

and see your felllow teammates. During halftime, we would like you to join Coach Oldham on the track in front of the home stand, for his induction.


On Saturday, September 27th, the Swimmers will attend the Alumni Banquet at the Genesys Athletic Club. Coach Oldham will be one of






















Freshman Mr. Bobcat: Charlie Carmody.

Charlie, from the Class of 1980, moved to the Grand Blanc area at the age of six and grew up in Ottawa Hills, on the northwest side of Grand Blanc. Charlie receives high praise from Grand Blanc Superintendent Mike Newton, "I've always said that every school deserves a Charlie Carmody. He is truly one of a kind. He is a cheerleader, coach, teacher, and historian all in one! No one loves Grand Blanc more than Charlie ... except maybe me." "You should see him at a pep rally", Superintendent Newton continues, "He is the show. If you can't get motivated after one of Charlie's pep assemblies, you can't get motivated!'

In 1996 Charlie, in conjunction with Grand Blanc Educational Foundation, founded the Alumni Aossocation. Swim Coach to be Honored

Craig Oldham, the longtime coach of the boys and girls swim teams will be inducted into the Bobcat Sports Hall of Fame on September 26th, 2008 during the halftime activities of the 2008 Homecoming Football Game. He is being honored for his many years of service, commitment, and loyalty to the Grand Blanc High School students athletics.

Craig has been a fixture in athletics in Grand Blanc High School since joining the staff in 1974. Although he started coaching as freshman football coach, he influenced many student althetes as a swim coach. Craig began as the assistant to Denny Armstrong with the boys swim team in 1976, and continued to do so until 1982. Craig was the boys head coach from 1982 until 1996. His boys teams won 17 Big Nine Championships, and he coached 16 All-State and 5 All-Americans. Craig was the girls swim coach in 1976 until 1982, and again from 1986 until 1995. His girls teams won 17 Big Nine Championships and he coached 15 All-State and 3 All-American swimmers.

Although he retired from coaching and teaching in 1996, Craig returned to GBHS in 1998 where he continues to teach 9th grade science classes. Craig also helps the boys swim team on occasions. A tireless worker, he propelled the swim teams to great heights with his sense of humor, his warm caring personality, and his committement his GBHS swimmers.

We invite all swimmers from 1970s through the 1990s to join us homecoming weekend and celebrate this induction. We will have you on the track for induction ceremony and then we'd like to have you join us for the Swim Team Reunion weekend which includes the Alumni Banquet Saturday, September 27th.
