
Provides flexibility for students with a wide range of interests and talents and includes courses from multiple content areas




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Students are allowed to take classes from all the endorsement areas to see what they may be interested in for the future.





Possible Careers



Option 1: 4 x 4

- ❖ 4 English credits
(must include English IV)
- ❖ 4 Math credits
(must include Algebra I and Geometry)
- ❖ 4 Science credits
(must include Biology + Chemistry and/or Physics or AP Physics I)
- ❖ 4 Social Studies credits (must include Geography and/or World History + US History + Government + Economics)



Option 2: AP or Dual Credit

❖ **Students take 4 Advanced Placement (AP) or 4 Dual Credit (DC) courses for 4 credits**

(English, Math, Science, Social Studies, LOTE/Foreign Language, & Fine Arts)

OR

❖ **Students take a combination of Advanced Placement (AP) and Dual Credit (DC) courses for 4 credits**

- Advanced Placement (AP)
 - Earn college credit by taking the AP exam in the Spring
 - Each college or university determines whether or not credit is awarded from their institution
 - Dual Credit (DC)
 - Earn high school and college credit for a specific high school course through successful completion of the course
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- **Note:** Specific entry requirements must be met before enrolling in DC classes
