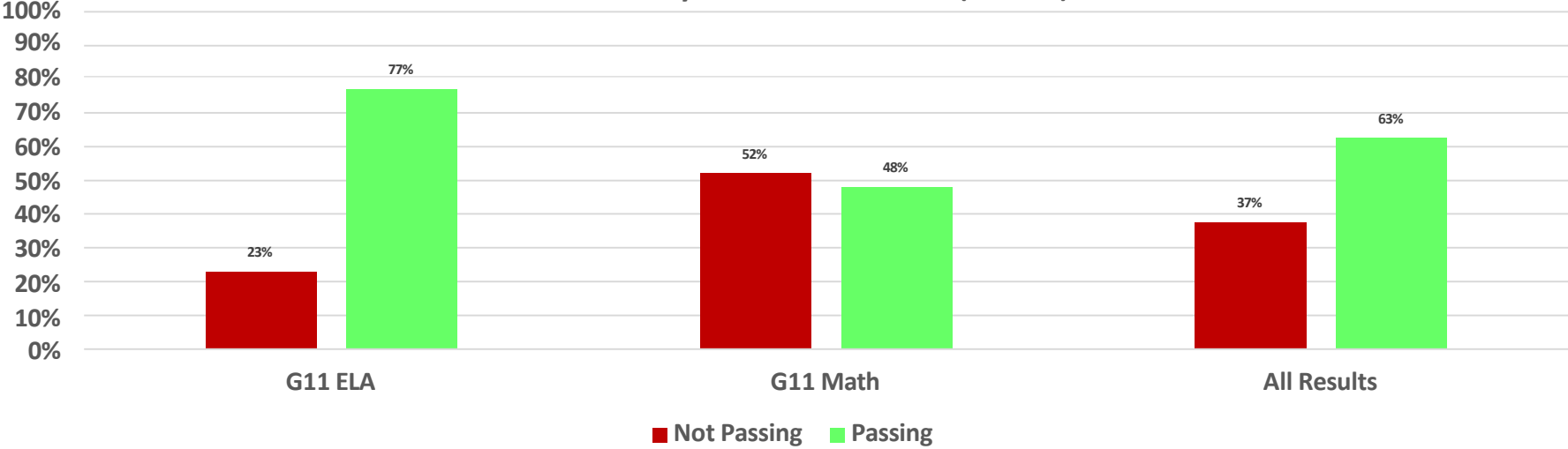

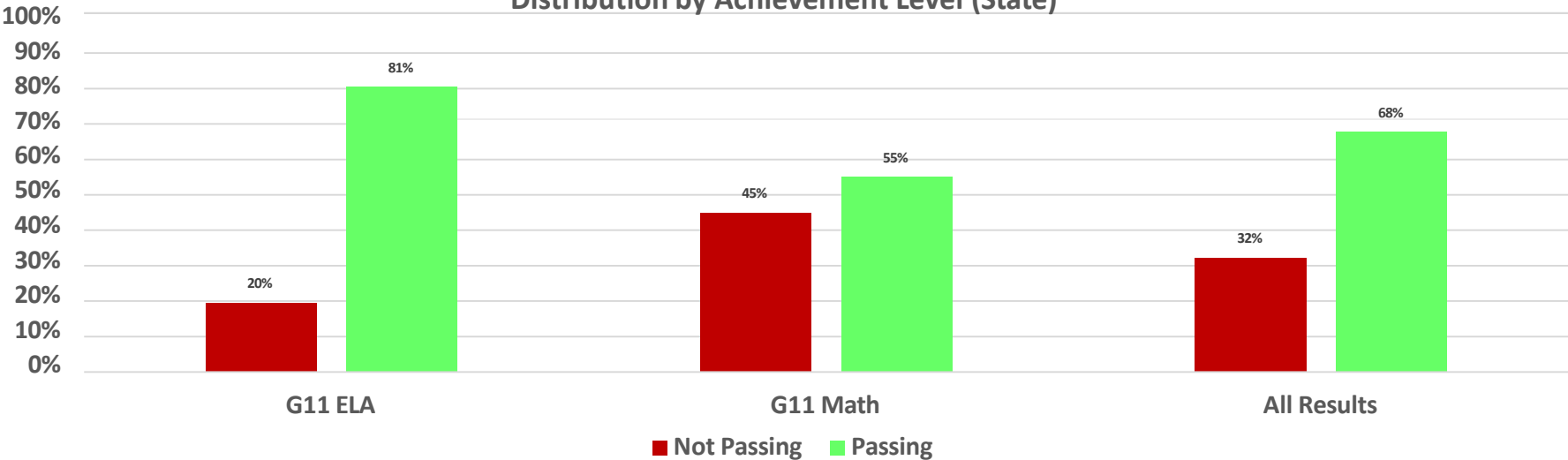

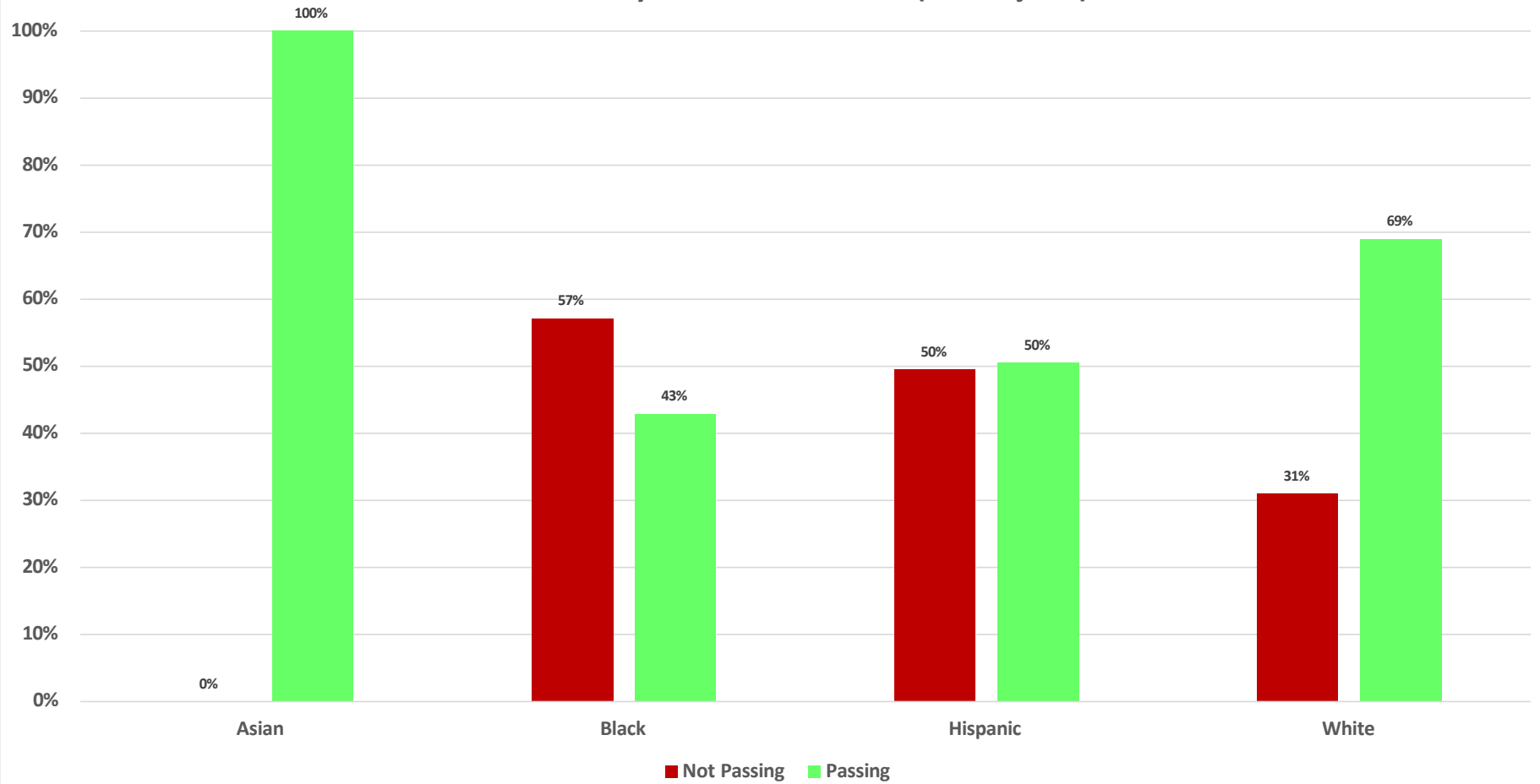

### Distribution by Achievement Level (All Subjects)



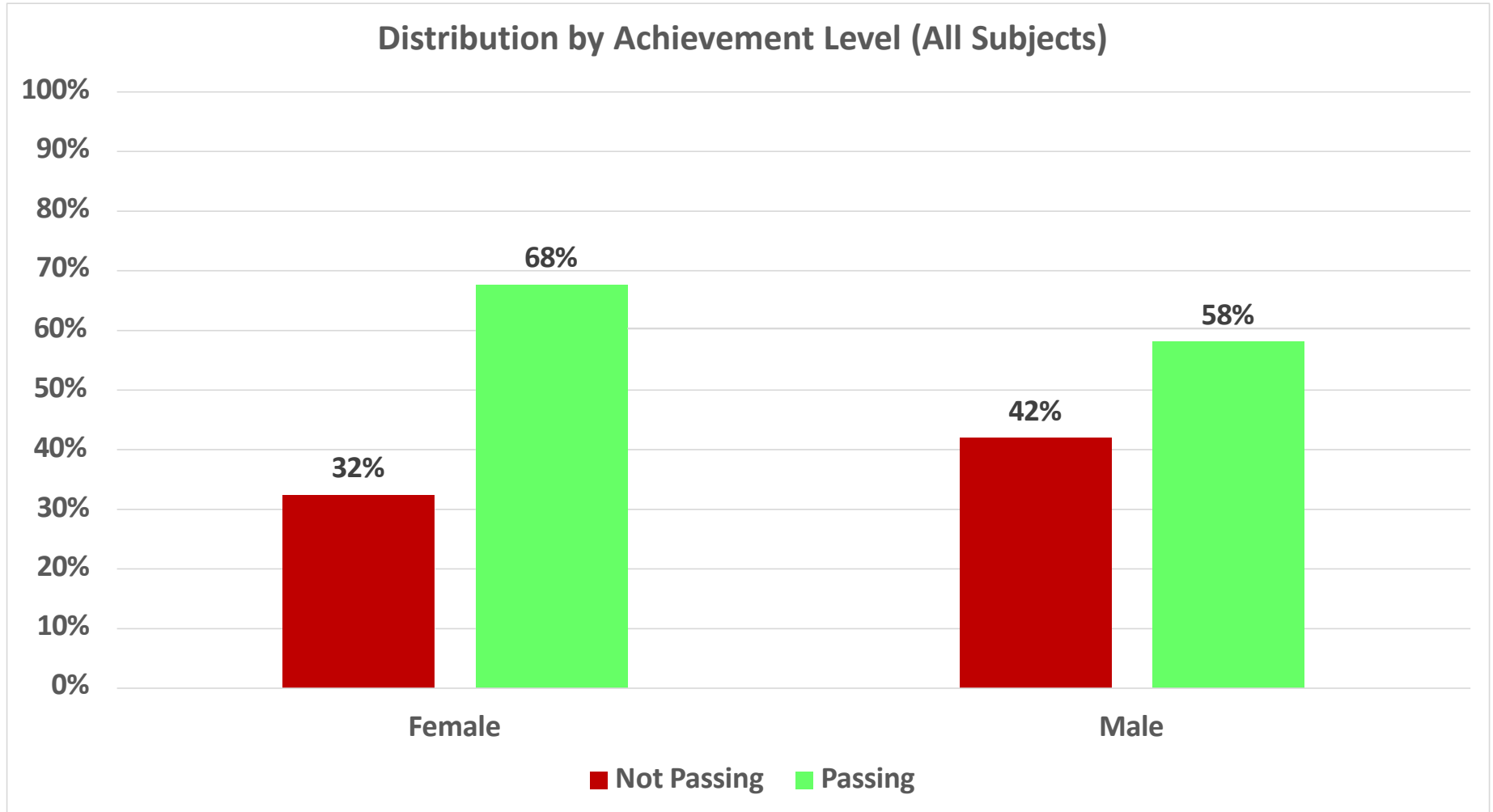

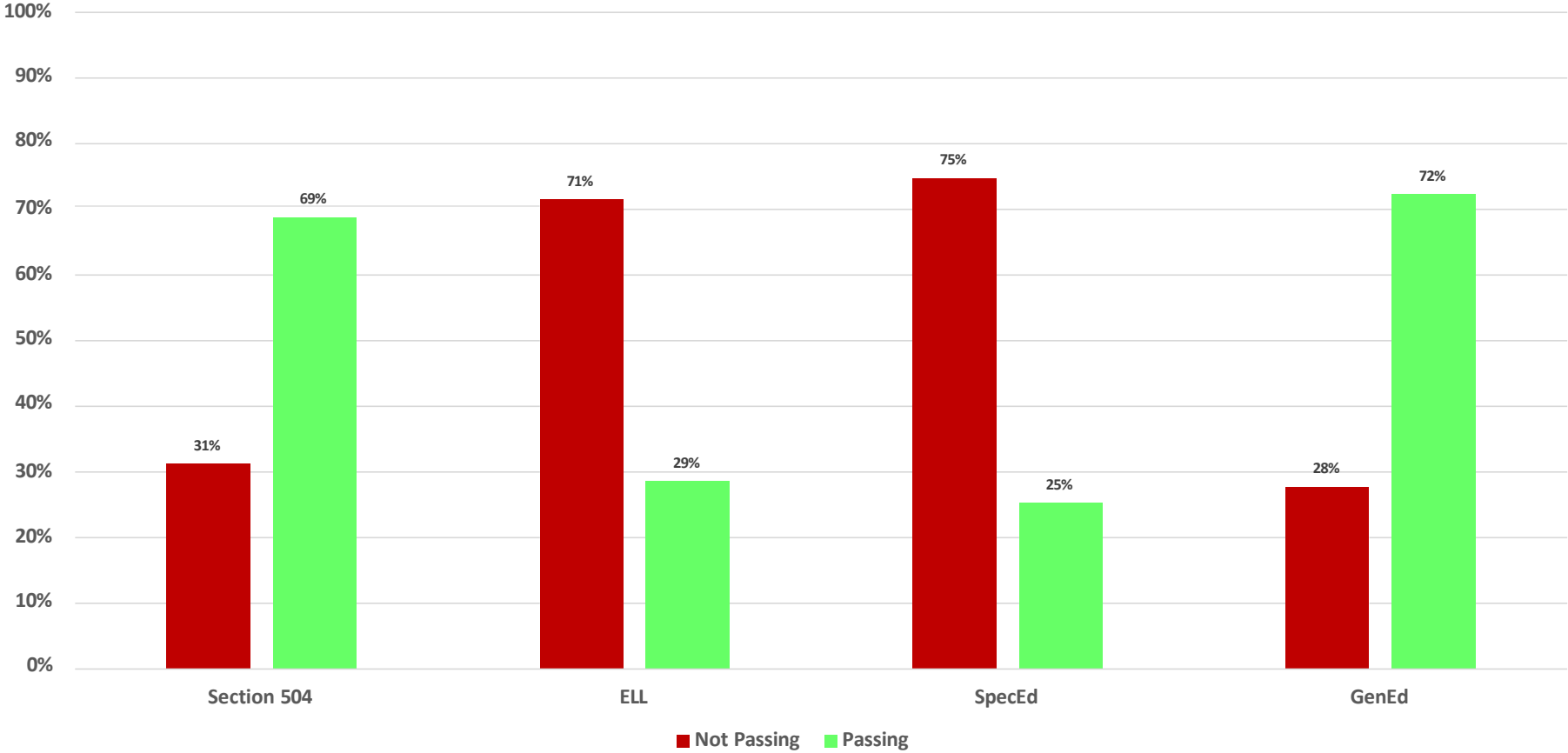

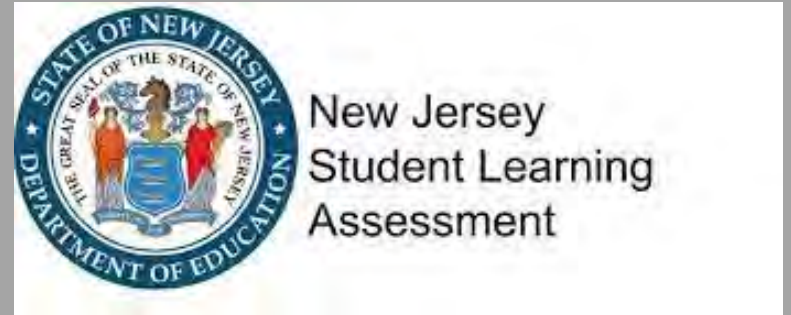
## 2022-23 NJGPA by Subgroup Program

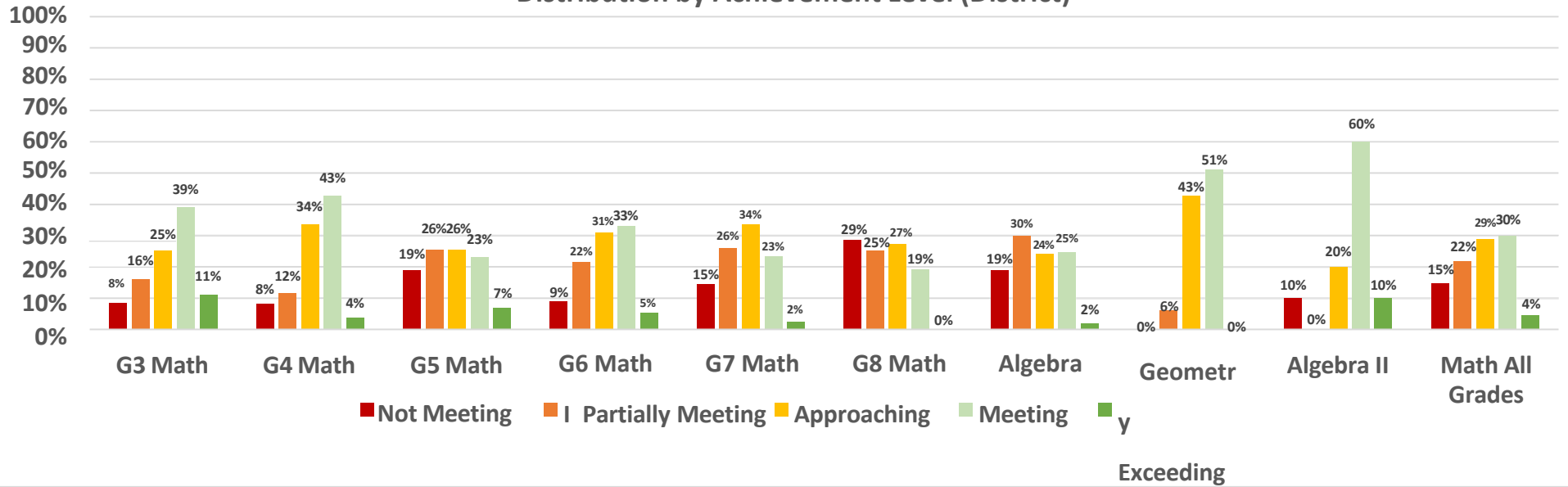

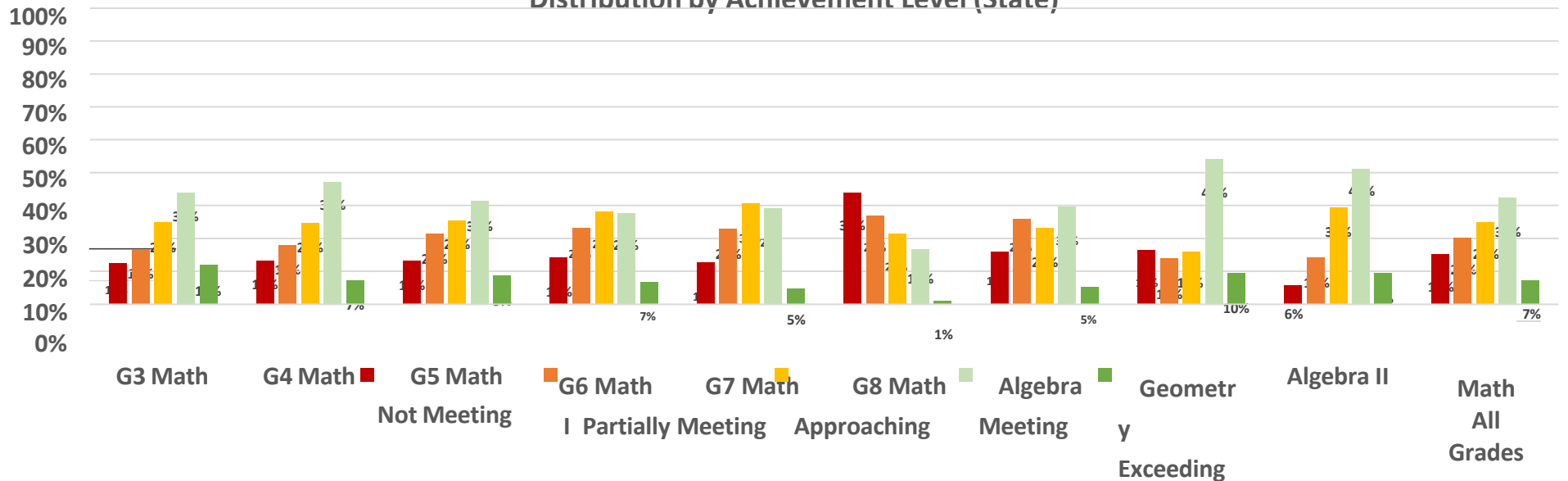


# BARNEGAT TOWNSHIP 2022-23 Spring NJSLA Mathematics

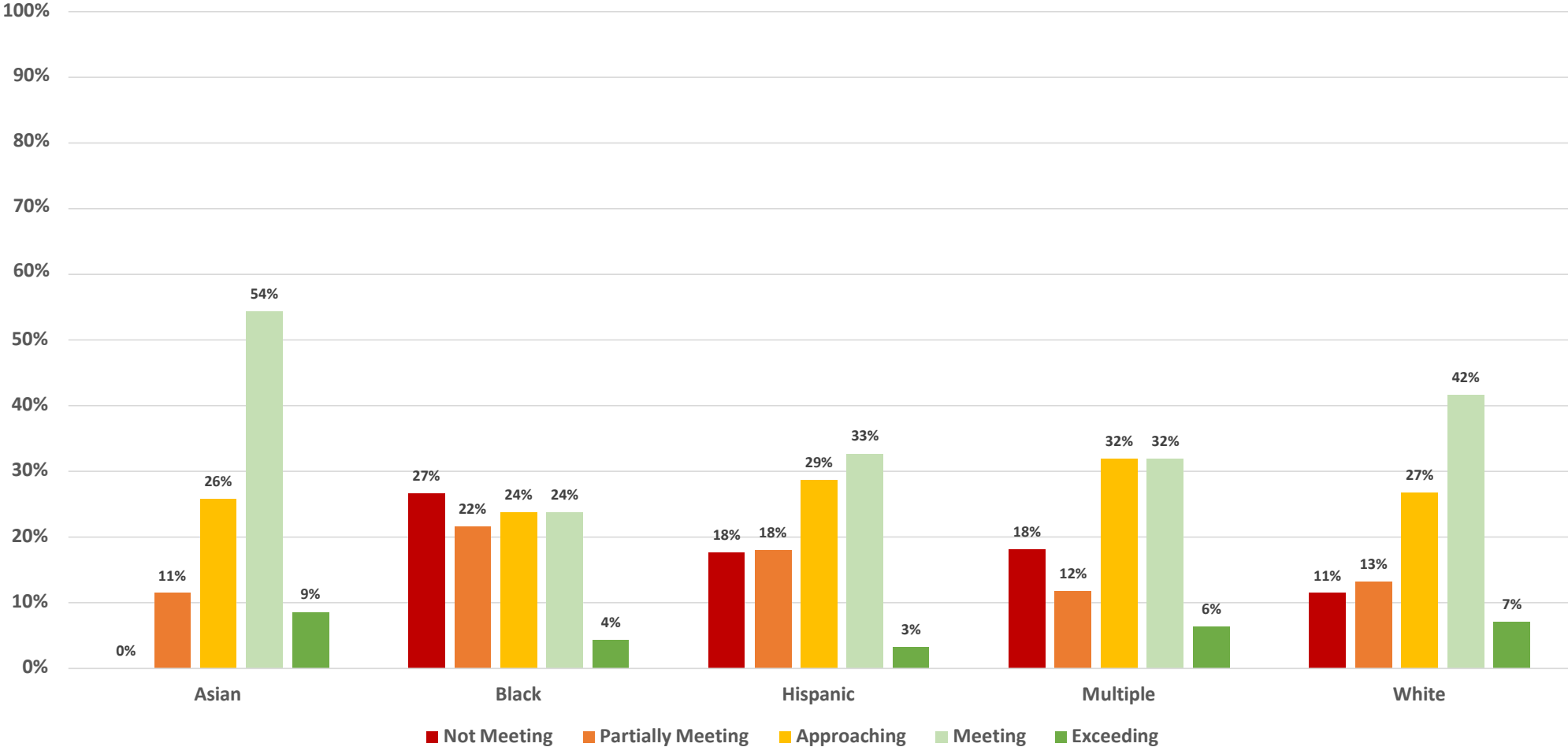

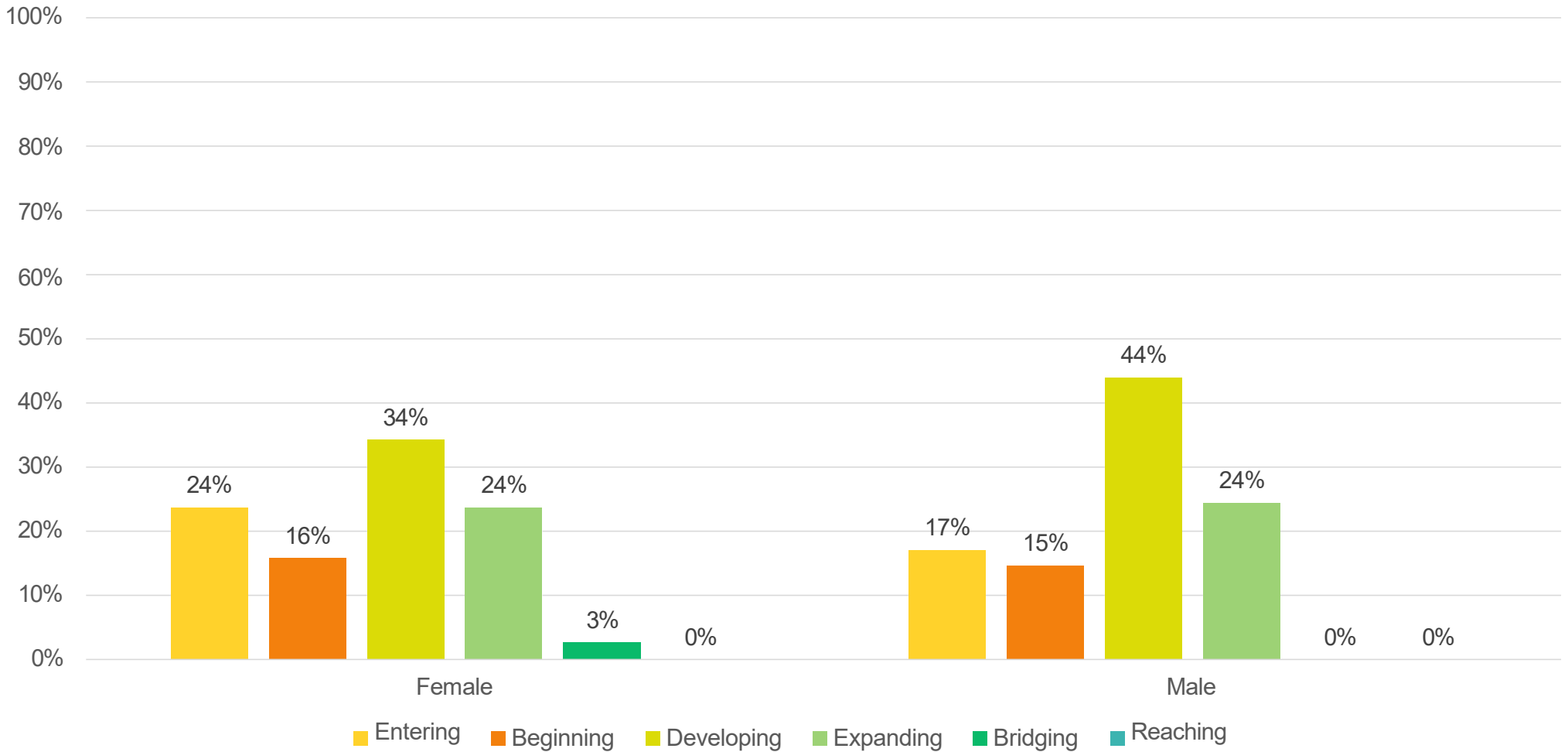
