CSDA Happenings

Grade 4: Fourth graders are starting a geometry unit in math. In writing, students are continuing to work on their marine mammal nonfiction projects.

Grade 5: Fifth graders are working on adding and subtracting fractions with unlike denominators. After vacation, students will start learning about the events that lead to the American Revolution.

Grade 6: Sixth Graders are finishing up their Archaeology Unit of social studies with their exams this week. They have been studying how archaeologists learn about the past using carbon dating, the archaeological record, and the examination of ancient artifacts.

CSDA Unified Arts: Students are reviewing meter and time signatures, what they are, and how they are used in music. They are also learning Vivaldi's Spring Theme on barred instruments and a Nova Scotia traditional melody to help reinforce the feeling of the meters.

Pre-K: Preschoolers will continue learning about space. They'll do some science experiments related to light and heat, practice counting with rocket ships, and do a meteor letter hunt.

Tips for Vacation Week

Playing Outside? When playing outside, dress your children in layers and limit their time in cold weather or snow, ensuring they take breaks and stay hydrated.



Going skiing? - Always wear a helmet when skiing or snowboarding, use sunscreen, protect your eyes by wearing ski goggles, take a lesson to make sure you are ready for the slopes.

Traveling to a warmer climate pool or beach? - Wear sunscreen, take swimming lessons, follow pool and water safety tips.

- Illness Circulating:
- Strep Throat If your child has a sore throat this can be diagnosed with a rapid strep test or throat culture. If diagnosed with strep throat, your child must be on antibiotics for a minimum of 24 hours before returning to school.
- Stomach Symptoms Nausea, Vomiting, Diarrhea, stomach pains
- WHEN TO STAY HOME To prevent contagious illness, stay home from school with the following:
 - Fever (Temp 100.0 or greater)- until fever -free without medication for 24 hours
 - Vomiting or Diarrhea until symptom free for 24 hrs
 - New/ Uncontrolled Cough or Sore Throat
 - contact MD

- COVID-19 Is also still circulating. Common symptoms include Sore throat, Congestion or runny nose, Headache, Cough, Fatigue, Fever, Chills, Muscle or body aches, loss of taste or smell, Nausea or vomiting, Diarrhea. If you have any symptoms, test for COVID right away. Obtain a COVID test with any symptoms at Convenient MD or Urgent care locations.
- To order 4 free COVID rapid tests https://www.covid.gov/tests
- What should we do if we test positive for COVID? Isolate and Contact the school nurse.Symptom start date or test positive date is Day Zero, then isolate days 1-5 and wear a well fitting mask days 6-10. Follow the CDC Guidelines for Isolation If someone in the household tests positive, start wearing a well fitting mask for 10 days from exposure.
- Mental Health is as important as physical health. Inform the school nurse, teacher, principal, or trusted staff member about any health or emotional concerns so we can support your child together. 


