SOUTH GIBSON DENIES SECTIONAL BERTH FOR CROCKETT COUNTY

On a night when neither team came close to playing its best basketball, South Gibson's Lady Hornets made their last meaningful possession pay off better than Crockett County did.

With the score tied 29-29 with 2:13 to play in Monday night's Region 7-AAA Tournament semifinal, SGC's Karson Dunn curled around a solid screen set by Hallie Allen on defender Charity Greenhill, freeing her up at the left wing of the three-point arc. Sarah Cherry, who was guarding Allen, couldn't afford to leave her, because Allen is the usual go-to Lady Hornet when they need to make a play.

Dunn, finding herself open, let fly a three that hit nothing but the bottom of the net. It was the only field goal South Gibson made in the entire fourth quarter, but somehow it held up over the final two minutes as the Lady Hornets escaped with a 33-31 triumph, denying Crockett a Sectional berth and ending the Lady Cavaliers' season with a 21-9 record.

Crockett's final chance came when senior Hannah Johnson – the team's leading scorer and a valiant warrior over the course of many close Lady Cav games – couldn't connect on a pair of free throws with 5.3 seconds remaining on the clock. "My heart just hurts to see my girls hurt," said Crockett Coach Kayla Irvin afterward. "I am truly so proud of these kids. I hate that it ended in such a heartbreaking way, but they are excellent young women, and I feel so privileged to know and love them. They are never defined by a single game, and I know our county and school are so proud of how they have represented us this year."

Prior to the drama of the final minutes, neither team would have pointed to this performance as one of their finest moments. Both squads came out of the gate tighter than a velcroed knot, throwing the ball away numerous times and leaving short almost every shot taken. Midway through the opening period, the score was 4-3.

By the end of the quarter it was 10-10, but after a Johnson bucket tied it again at 16all with 1:42 left before the half, Crockett didn't score again until 4:41 remained in the third stanza and South Gibson had opened up a nine-point advantage.

A quarter-ending basket by Cherry sent Crockett into the final period trailing 29-24, but neither team scored in the next three minutes. Then Lady Cav freshman Jordyn Maddox drilled a three, and Johnson followed with a steal and breakaway layup to tie things up at 29-all with 4:40 showing on the clock.

The teams went another two minutes without scoring until Allen set the screen that freed Dunn for her decisive shot. The triple sent South Gibson (now 19-14) into the championship game against topseeded Dyersburg (25-4), which walloped Obion County 63-41.

Crockett's major problem after Dunn's shot was that it had only been called for one fourth-quarter foulup to that point, so after Johnson scored to cut it to 32-31, the Lady Cavs had to foul four times before South Gibson would go to the line. Accomplishing that feat took almost an additional minute off the clock. Crockett, which had 12 players score points in its opening round win over Haywood, saw only four players make it into the scoring column in this one. Johnson led the way with 10, followed by Cherry with nine and Maddox and Charity Greenhill with six apiece. Allen and Dunn each netted 11 for South Gibson.

The championship final will be held Wednesday night at 7:00 in Alamo.
