EOP Overview (Drills)



The Standard Response Protocol (SRP) provides consistent, clear, shared language and actions among all students, staff and first responders, that can be applied in any emergency. This video illustrates how to implement each of the SRP actions - Secure (Lockout), Lockdown, Evacuate, Shelter, and Hold - in a school setting. It is intended to accompany the SRP Toolkit and can be used to train school staff and students on the SRP. The Standard Response Protocol (SRP) referenced in the video was developed by the "I Love U Guys" Foundation.

Please note: This version of the SRP video has been updated to include the new language of "Secure (Lockout)" in place of Lockout.


Asbestos



CKA (Legal)The rules adopted under the Asbestos Hazard **Emergency Response Act** (AHERA) (15 U.S.C. 2641-2656) require a district to identify asbestos-containing material (ACM) in schools by visually inspecting school buildings for such materials, sampling such materials if they are not assumed to be ACM, and having samples analyzed by appropriate techniques; submit management plans; and implement the plans in a timely fashion. Districts are required to use persons who have been accredited to conduct inspections, reinspections, develop management plans, or perform response actions. The rule includes recordkeeping requirements.

EOP Severe Weather (Drill)



Severe weather preparedness is essential for all schools.

A unique plan should be developed for your school using guidelines, your experience, and local considerations. However, if there is one idea that works in nearly all scenarios, it is this:


"Put as many walls between you and the storm as possible."










Safe and Supportive School Program Exterior Doors

PLAN OF ACTION THAT IS IN PLACE:

Plan of action that is in place to address any unlocked doors:

- 1) Staff members will report the unlocked door to campus leadership.
- 2) Campus leadership will immediately have the door locked.

Plan of action that is in place to address broken doors:

- 1) Staff members will report all broken doors to campus leadership.
- Campus leadership will immediately create a maintenance work order to repair the door.
- The broken door will be monitored by campus staff until it is repaired by maintenance.

*All staff members will be reminded of the action plan at each monthly school meeting.









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All safety drills must be completed on a timely basis.
