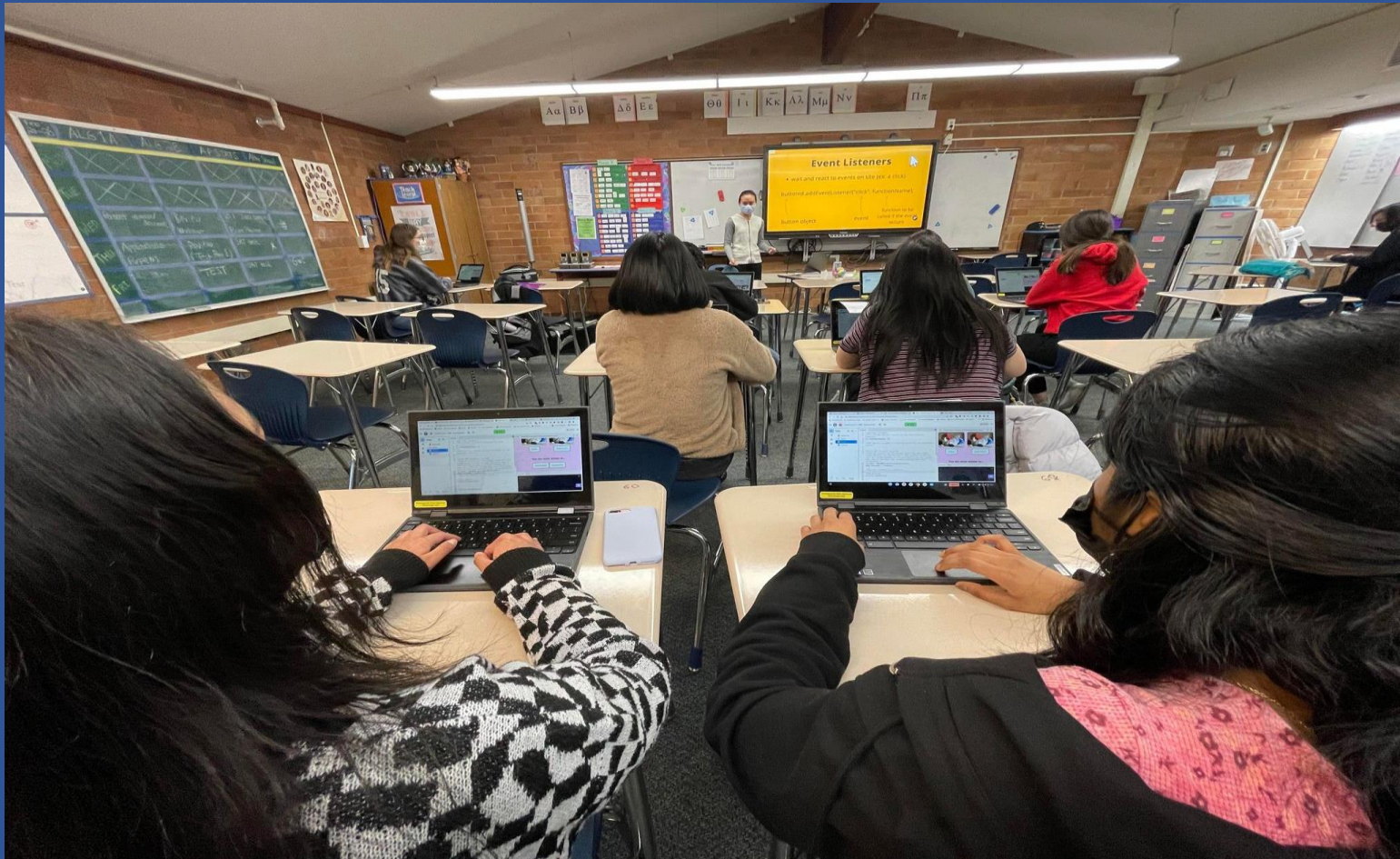

# GRADES COUNT FOR GRADUATION

If you fail a required class you must re-take it.



# CREDITS COUNT FOR GRADUATION

1 trimester class = 0.5 credit

You take 5 classes each trimester

At the end of the year, you can earn  
7.5 credits total

You need to earn 26.0 credits minimum and pass  
all required classes in order to graduate!!!



# BREAK DOWN OF CREDITS NEEDED FOR GRADUATION:

Trimester 1 = 2.5 total credits possible to earn

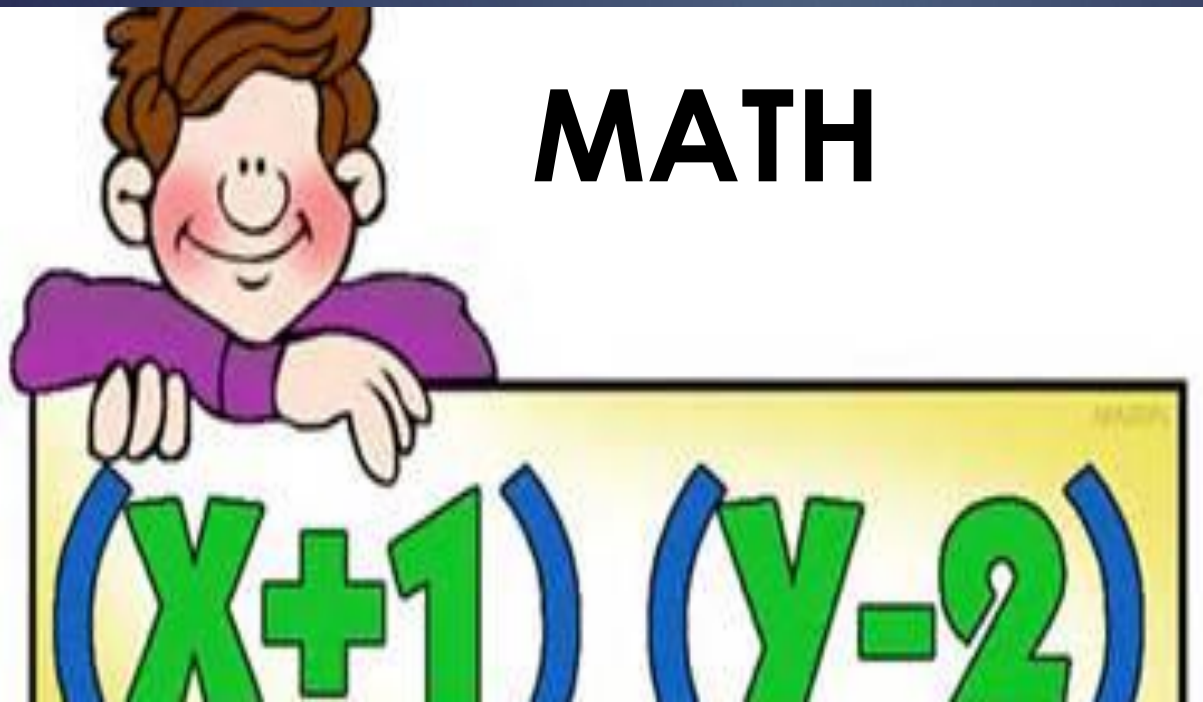
