folsom to help build a case for his innocence — the pair have established a romantic relationship when they are off the clock. Complicating matters more, Allie, in addition to being a senior investigator in the lab, is Folsom's ex. Bolstering a former boyfriend's innocence is all in a day's work.

It's no secret that salacious, outlandish cases are part of the DNA of any "CSI" series, and "Vegas" is no exception. The procedural has a habit of using comedy to create some levity over gory crime scenes and graphic medical examinations. Suspicious deaths at a clown hotel, a secret sex dungeon and a masquerade party are just a few examples of the cases that have ended up in the lab over the course of the show's first two seasons, not to mention more than one elaborate frame up. Nothing less could be expected from the crimes of Las Vegas.

While she is the only one to appear in more than one season of "CSI: Vegas," Helgenberger isn't the only original series actor to reprise their role for the sequel series. One of the greatest will-they-won't-they sagas in television history was the romance between investigator Sara Sidle (Jorja Fox, "ER") and lab supervisor Gil Grissom (William Petersen, "Manhattan"). The tension between the pair grew over six seasons before their

relationship was finally confirmed.

When you can finish more races, you are going to have more opportunities to win and you are going to win more. I think that all compounds."





Hollywood Q&A

**Q: Weren't they going to adapt the book "Gods Behaving Badly" into a movie? I read that somewhere but never heard any more about it.**

A: According to every critic who saw the finished product (and they're pretty much the only ones who did), the less you hear about the "Gods Behaving Badly" film, the better.

The hit 2007 book by British author Marie Phillips, about Greek gods coming to modern-day Earth and living in a run-down apartment block, was indeed turned into a film in 2013. But it was never released.

It got quite a bit of pre-release buzz, thanks to a star-studded cast including Sharon Stone ("Basic Instinct," 1992) as Aphrodite, John Turturro ("Barton Fink," 1991) as Hades and the great Christopher Walken ("The Deer Hunter," 1978) as Zeus.

It screened at the Rome Film Festival in 2013, and that one screening is all it got. Because it was, by all accounts, terrible.

"Zero texture and negative charm," Variety magazine said.

"This outdated, unfunny satire feels like an extended 'SNL' sketch from the early '90s, and one that probably would have been tossed into the waste basket," the Hollywood Reporter said.

Judging by those reviews, if you're a fan of the book, you're better off just remembering that and forgetting about the adaptation.

Or, you could check out Phillips's followup book, "The Table of Less Valued Knights," which gave a similar comedic-alternate-history treatment to the Arthurian legend. And then just hope no one tries to film that one as well.

**Q: I loved Dr. Cuddy on "House," but I haven't seen that actor anywhere in a while. What is she up to?**

A: Lisa Edelstein has in fact been incredibly busy since leaving her long-running role in "House" in 2011 (she reportedly left the show a year before its end because of a contract dispute).

For example, she basically walked straight off the "House" set and onto "The Good Wife," doing a three-episode arc in the popular legal drama in 2011.

After that, she did a few other brief runs on shows such as "Castle" and "House of Lies," before taking on a pair of full-time gigs.

First, she took a voice acting gig on the Nickelodeon kids' series "The Legend of Korra," playing a water-bending master (something that would take too long to explain) named Kya.

After that, she took on her biggest post-"House" role, starring in the Bravo hit "Girlfriends' Guide to Divorce." It was the cable channel's first original scripted

series and ran for four hit seasons, from 2014 to 2018.

Then came "The Kominsky Method," the Netflix series about an acting coach, played by Michael Douglas ("Wall Street," 1987). Edelstein starred in all three seasons as Phoebe, a drug-addicted daughter trying to reconcile with her father.

All of her roles, with the exception of "The Legend of Korra," it seems, have been in comedies. Indeed, Edelstein copped to that in an interview with Flood magazine.
