

## CFISD Principles of Human Services

Course Description:

### Scope and Sequence

Principles of Human Services is a year-long course that is offered to 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grade students to explore careers related to people’s personal and family needs. Information and skill development will focus on early childhood development, services for families & community, personal care, nutrition and wellness, apparel construction and interior design. Development of personal characteristics for success in all careers along with hands-on experiences in the cooking and sewing labs will also be included. Students begin exploring the public services endorsement and are introduced to the following CFISD courses: Lifetime Nutrition & Wellness, Interpersonal Studies, Education & Training, Child Development, Child Guidance and Intro to Cosmetology. (1 High School credit)

- Offered in middle school only
