



Baldy View ROP receives California Department of Education CTE Incentive Grant

Baldy View ROP was among 265 grantees representing 669 local educational agencies to be awarded \$396 million in Year One career technical education (CTE) grants through the California Department of Education (CDE) CTE Incentive Grant. Baldy View ROP applied for the grant as a consortium comprised of its partnering districts: Chaffey Joint Union High School District, Chino Valley, Claremont, and Upland Unified School Districts. Among the consortia selected for grants, Baldy View ROP received one of the largest awards, \$6.8 million.

The 3-year, \$900M CTE Incentive Grant is intended to encourage school districts to support the development of relevant and emergent CTE pathways designed to meet industry needs. Successful grant awardees submitted proposals ensuring effectiveness through 10 high quality criteria indicators including curriculum and instruction aligned with California CTE standards; a cohesive sequence of CTE courses that help students transition to college or work upon high school graduation; qualified teachers and faculty, and data collection that allows for program evaluation.

Baldy View ROP will use the grant funding primarily for career pathway development in the medical, informatics, and logistics fields, each of which are industries that offer high-wage and in-demand employment opportunities in the Inland Empire region.






