Coach Doug Burroughs to be Honored

Longtime GBHS Boys and Girls Soccer Coach Doug Burroughs will be inducted into the Bobcat Sports Hall of Fame this Fall during Homecoming weekend. Coaching the Boy's Soccer teams from 1985 until 1998, Burroughs won 14 Big Nine Championships, numerous Regional titles, and took the Boys team to the State Finals in 1987. Doug was the first coach for the Girls Soccer team. He coached the girls from 1986 until 1998 - again winning numerous Big Nine and Regional titles.

Doug had the pleasure of coaching 13 First-Team All-State Soccer players.

The Bobcat Hall of Fame induction will be on Friday, October 1, 2010 during halftime ceremonies of the Homecoming Football game vs. Pinckney. On Saturday October 2nd, former soccer players will attend the Alumni Banquet, where a special roast will take place honoring Coach Burroughs. The event will be held at the Elks Club at the corner of Maple and Vassar Road. Girls and Boys Soccer players and their families from the 1980's and 1990's are welcome to join us for the weekend festivities.

Tickets for Friday night's game are \$5 and can be purchased at the Athletic Office during the week of Homecoming. The Saturday night Banquet and Soccer Roast tickets can be purchased by calling our Alumni office starting August 1st at 810-591-6021. 
GB Educational Foundation Continues to Support Alumni


"BATCH" Inducted Into The Hall of Fame

On December 5, 2009, former GBHS coach/athletic director, Don Batchelor, was inducted into the Greater Flint Area Sports Hall of Fame. Receiving the honor in her dad's name was Joan Kifer from Bend, Oregon. Close to 600 people crammed the Genesys Athletic and Banquet Center to see Batch, five fellow individual inductees, three teams, and one Special Service award winner.

Close to fifty friends of Batch were part of the celebration. This is a little amazing because he died close to 40 years ago and no member of his family lives in the Grand Blanc Area. Former athletes, spouses of fellow coaches and friends of Mrs. Kifer were part of the group of fifty. Mrs. Kifer was joined by her husband, two sons, and a daughter-in-law.

Batch was a beloved figure in the Grand Blanc community. He joined the staff in 1929 and retired in 1961. During the period, he was the football and baseball coach and, in the last stage of his career, he was the district's athletic director. Former students of Batch will never forget the infamous "observe your surroundings" admonition that he "regularly" shared with his students. A "gentle giant" of a man, Batch had a heart of gold and will live forever in the memory of Grand Blanc High School.
