SEL Counselor Support What Parents Need to Know

- Student mental health continues to be an issue post-COVID
 - Many students are two years behind in maturity and social skills
- It can be difficult to connect students with a mental health care provider
- We can meet with students who are in crisis
- Our Social Worker, Susan Tiffany, can meet with students until connected with an outside provider

Paving the Way for Success What Parents/Guardians Can Do

- Set appropriate expectations for grades

 - 3. If issue is not resolved, contact their Counselor
 - 4. Lastly, contact the Vice Principal of Academics, Dr. Kuzmanich

Things to Remember

- If students have received an "F" or "I" on their transcript, credit for that class was not earned. This credit may need to be retrieved.
- "D" is a pass, but some colleges look for "C's" and higher (example: California public colleges)
- Students should start to consider challenging themselves in the classroom - increase academic rigor if possible
- Junior year grades matter maintain a strong GPA (including academically rigorous classes)

For Prospective Athletes

- Know your <u>eligibility</u> (DI, DII, or DIII)
- Create your free profile page account in the NCAA portal
- Meet the core academic requirements
 - 16 core courses total
- Review sliding scale for GPA and test scores
- Request Kennedy Catholic to send your transcript to the NCAA at the end of junior year
- Outside of the NCAA Eligibility Center, start completing prospective athlete forms on college websites (Example: <u>University of Oregon</u>)

What Can You Do Now

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College & Career Planning: Academics

- Academic rigor
- Maintain your GPA
- Recognize how you learn best
- Take classes for intended major / career
- Find out college / career entrance requirements (start with Naviance)
- Use Naviance to explore personality traits, career options, and learning habits (Login info to be sent in the coming weeks)

College Planning: Standardize Tests

- Utilize PSAT score report to look for areas of strength / deficent
- Use test prep resources for SAT/ACT
 - SAT: <u>Khan Academy</u> and <u>Albert.io</u>
 - ACT: <u>ACT.org</u>
- Keep an eye out for schools that are test optional/test blind (all Washington schools are test optional, and UC schools are test blind)
 - For a list, check out <u>fairtest.org</u>
- Qualify for scholarships and included for National Merit Scholarship Consideration
- Receive free information from interested colleges & scholarship programs

College & Career Planning: Personal

- Get involved in the community (school, local, church, etc.) oJoin clubs, sports teams, volunteer opportunities, etc.
- Sustained involvement opportunities for more responsibility and/or leadership
- Attend college visits and college fairs OPNACAC Spring College Fair – April 27 at Seattle University
- Use Naviance to explore personality traits, career options, and learning habits (Login info to be sent in the coming weeks)
- Start keeping track of your awards, involvement, experiences (Use Naviance Resume tool to document)

Summer Opportunities

- Volunteer (beyond the ISLE hours)
- Internships
- Pre-college programs at colleges and universities
 <u>TeenLife Summer Programs</u>
- Summer courses
 - Catholic Virtual (More information will be available in the spring)
