LADY CAVS ARE DISTRICT RUNNERS-UP; REGION TOURNAMENT BEGINS FRIDAY

If you had forecasted prior to the District 13-AAA Tournament championship game that Dyersburg wouldn't make a single three-pointer and All-District sharpshooter Chelby Jordan wouldn't make a single field goal, you'd probably had also guessed that it would be Crockett County hoisting the trophy at the contest's conclusion.

Well, that's exactly what transpired - except for the Lady Cavs lifting the trophy part.

Dyersburg's Lady Trojans, again playing without District Most Valuable Player Joya Crawford, managed to capture the championship crown despite a frigid display from beyond the arc and with Jordan having to be content with only free throws. Somehow they managed to eke out a 46-35 victory, primarily because Crockett experienced similar shooting woes and had trouble handling the Dyersburg press for much of the night.

Therefore, the Lady Trojans carry the top seed from District 13 into the Region 7-AAA Tournament, which begins across four sites – including Alamo – Friday night at 7:00. Dyersburg will host Bolton, Crockett will entertain Haywood, Obion County travels to Bolivar, and South Gibson heads to Fayette-Ware. In those 14-AAA games Tuesday night, Fayette-Ware (11-9) claimed the district title with a 68-66 win over Bolivar (12-15), and Haywood (12-13) earned the third seed by clobbering Bolton (3-17) 66-11.

The two teams that make it to the Region 7-AAA championship game will move on to the West Sectionals against squads from 15-AAA, barring any upsets by the Memphis schools in District 16-AAA. Still alive in 15-AAA are Millington (18-8), Covington (12-15), Brighton (12-17), and Munford (11-17).

To survive and advance in the regional, Crockett will have to perform much better than it did against Dyersburg. The Lady Cav offense never got rolling with any consistency at any time in the game, never scoring more than 10 points in a quarter and with no individual player netting more than four points in a period.

The attack wasn't helped at all when Crockett's leading scorer Hannah Johnson was whistled for her second foul with 2:01 remaining in the opening quarter. The score was tied at 8-all at the time, but Johnson headed for the bench as Coach Kayla Irvin does not like to keep any player in the game with two fouls before the halftime break.

Just minutes later, Dyersburg had opened the gap to 17-8 with a 9-0 run, fueled by Netala Dixon, who tallied 10 of her squad's first 12 points and had 14 in the first half as the Lady Trojans built a 27-15 advantage.

Crockett won Quarter #3 10-6, but still wasn't scoring enough to pose a serious threat to Dyersburg. The Lady Cavs never got closer than eight points over the third and fourth quarters.

Charity Greenhill, who made three triples, led the Lady Cav scoring with 10. Johnson had eight - all in the second half - and Sarah Cherry contributed six.

For the Lady Trojans, Kalli Maclin supported Dixon's 20 by adding 13, including five in the second period when Dyersburg did most of its pulling away from Crockett. Jordan had six points, all on free throws.

Johnson, Cherry, and Greenhill were selected to the All-Tournament Team from Crockett, joining Maclin, Dixon, Aeria Quinn, and MVP Jordan from Dyersburg; Alayna Fussell and AB Correa from Obion; Hallie Allen from South Gibson; and Sanaya Starks from Dyer County.

The regular season All-District Team was also announced, featuring Johnson, Cherry, and Amaria Walker from Crockett; Zya Currie from Dyer; Jordan, Kayleigh Strayhorn, and MVP Joya Crawford from Dyersburg; Fussell from Obion; and Allen, Jade Reed, and Karson Dunn from South Gibson.

Three Lady Cav seniors - Cherry, Johnson, and Jayden Maddox - earned Academic All-District honors by maintaining at least a 3.1 GPA for their scholastic careers.

The District 13-AAA Tournament boys' action concludes Tuesday night in Alamo with Obion facing South Gibson for third place at 6:00 and Dyersburg tangling with Dyer County for the championship at 7:30.


