1. - **Title I Parent meeting scheduled during the fall semester.**
- **Universal Screening benchmark assessment results and student progress are printed for parents by our Title I teacher and distributed at both Fall and Spring conferences, as well as Student Services Team meetings for students needing additional supports.**
- **Student Services Team (SST) meeting referrals are communicated to parents by classroom teacher and parents are invited to offer feedback through a parent questionnaire. Parents may also request an SST meeting for their child.**

6. If the school-wide program plan (Campus Improvement Plan, CIP) under section 1114(b) is not satisfactory to the parents of participating children, submit any parent comments on the plan when the school makes the plan available to the local educational agency. Section 1116 (c)(5)

- **Provide parents the opportunity to provide feedback and suggestions during Site Council and Parent Teacher Organization meetings.**

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7. To ensure effective involvement of parents and to support a partnership among the school involved, parents, and the community to improve student academic achievement, Patrick Elementary shall: Section 1116(e)
