

SCHOOL REGISTRATION



A powerful strategy to build vocabulary is to teach students about the meanings of components of the words they're learning directly, like prefixes and suffixes, along with Greek and Latin roots. If they know that the *un* in *unhappy* means "not," they're more likely to understand a word like *undistinguished*. It's also helpful to teach word families: if the word is *celebrity*, for example, bring in words like *celebrate* and *celebration*.
