Learning Target/Goal: Identification and Notification of Approved Academic Standards in the Areas of Math, Science, Social Studies, Reading & Writing (English Language Arts) for 2023-2024. Identify the list and descriptions of student academic standards in the areas of mathematics, science, reading and writing, social studies for the 2023-2024 school year. In alignment with our 2023-24 district goal, "100% of our students will show proficiency or above in the essential standards for literacy and math".

INFORMATION:

Under section 120.12(13) of WI State Statutes, each school board must clearly identify the student academic standards that have been adopted by the board under section 118.30(1g)(a) that will be in effect for the school year. This must be addressed on the agenda of the first board meeting of each school year (i.e., in July) and encompass the district's standards in mathematics, science, reading and writing, geography, and history.

Each school board must also annually notify parents/guardians of students enrolled in the school of the academic standards that will be in effect for the school year. This notice must be given prior to the beginning of the school year and may be provided electronically, including posting the notice or a link to the specific academic standards on the school district's website.
