<b>Goal 3</b>	<b>Behavioral Supports</b>  By June of 2026, Jefferson Township K-12 students will have a 50% decrease in behavioral referrals and suspensions.
<b>Strategy</b>	Jefferson Township will partner with families to promote a positive culture and climate.
<b>Adult Implementation Indicator</b>	100% of staff will be monitored for the use of district-wide PBIS Systems through TFIs, Walkthrough data, and OTES evaluations, as applicable, every quarter.
<b>Student Performance Measure</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Students will show a decrease of 50.00 % in behavioral referrals and suspensions by the end of the plan.</li> </ul>
<b>Action Steps</b>	<p><i>3.A.1. Jefferson Township staff will receive training and coaching in the implementation of district-wide PBIS best practices including the use of teaching scripts to explicitly model the expectations to students.</i></p> <p><i>3.A.2. Adults will utilize a Positive Behavior acknowledgement system with all students in all locations.</i></p> <p><i>3.A.3. The district will progress monitor disaggregated discipline data through DLT, BLT, and TBT meetings.</i></p> <p><i>3.A.4. Jefferson Township will communicate with families quarterly regarding behavior supports and data.</i></p>
