2260 ADVISORY COMMITTEES

The Board of Education may establish advisory committees for special projects or to address specific problems or issues. Generally, such committees are considered purely advisory and are not public bodies which can transact public business.

In creating an advisory committee, the Board of Education will develop guidelines which define the role of the committee. These guidelines shall include, but not be limited to, the specific charge or tasks assigned to the committee, membership on the committee, payment of committee expenses, and procedures for dissolution of the committee. Advisory committees shall report all suggestions and recommendations to the Board of Education and Superintendent of Schools. Final reports shall be made to the Board of Education at a meeting scheduled by the Board of Education.

The Board of Education has the right to accept, reject, or modify all or any part of a committee recommendation and is in no way obligated to follow an advisory committee's recommendation.
